# Sample and Methodology

- Strategic Public Relations and Research conducted the poll on behalf of the International Republican Institute with funding from the U.S. Agency for International Development.
- The Election Day poll was conducted during official polling hours on December 27, 2007.
- The sample frame was developed from the Electoral Commission of Kenya's 2007 voter register list.
- The sample was drawn proportional to population size with no quotas based on gender.
- 5,503 face-to-face interviews were conducted with eligible voters.
- The margin of error is +/- 1.35 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.

# Sample and Methodology

- The study used a multi-stage sampling design

The first stage divided the target population, along strata delineated along provinces. Kenya is divided into eight provinces. Appropriate samples were allocated to each province depending on the proportion of registered voters in each province.

The second stratum was developed along districts. The provinces are divided into administrative districts. The study sampled 71 districts out of 72 districts across the country.

The third stage involved both random and purposeful sampling to select administrative sub-units of districts known as constituencies. The number of interviews conducted per constituency was proportionate to the number to be done in the province.

# Sample and Methodology

The fourth stage involved random sampling of polling stations to select polling stations to be included in the sample. One to three polling stations were randomly selected from each of the constituencies sampled.

The fifth stage involved systematic sampling of every fifth voter as they exited the polling stations.

- In order to qualify for the survey, the respondent must have had indelible ink on their fingers indicating they had voted.

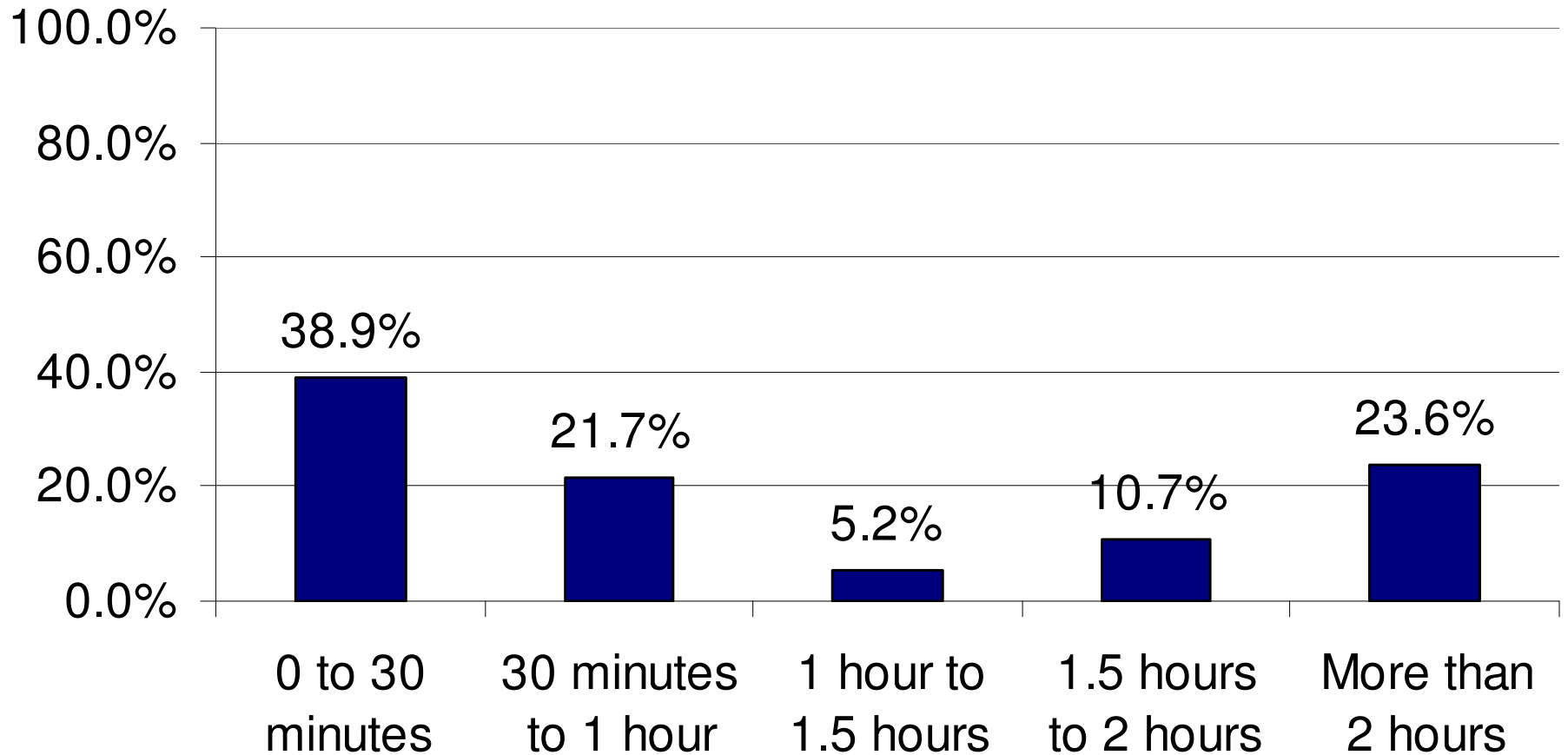

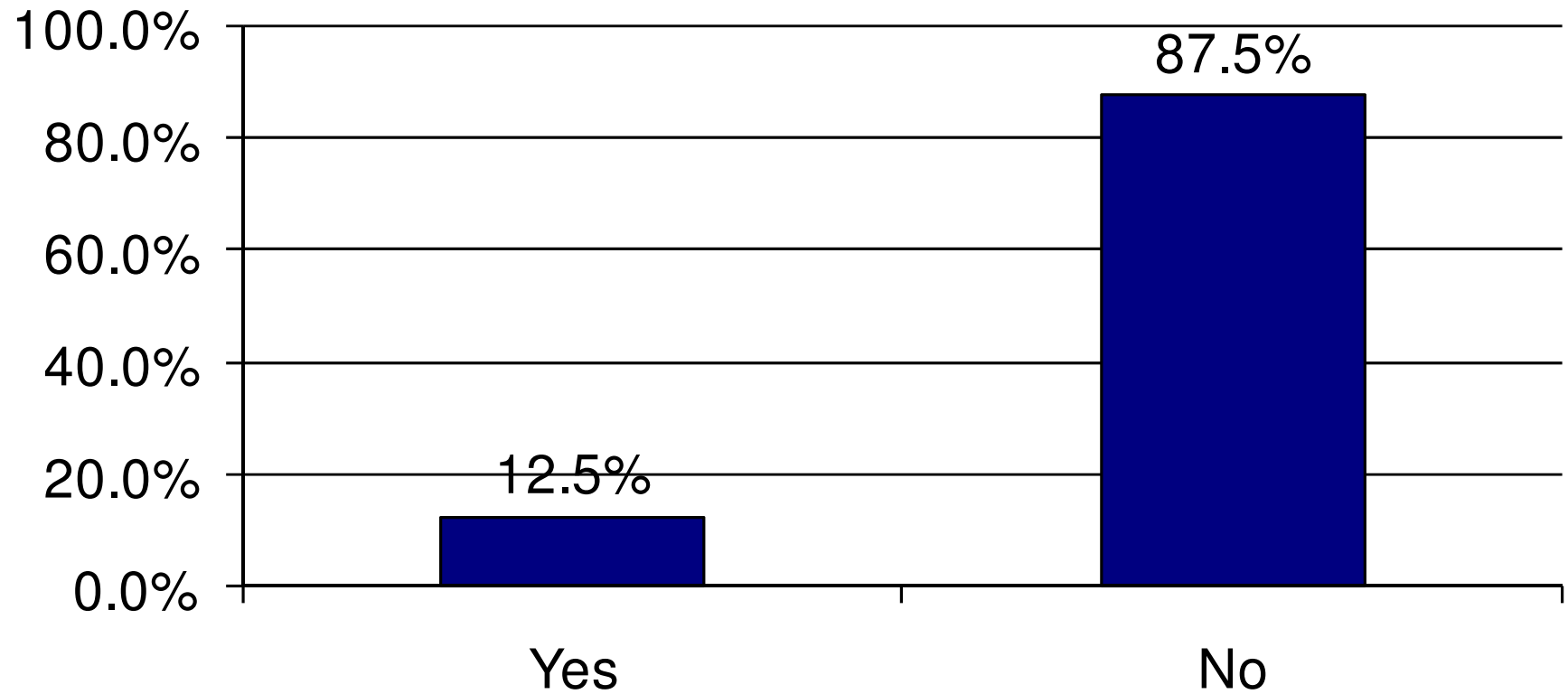
About how long did it take between the time you arrived at the polling station and the time you voted?



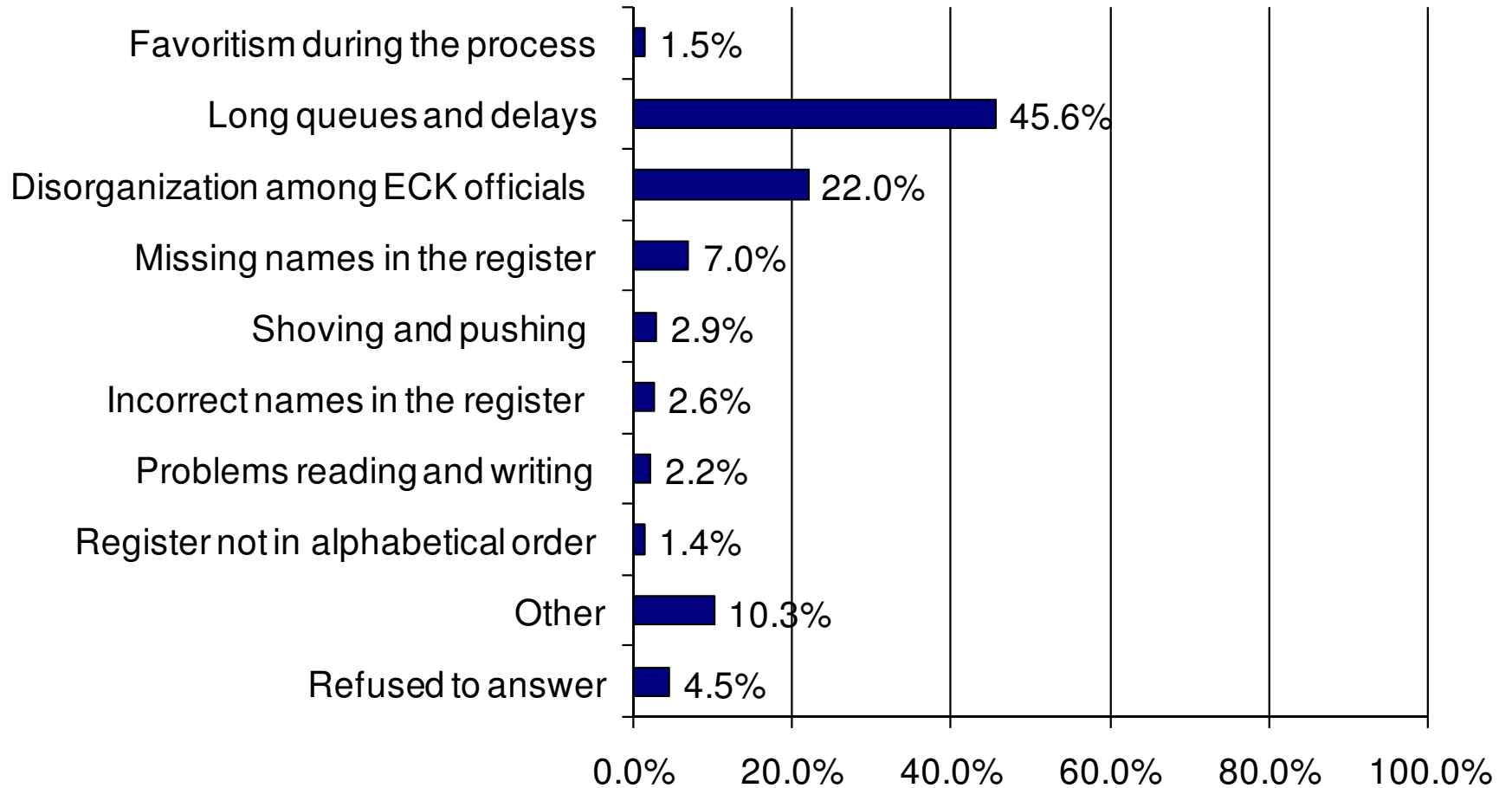
About how long did it take between the time you arrived at the polling station and the time you voted?  
(by province)



