

# Survey of Iraqi Public Opinion

International Republican Institute November 1 – 11, 2005

### Methodology in Brief

- Face-to-face interviews conducted November 1 11, 2005
- All field work was conducted by an Iraqi polling firm employing more than 150 trained interviewers across the country
- Interviews occurred in 17 of 18 governorates. For security reasons, Al Anbar/Ramadi was not included in this survey
- A total sample of 2,725 valid interviews were obtained from a total sample of 3,000 rendering a response rate of 91 percent
- The overall margin of error for this survey is +/- 3 percent


### **Demographics in Brief**

- Representative of 17 of Iraq's 18 provinces—percentage of sample ranging from 4 percent in Karbala to 26 percent in Baghdad
- Ethnic distribution: Arabic (82%), Kurdish (14%), Turkmen (1%), Chaldo-Assyrian (less than 1%), other (less than 1%)
- Urban sample accounts for 67 percent of respondents and rural respondents made up the remaining 33 percent
- Male to female ratio is 47 percent to 53 percent, respectively
- Age distribution: 18-24 (22%), 25-34 (30%), 35-44 (25%), 45-54 (14%), 55 and over (9%)
- Religious Distribution: Sunni Muslim (10%), Shia Muslim (24%), only Muslim (64%), Christian and other sects (2%)




International Republican Institute November 1 – 11, 2005 Do you think that Iraq today is generally heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?






TREND: Thinking about the future, do you feel that things will be better, the same or worse in six months?




TREND: Thinking about the future, do you feel that things will be better, the same or worse in one year?




TREND: Thinking about the future, do you feel that things will be better, the same or worse in five years?




Thinking about the situation of Iraq, what three issues or concerns do you feel most impact your daily life or family?



For each of the following issues, please tell me whether you feel that the situation has gotten better, worse or stayed the same over the last three months:









Which of the following statements best represents your opinion of the Iraqi constitution written by the Iraqi National Assembly?






Which of the following best represents your attitude towards the Iraqi Islamic Party (IIP) and its endorsement of the constitution?




# When did you decide how you would vote in the constitutional referendum?




To the best of your knowledge, what will Iraqis vote for in the election scheduled for December 2005?




In the December elections, Iraqis will vote for representatives for a new national assembly. Do you intend to vote?






## What factor will have the greatest influence on your vote in the December elections?
