




INFORMATION ABOUT THE SURVEY




Would you say the president is steering the country in the right direction?




Do you approve or disapprove of the job the government has done running the country since the 2002 elections?




Has the government done well or done poorly in fulfilling its election promises from 2002?




Would you say the condition of Kenya's economy is good or bad?




What would you say about your personal economic condition over the past five years?




What is the most important issue the Kenyan government should address?


































What is the single most important quality a parliamentary candidate should have?








Would you say that corruption issues have changed since the 2002 elections?






Overall, would you say that Kenyans are free or not free to openly express their political opinions?






