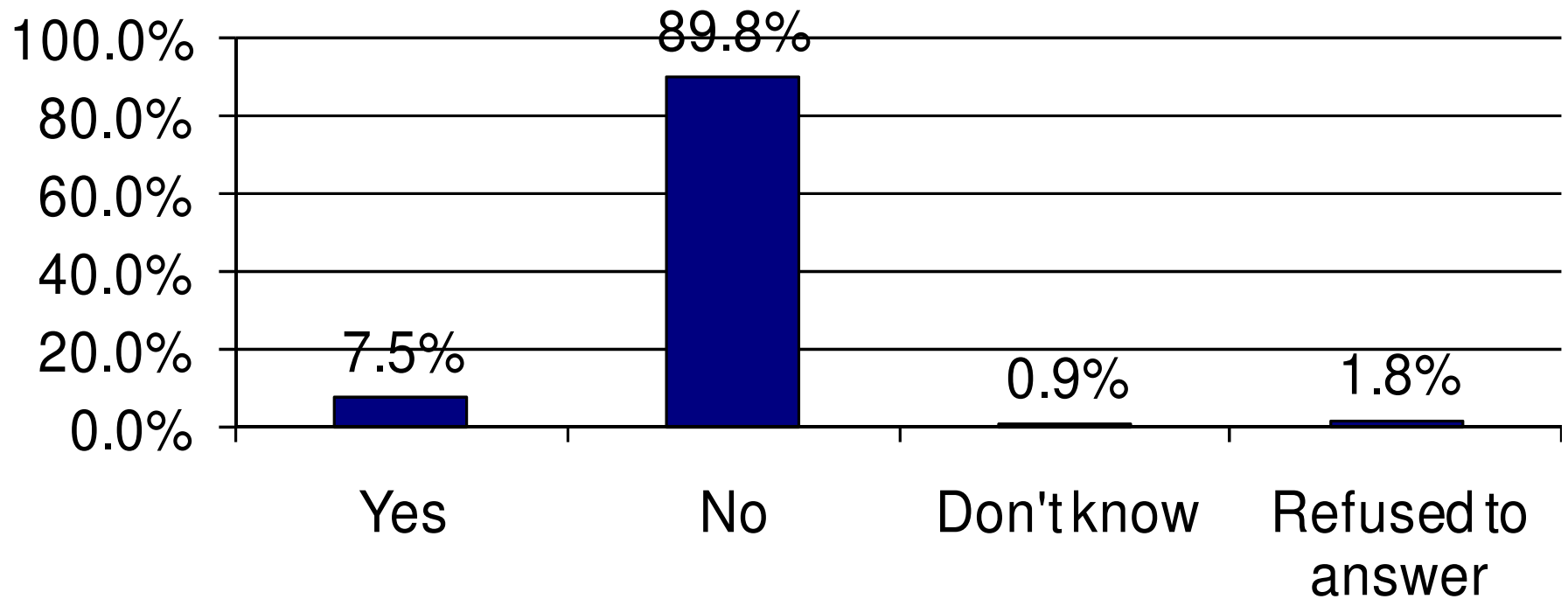
Did you experience any other problems while voting?

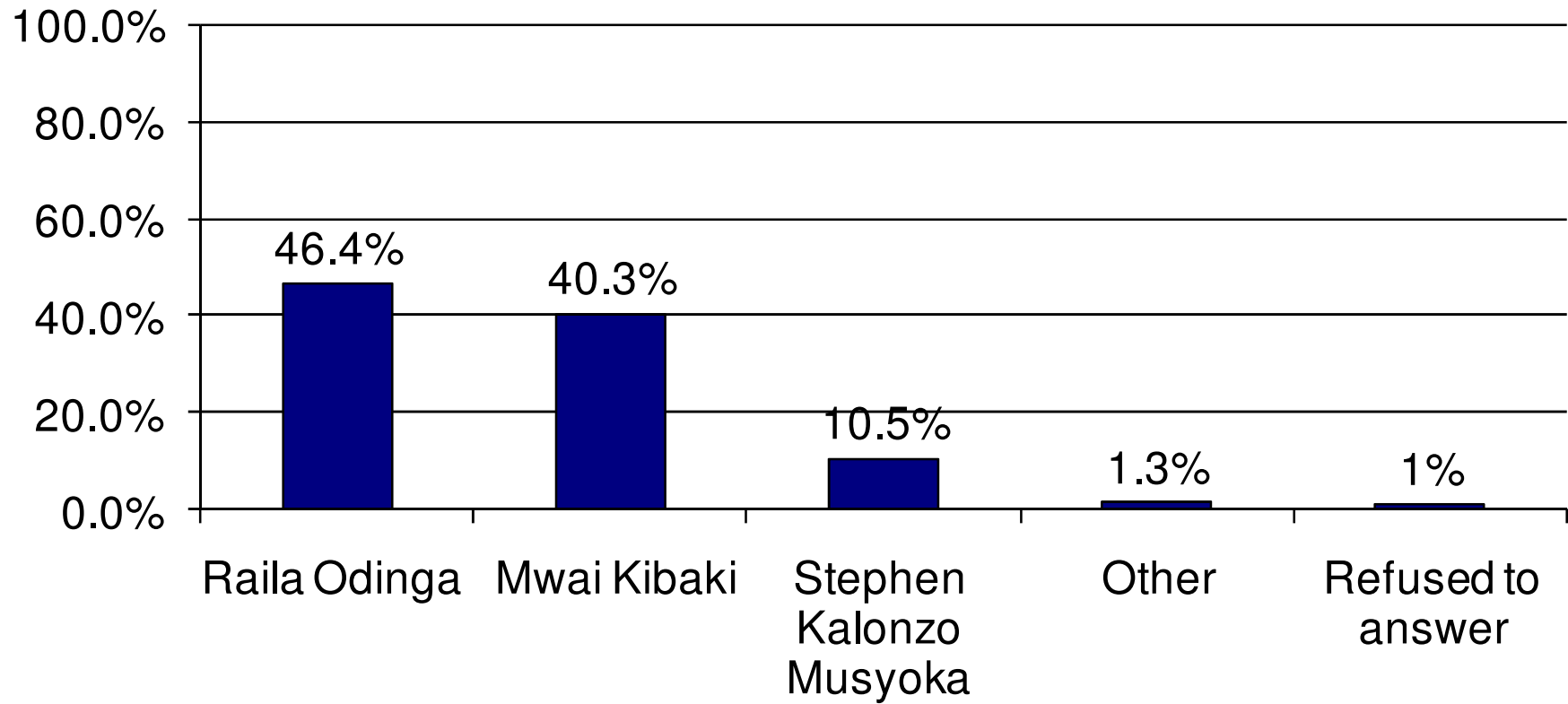


Did anyone give you any money or gifts to vote for a particular candidate in today's election?

