




INFORMATION ABOUT THE SURVEY


- The survey was conducted by the Institute of Polling and Marketing for Baltic Surveys/Gallup on behalf of the International Republican Institute (IRI).
- This survey of Tbilisi residents was carried out from November 25 December 3, 2009.
- The sample consisted of 800 Tbilisi residents older than 18 and eligible to vote. The sample is representative of the general population by age, gender, education and religion.
- The sample design was a multi-stage random sample.
 - Stage One: Break city into official administrative regions.
 - Stage Two: Select clusters of sampling points based on population. One sample point = approximately one percent of survey population. Sampling points in each region were selected based on the percentage of population living in the region.
- Respondents were selected by the random route method, using the next birthday rule to select a respondent from within a household.
- The survey was carried out on behalf of IRI.
- Date was collected through face-to-face interviews with the respondents.
- The margin of error does not exceed 3.5 percent.
- Response rate was 73.7 percent.
- The study was funded by the United States Agency for International Development. The study was designed, coordinated and analyzed by Baltic Surveys/The Gallup Organization (Dr. Rasa Alisauskiene).


Would you say that the general situation in Tbilisi over the last four years has...?



Over the last three months, the economic situation in Tbilisi has...?




Over the last three months the financial situation of your household has...?






What are the three main problems you'd say your rayon is facing at the moment?








In the last two years, have you contacted / approached your local government representative with any requests?




What would be a reason for you to ask for the help of / approach your local government?




What kind of municipal meetings have you participated in?




Does local government offer opportunities for citizens to actively participate in the activities that they organize?



Does local government keep citizens well informed of its activities?






How much interest do you have in politics?




When considering which party to vote for, which is more important?




What are three major issues does the Mayor of Tbilisi needs to address?




What are the three biggest achievements of Tbilisi Mayor Gigi Ugulava?




What are the three biggest failures of Tbilisi Mayor Gigi Ugulava?




If elections for mayor and sakrebulo (city council) of Tbilisi were held next Sunday, would you vote in them?




If you would not vote or unsure whether you would vote, what are your reasons? (N=123)



What are three characteristics the Mayor of Tbilisi should have?




Which of these career backgrounds is most important for the Mayor of Tbilisi to possess?




Which of these sources do you use for obtaining political information?




Is Georgian mass media free to express various political views or there is control from the government over media content?




Why do you think that Georgian mass media is not free to express various political views? (N=328)



How many times per week do you access the Internet?




Where do you access the Internet most frequently? (N=380)