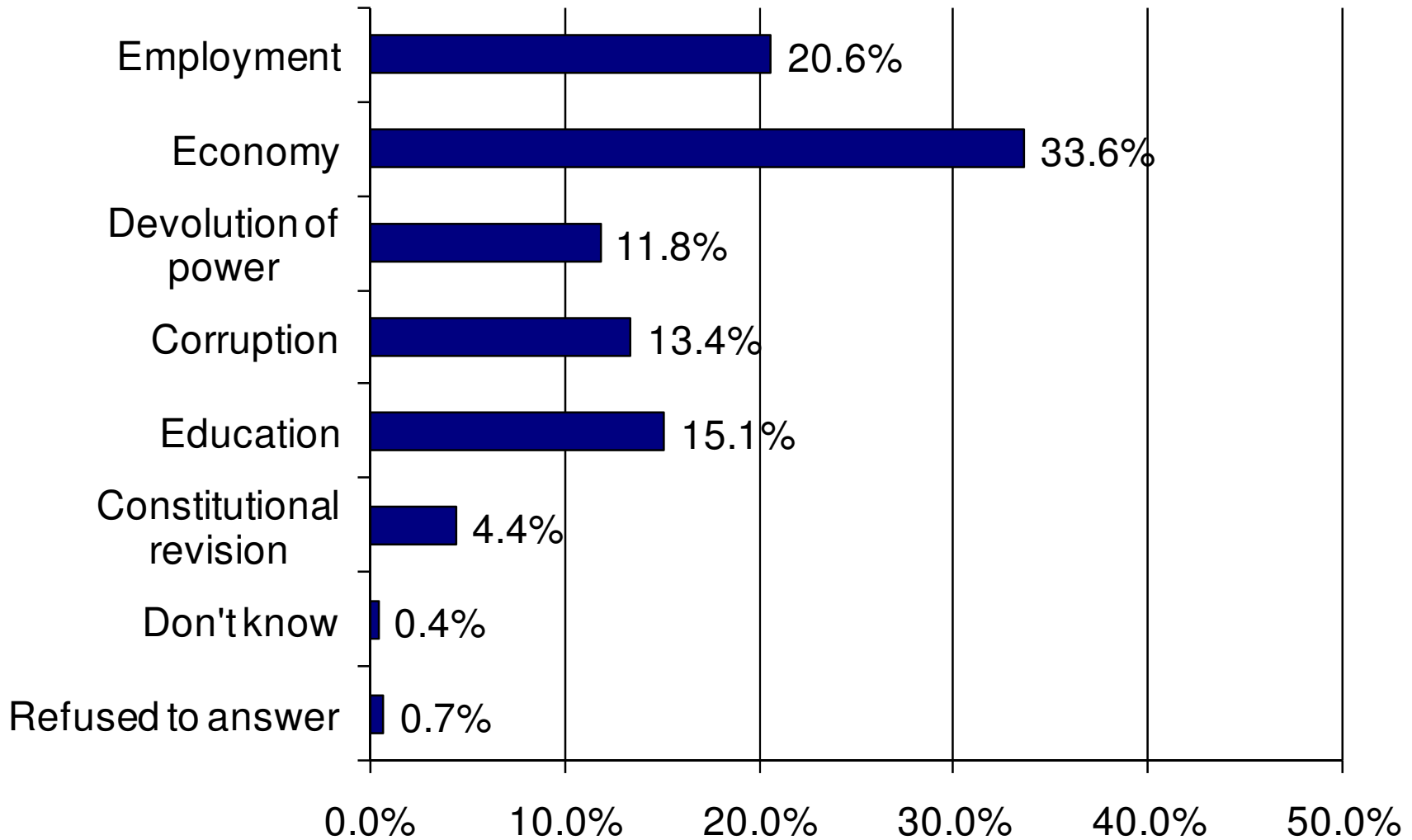

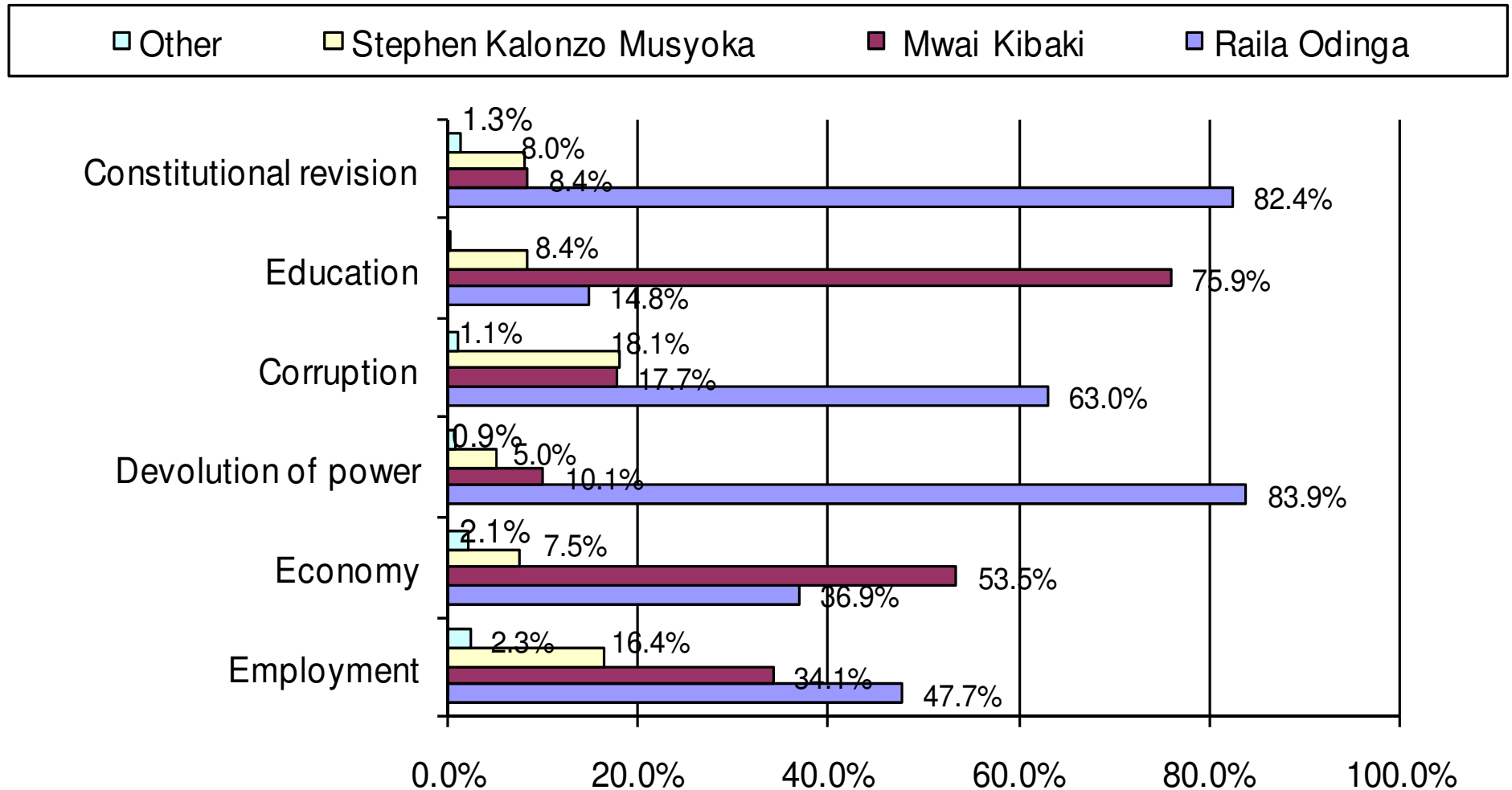

Which one of the following issues mattered most in deciding how you voted for president?



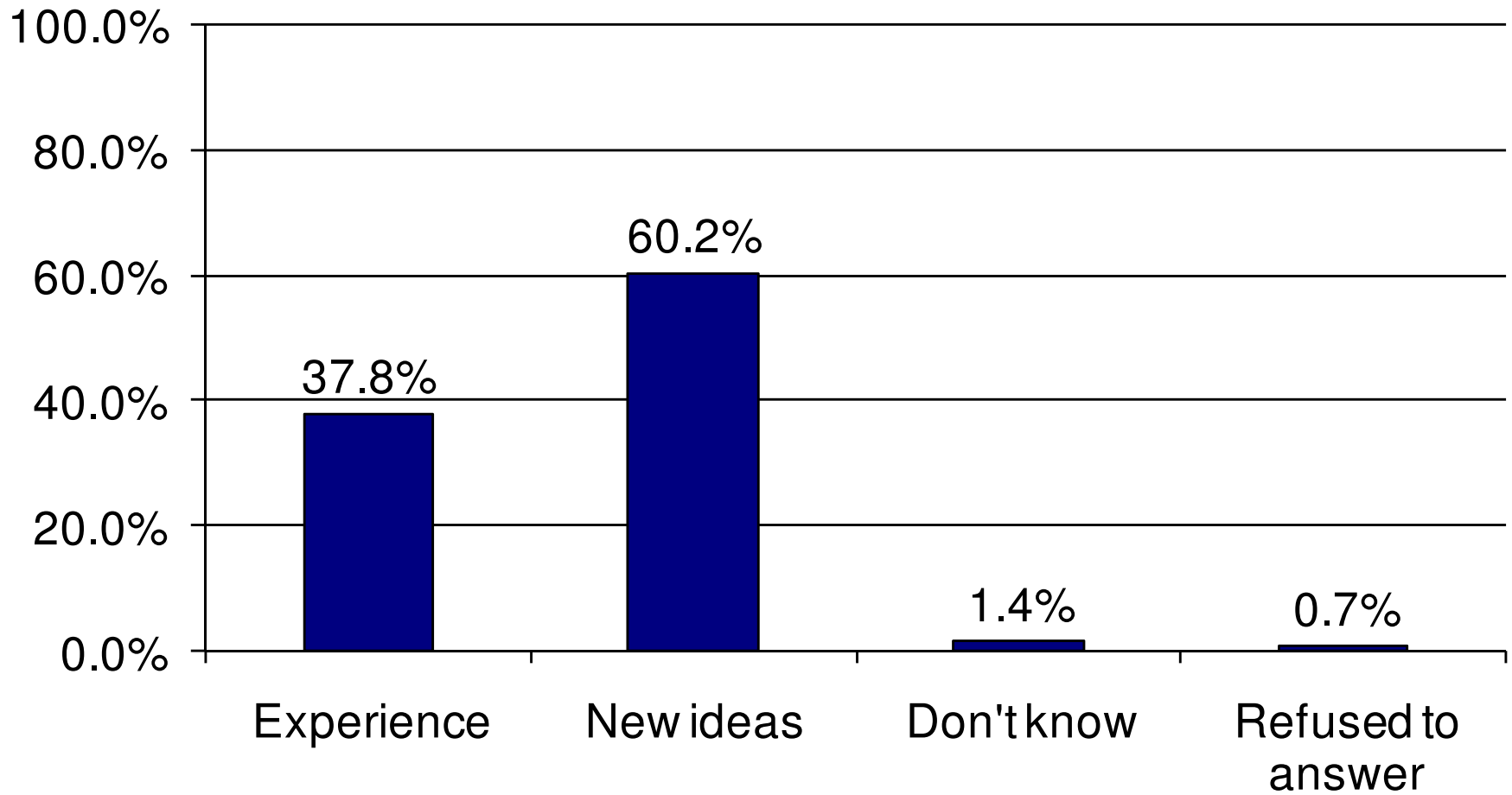
Which one of the following issues mattered most in deciding how you voted for president?

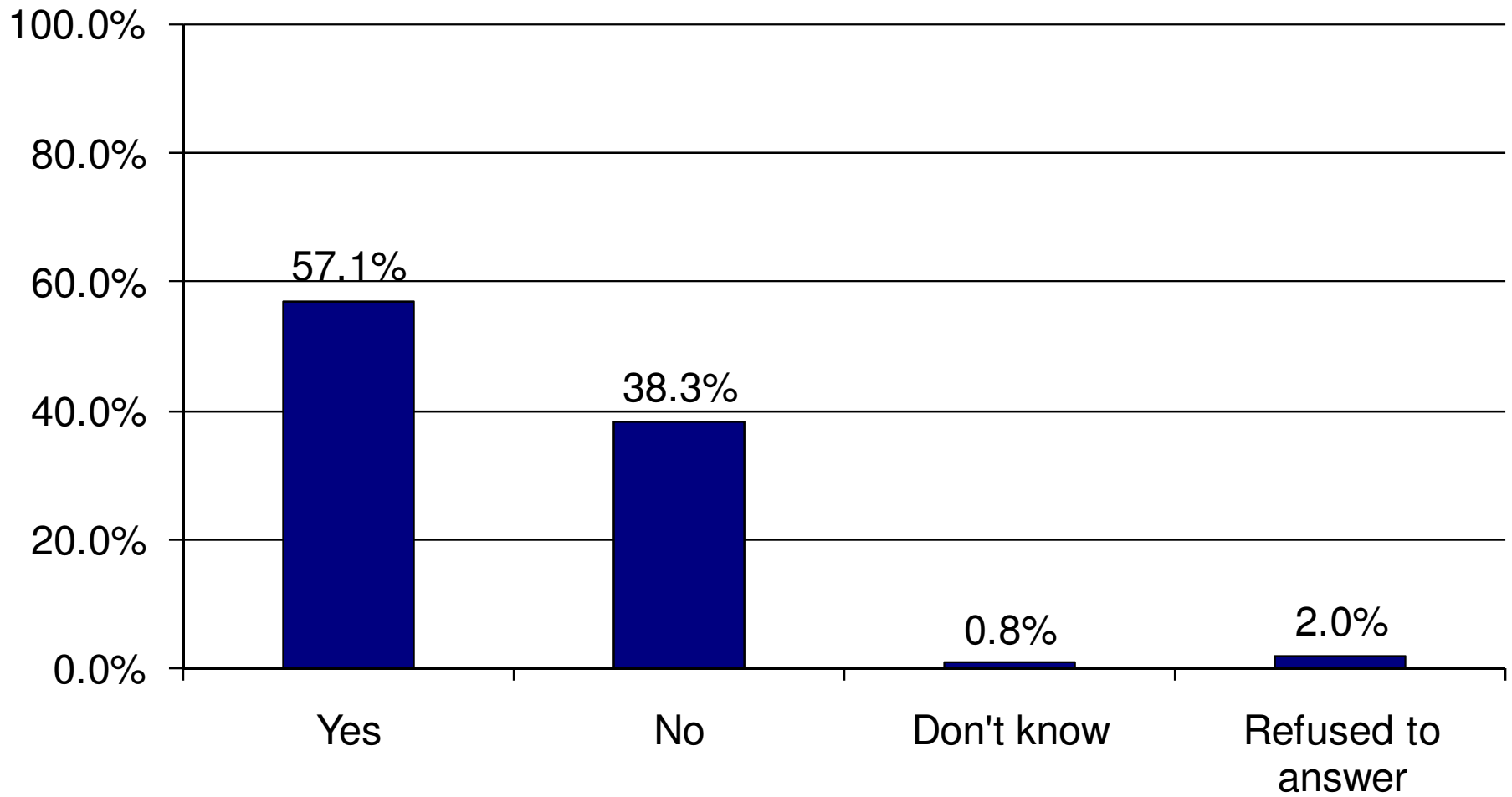

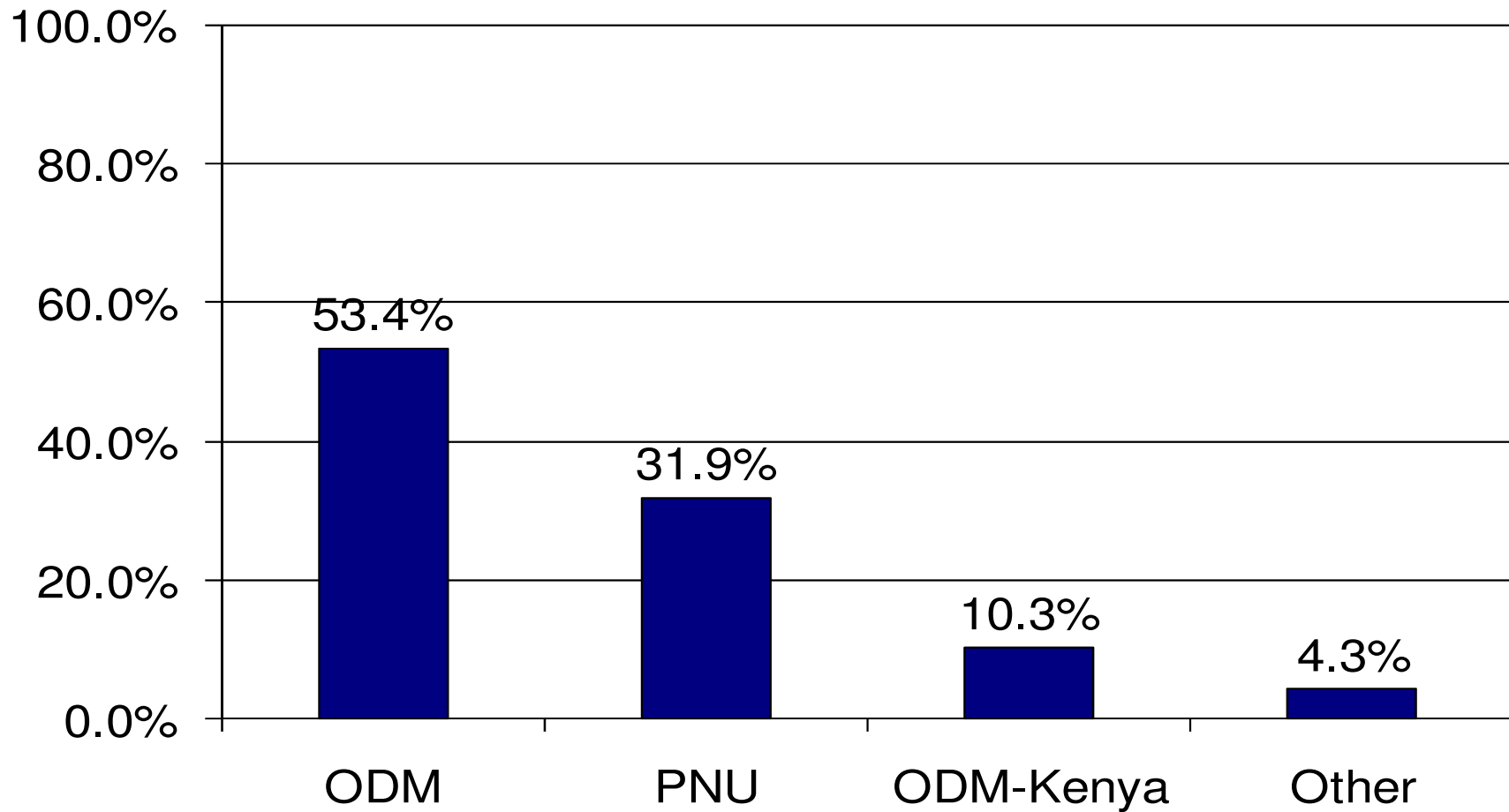
In your opinion, is it more important for candidates running for office to have experience or is it more important for them to have new ideas?



Regardless of how you voted today, do you consider yourself a member of a political party?



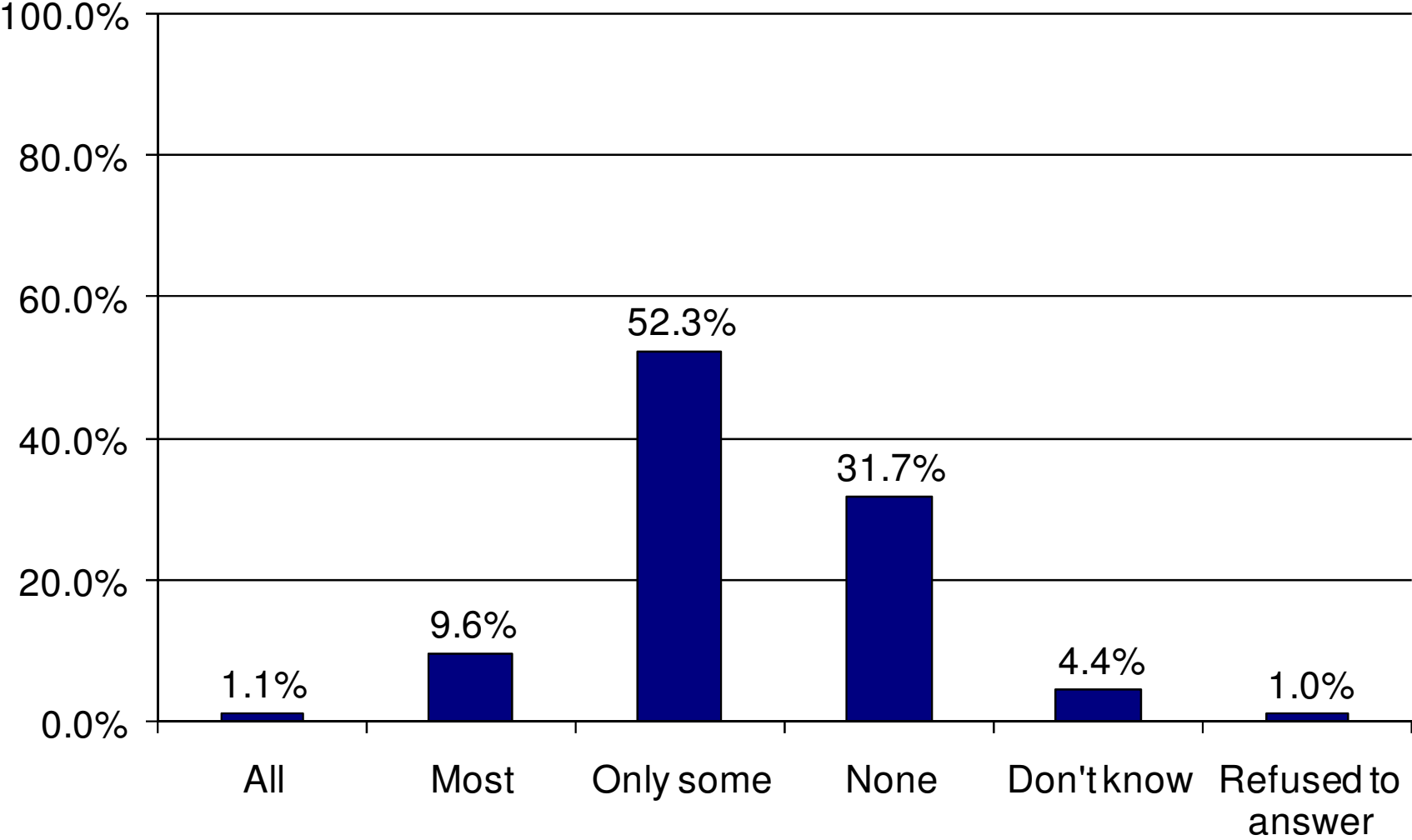
If yes, which political party are you a member? (N = 3,143)



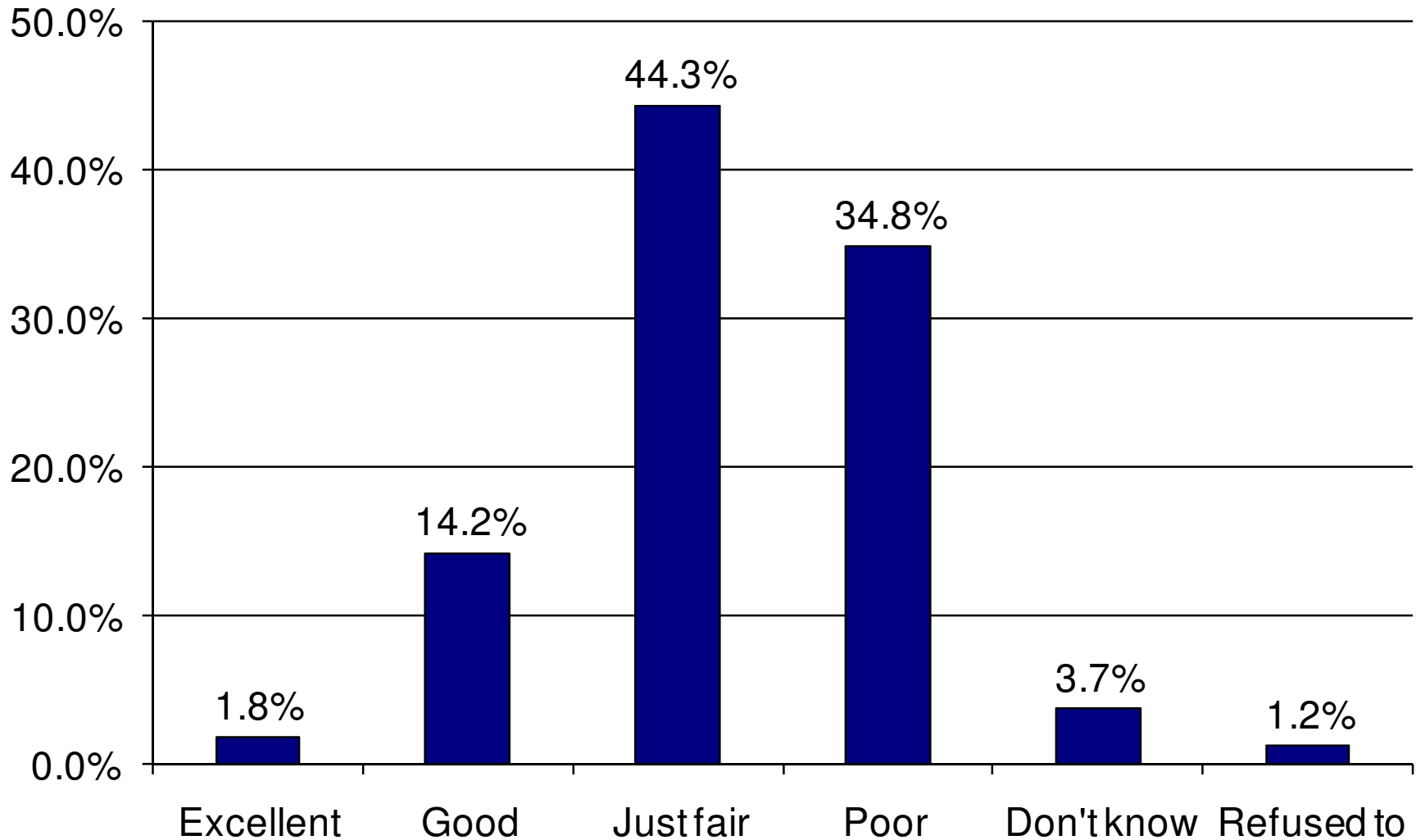

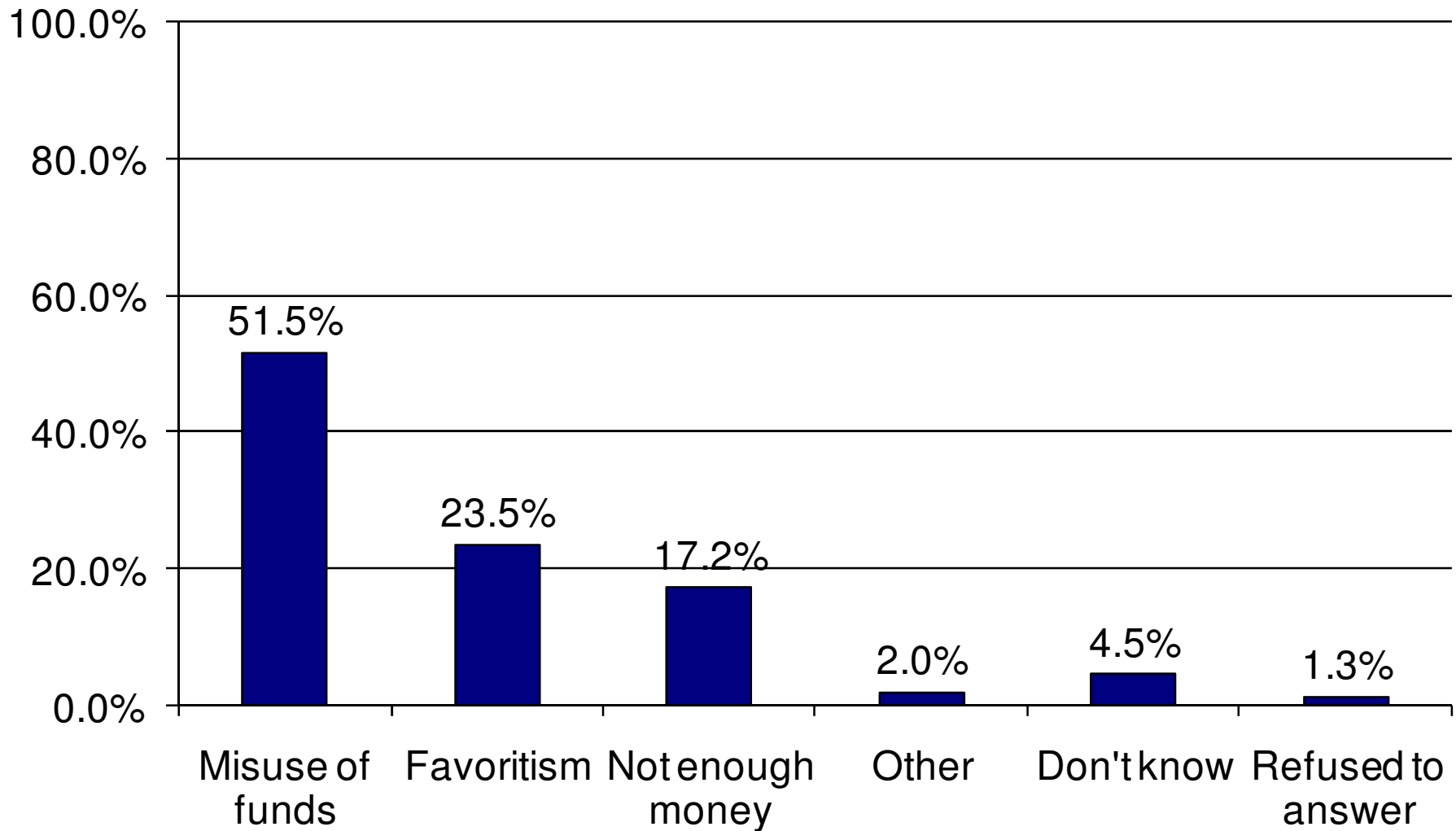
Thinking about your outgoing local councilor, did he/she fulfill all of his/her promises, most promises, only some promises, or no promises since the last election?



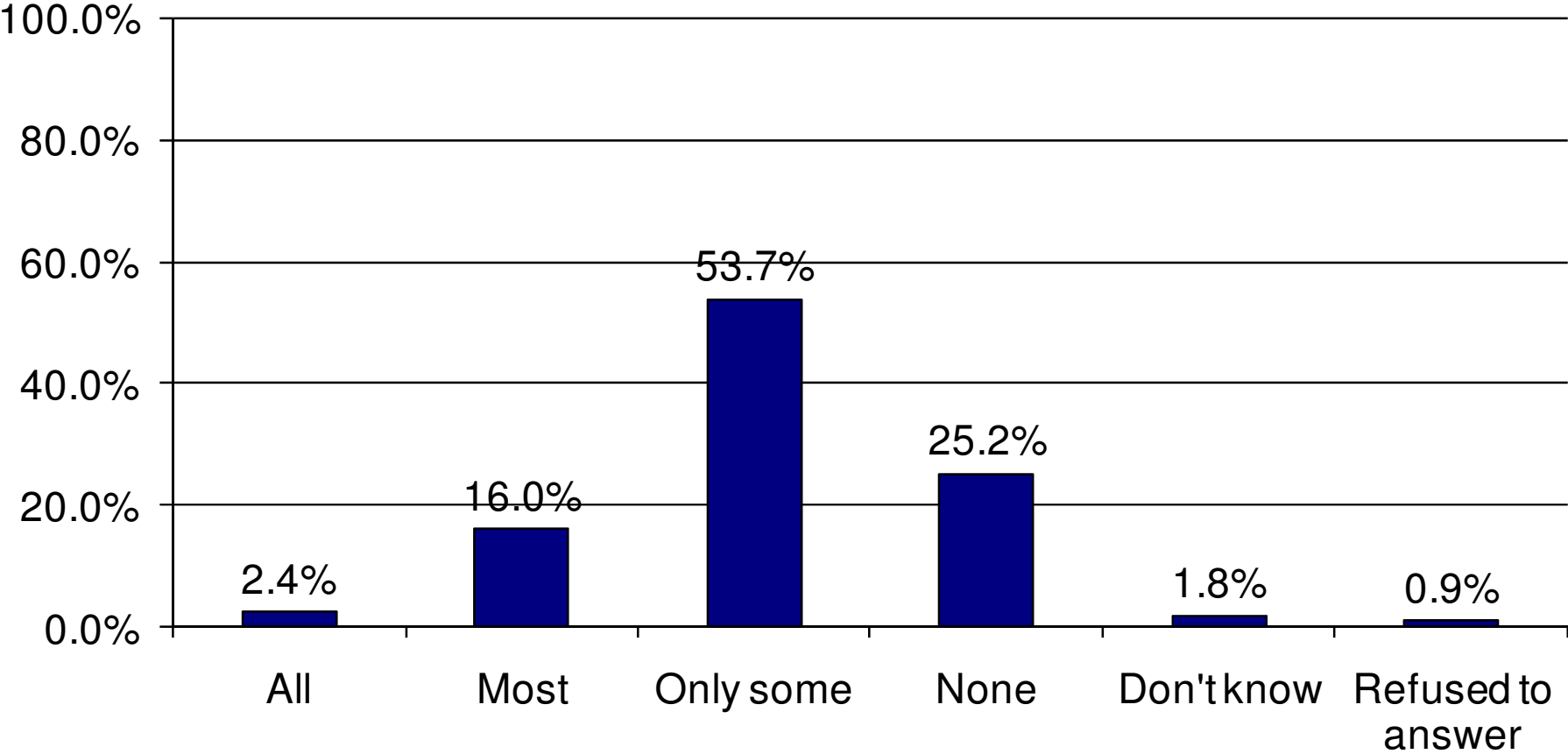
Does your local authority do an excellent, good, just fair, or poor job with the money it has to spend on services?



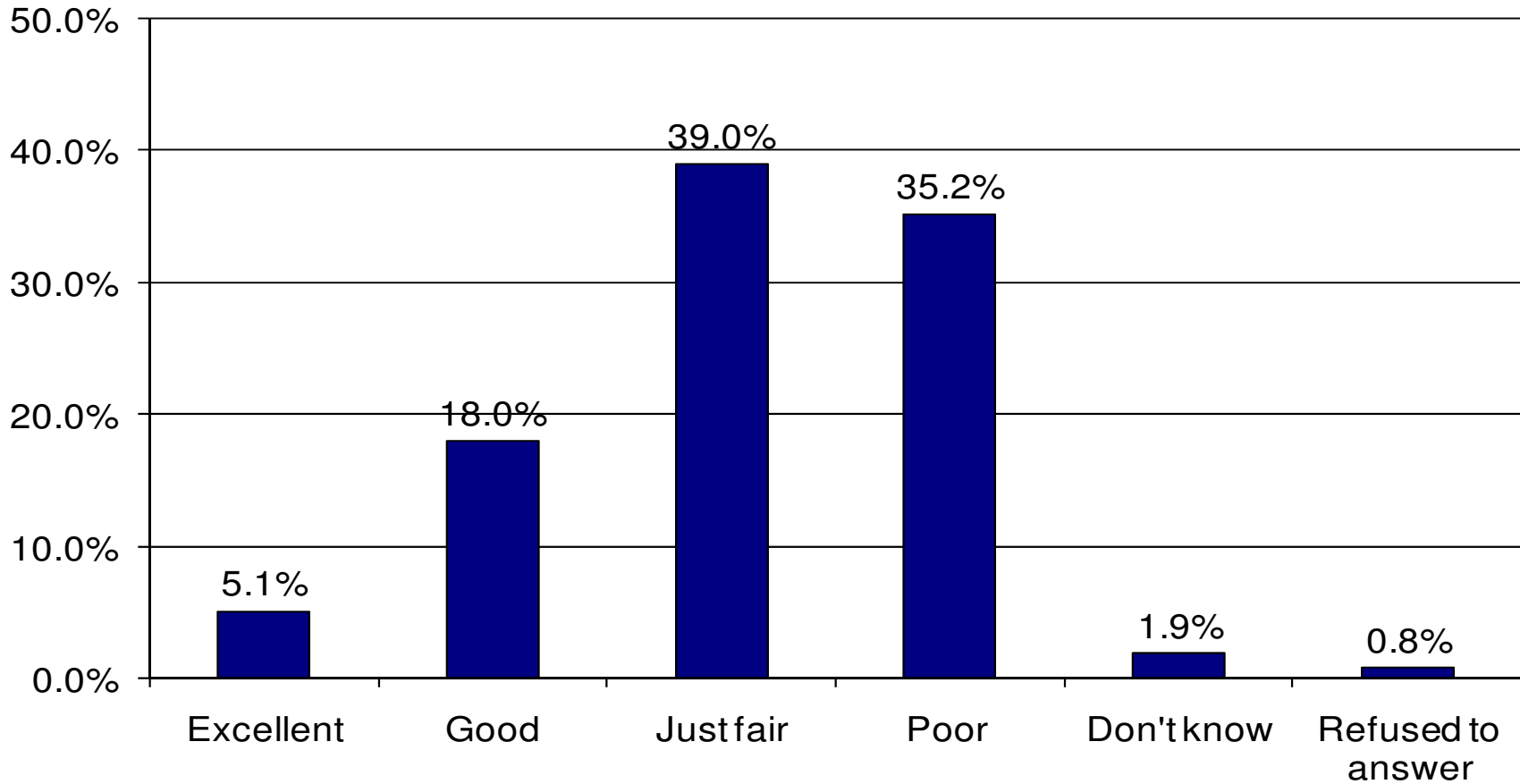
In your opinion, which of the following is the most important reason you do not get more services from your local authority, misuse of funds, favoritism, or not enough money?



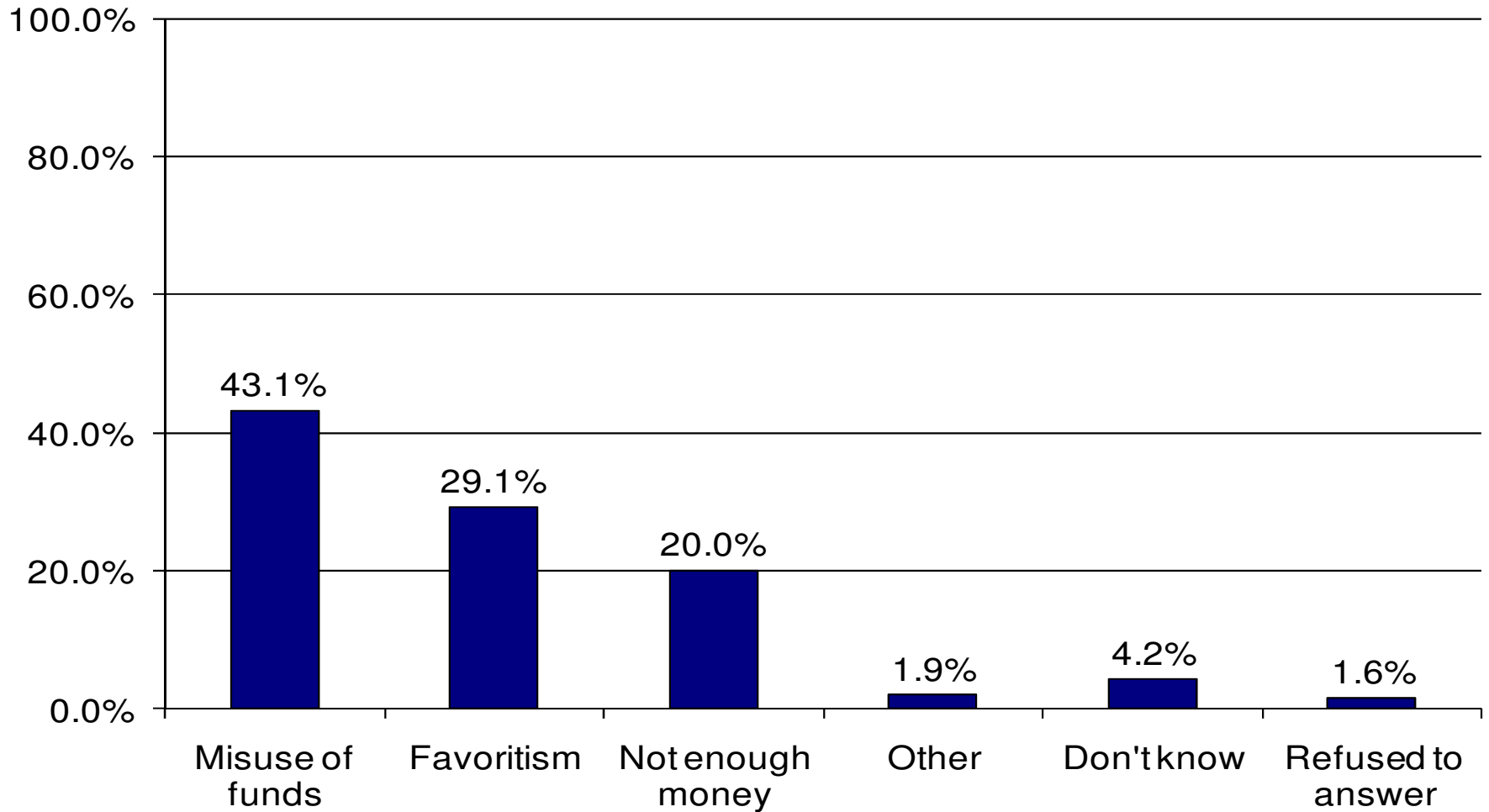
Thinking about your outgoing member of parliament, did he/she fulfill all of his/her promises, most promises, only some promises, or no promises since the last election?



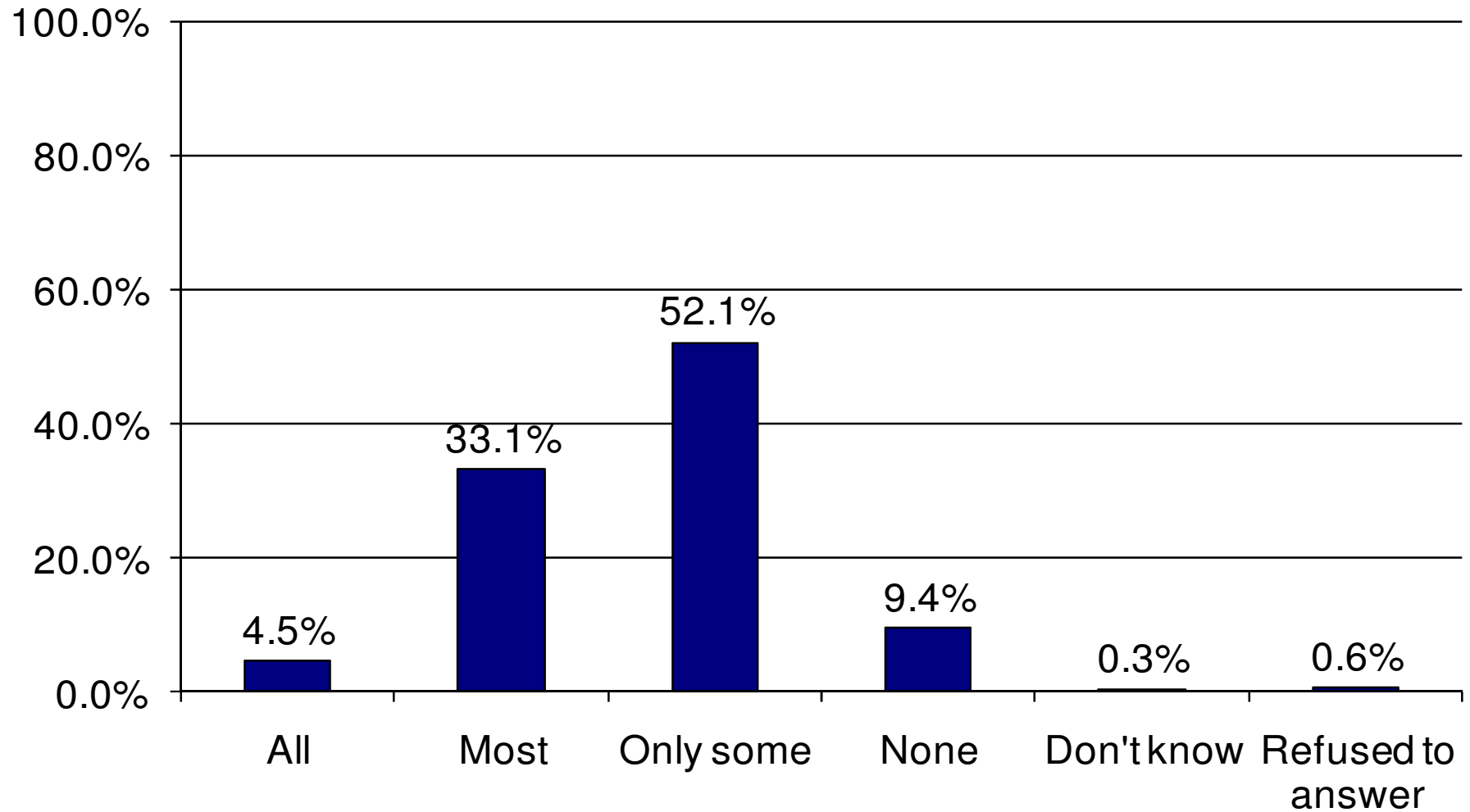
Does your member of parliament do an excellent, good, just fair or poor job with the money he/she has to spend on services?



In your opinion, which of the following is the most important reason you do not get more services from your member of parliament – misuse of funds, favoritism, or not enough money?

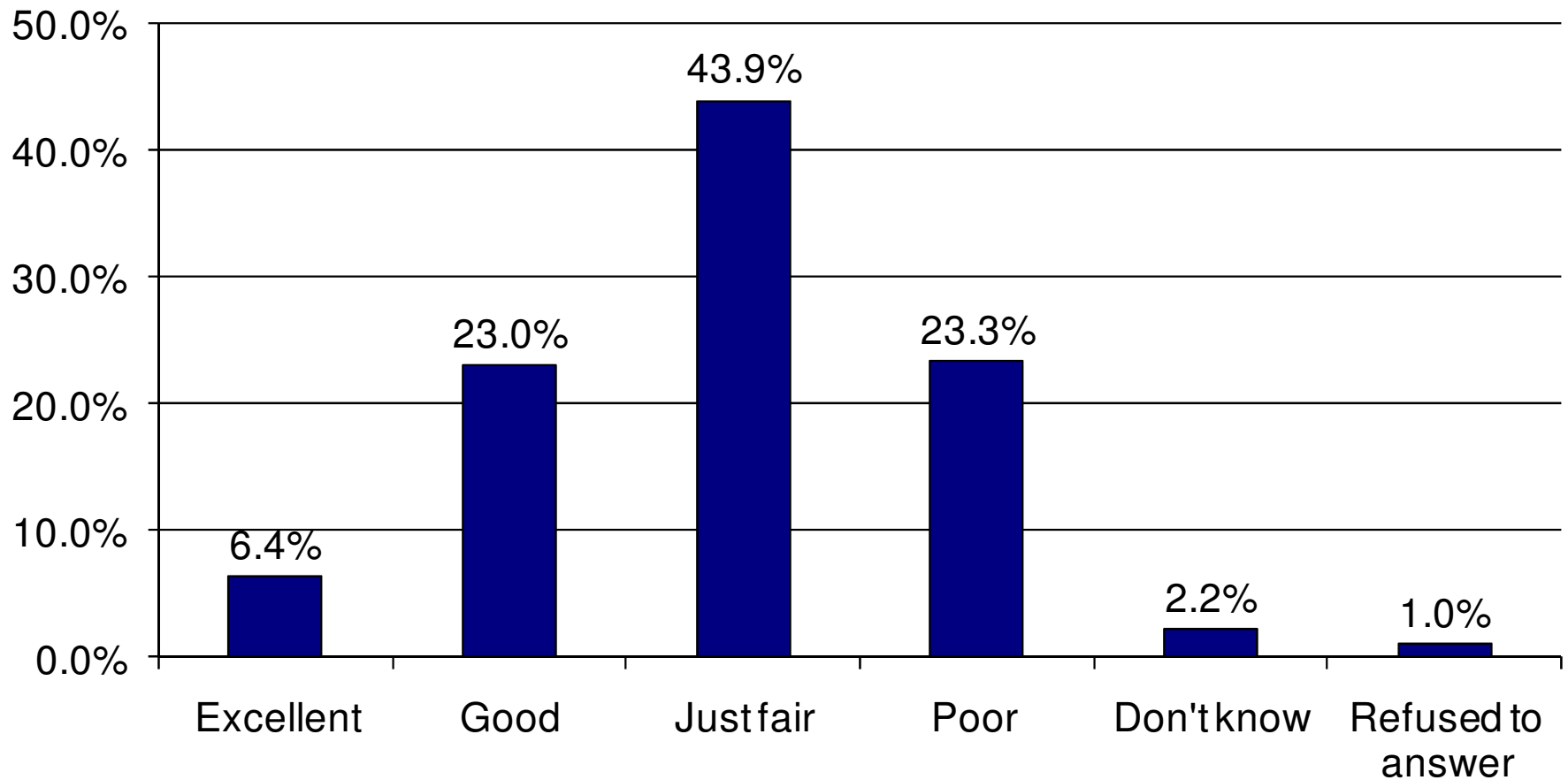


Thinking about President Kibaki, did he fulfill all of his promises, most promises, only some promises, or no promises since the last election?

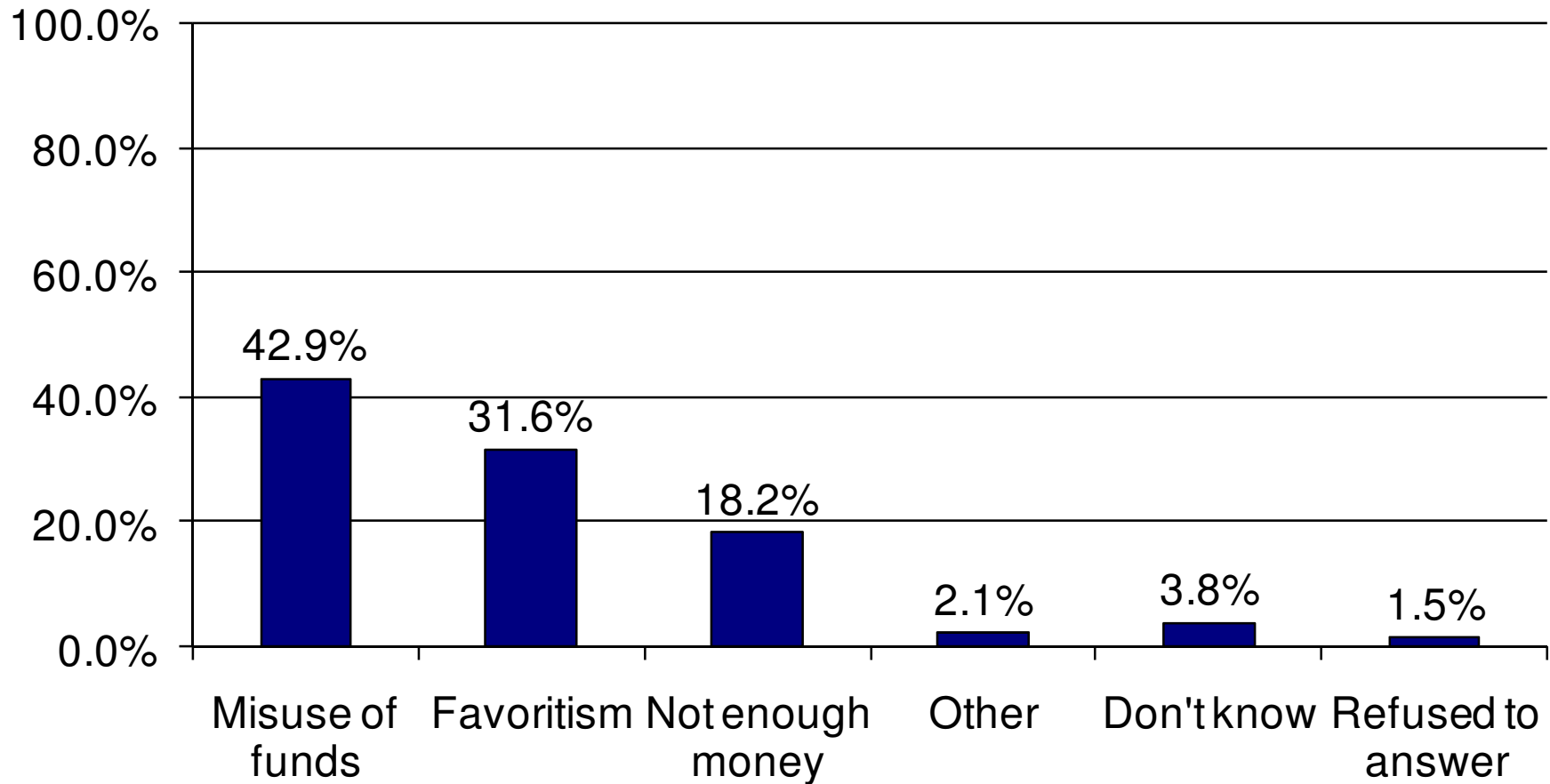




Does the national government do an excellent, good, just fair, or poor job with the money it has to spend on services?

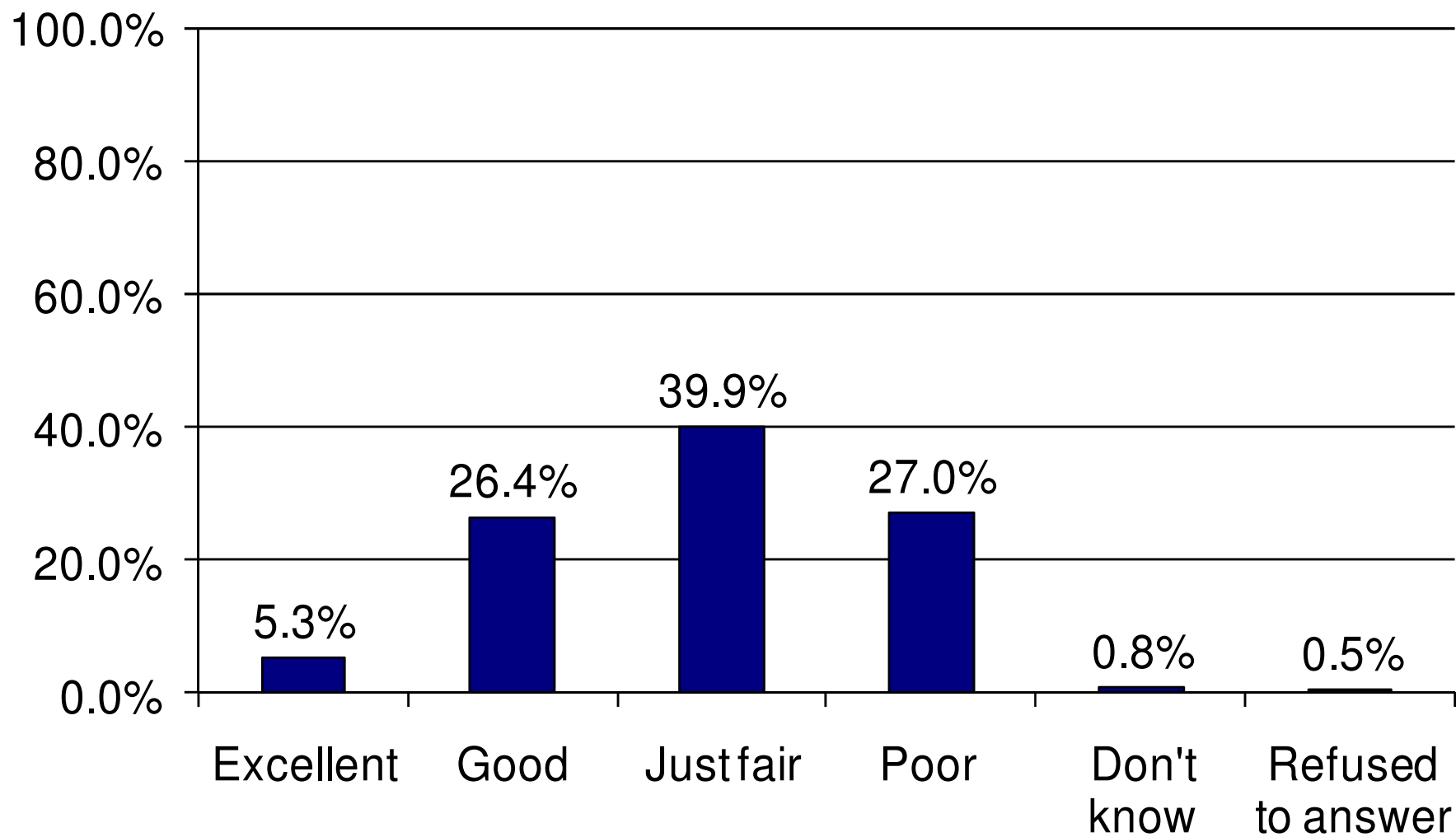


In your opinion, which of the following is the most important reason you do not get more services from the national government – misuse of funds, favoritism, or not enough money?

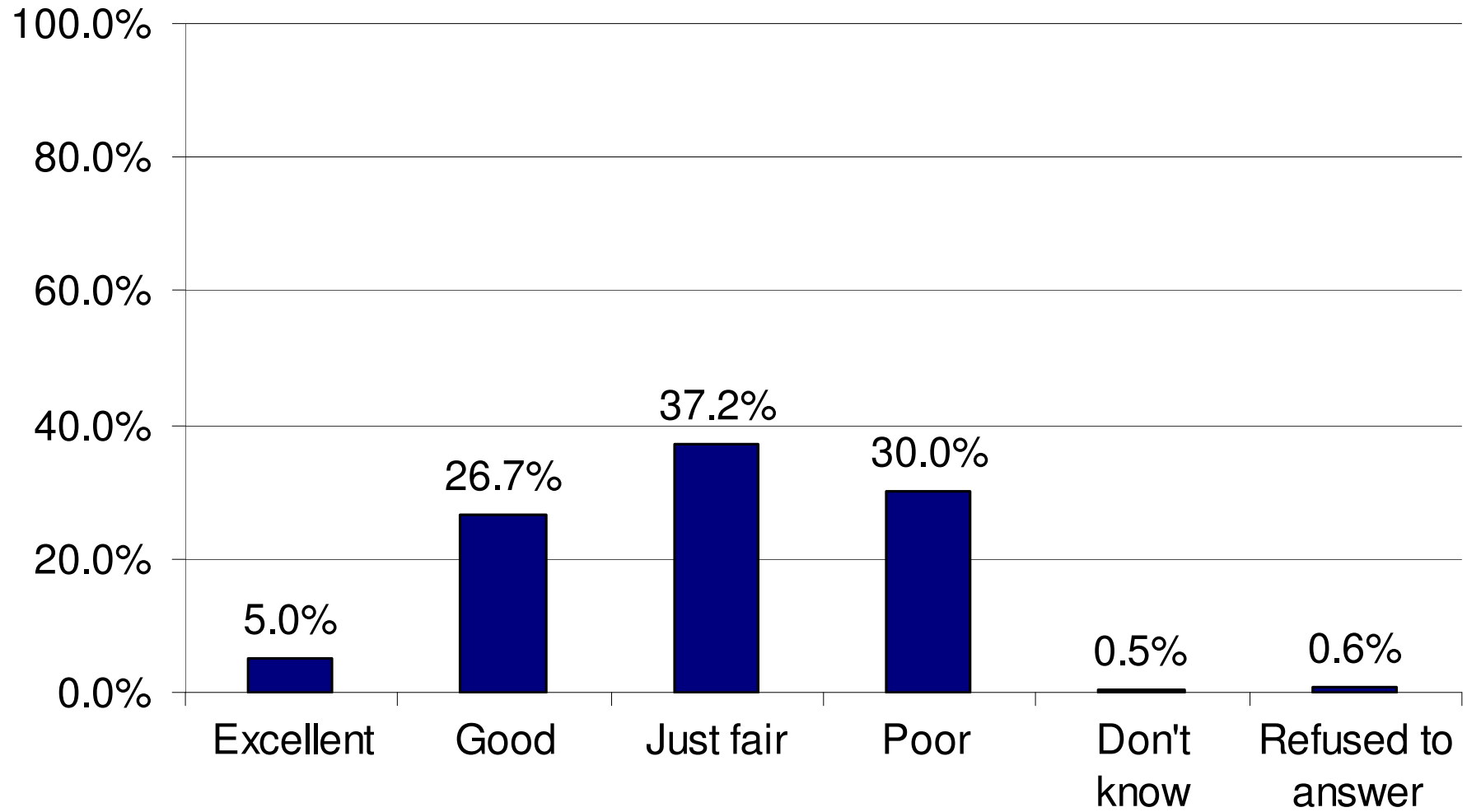

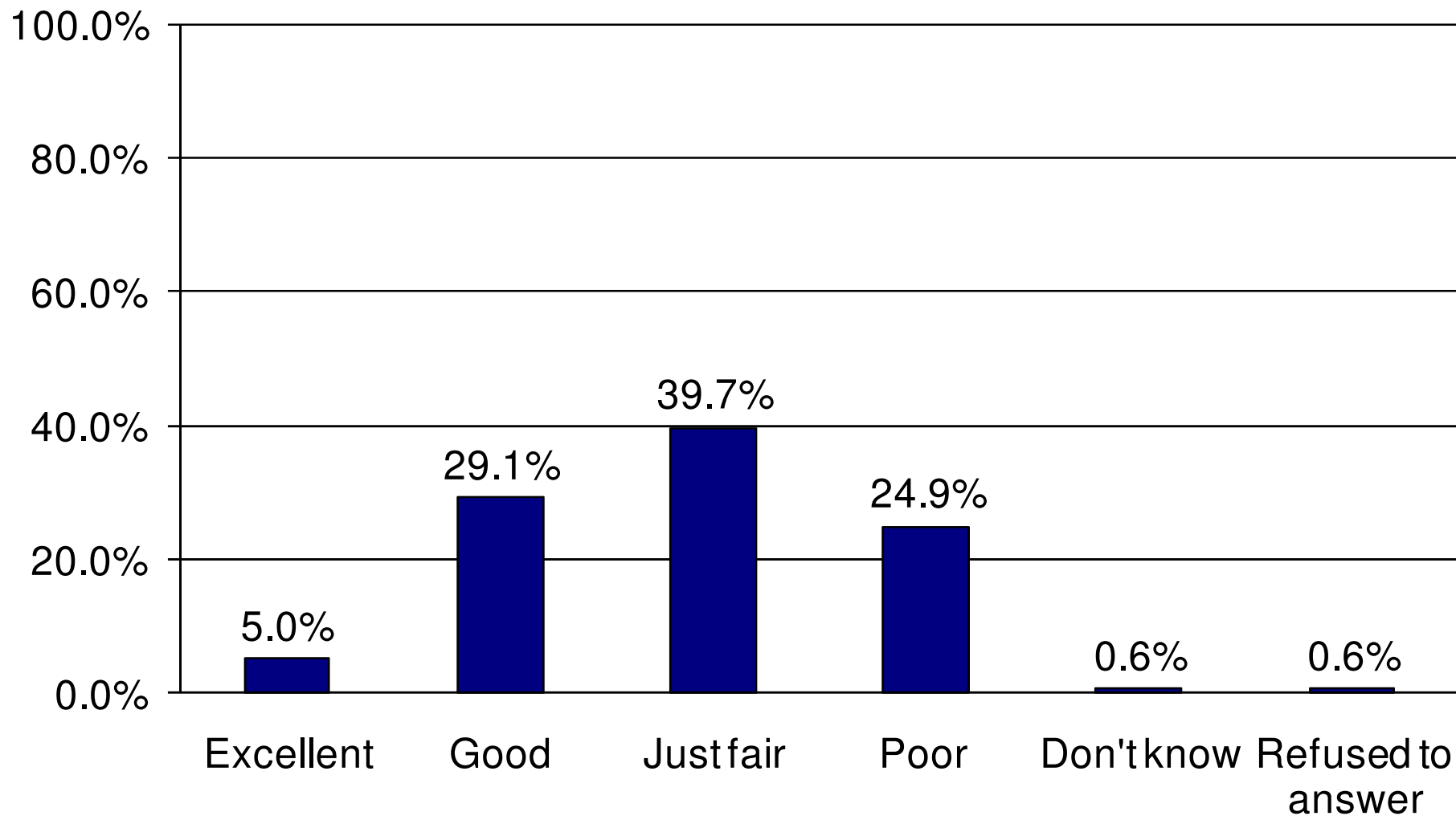
Do you think the condition of the nation's economy is excellent, good, just fair, or poor?



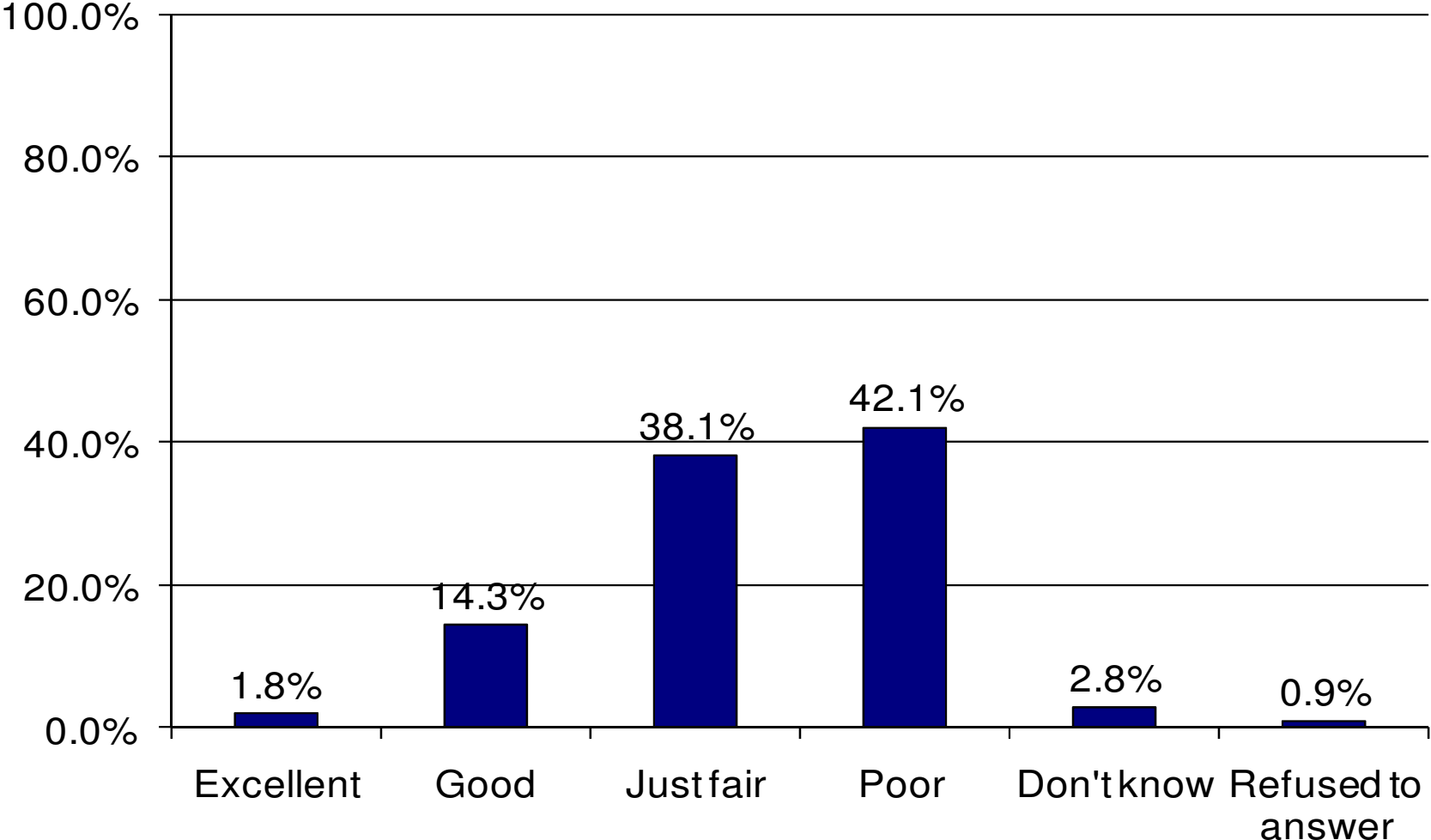
Do you think the condition of the security in your community is excellent, good, just fair, or poor?



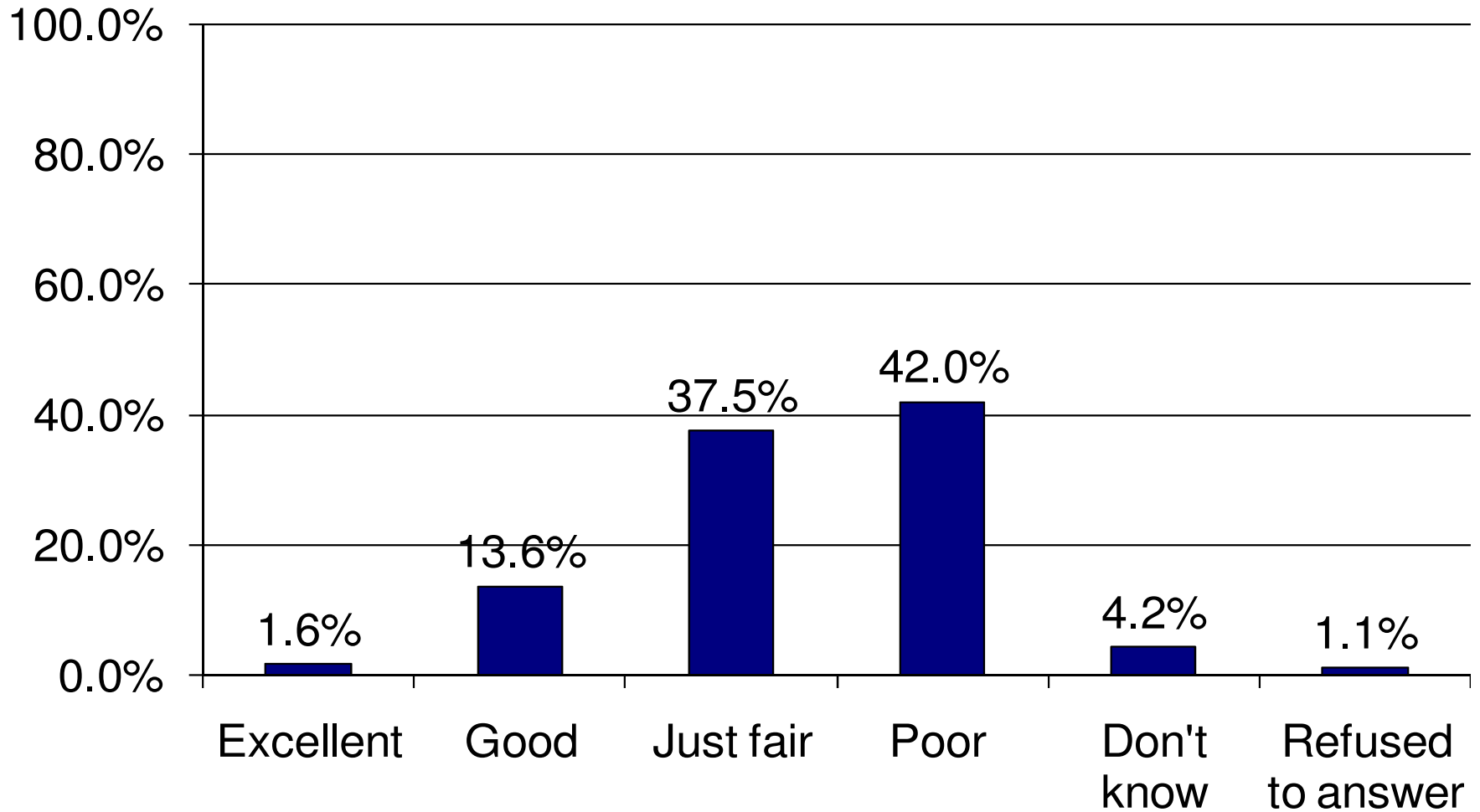
Do you think the condition of the health services in your community is excellent, good, just fair, or poor?
