Survey of Public Opinion South Sudan's Greater Equatoria Region

May 21-June 15, 2012











Survey Methodology

- The International Republican Institute (IRI) undertook a poll in the three states of South Sudan's Greater Equatoria region which includes the states of Central Equatoria, Eastern Equatoria and Western Equatoria. Analysis, supervision and execution of the poll was performed by Opinion Research Business (ORB), an international opinion research firm. Fieldwork management was done by Samahi Research, a private South Sudanese research consultancy.
- Data was collected via face-to-face interviews from May 21 June 15, 2012.
- The population studied was adults ages 18 and older. A representative random sample
 was designed based on the latest population estimates reported in the 2010 Statistical
 Yearbook for South Sudan.
- The survey employed probability proportional to size (PPS) sampling methodology. The population of Greater Equatoria was stratified by county. Enumeration areas within each county were selected using PPS; households within each enumeration area were then identified using a random walk method and a skip pattern; respondents were randomly chosen within households using a Kish grid. Every other interview was conducted with a female to achieve 50 percent gender parity.
- The questionnaire was offered in Juba Arabic, English, Bari, Zande and Toposa.

Survey Methodology

- The margin of error is +/- 2.5 percent. The margin of error for subsets (i.e. tribes/age/education, etc.) is significantly higher and should be treated as indicative only.
- This report contains Greater Equatoria data from IRI's September 2011 poll to provide comparison. The margin of error for the September 2011 data is +/- 3.7 percent, unless otherwise stated.
- The overall response rate (defined as the number of successful interviews divided by eligible houses visited) is 57 percent. To complete 1,547 interviews, 2,698 households were contacted.
- Due to rounding and multiple response questions, not all percentages add up to 100.
 Unless otherwise stated, all questions N=1,547. Because the survey met key demographic indicators (state/county) and quotas (gender), no weighting was necessary during data analysis
- The poll was conducted with funding from the U.S. Agency for International Development.







Do you feel that South Sudan is generally heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?






Why do you say that the country is heading in the right direction? Open-ended, Top 9 Responses, N=760





Why do you say that the country is heading in the wrong direction? Open-ended, Top 13 Responses, N=771





What do you think is the most important problem facing this country?





What do you think is the most important problem facing your state?



What do you think is the most important problem facing your state? Sum of First and Second Responses, by State




What do you think is the biggest issue or concern that most impacts your daily life or family?



What do you think is the biggest issue or concern that most impacts your daily life or family?





Generally speaking, do you think Equatorians are better off or worse off than South Sudanese who live in other regions?






Do you feel that the economy of South Sudan is generally heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?






Why do you think that the economy is heading in the right direction/wrong direction? Open-ended







Thinking about your local market, would you say there are more goods, less goods or about the same amount of goods available now compared to this time last year?




Thinking about your local market, would you say goods are more expensive, less expensive or about the same price now as compared to this time last year?




Thinking about your local market, do you think there will be more goods, less goods or about the same amount of goods available six months from now?




Thinking about your local market, do you think that goods will be more expensive, less expensive or about the same price six months from now?



Thinking about the amount of money your family spends per month, please tell me which of the following phrases best suits your household situation?




Do you think your household will have more income, less income or about the same amount of income six months from now?










What type of project is going on in your area?






Each constituency has a committee that manages the CDF. In your opinion, who do you think should have the responsibility to manage the CDF? N=523




Do you support the national government's decision to stop oil production?




What do you think was the primary source of income for the national government last year?




Do you think the government's decision to stop oil production will affect the amount of services it can provide?




Why do you think the government's decision to stop oil production will/will not affect the amount of services it can provide?










Do you think different tribal groups are fairly represented in the national government?




Over the last year, would you say that security in South Sudan has gotten better, worse, or stayed the same?




Over the last year, would you say that security in South Sudan has gotten better, worse, or stayed the same?




In some areas of South Sudan, violence is a major concern for people. What type of violence concerns you the most in your daily life?



In some areas of South Sudan, violence is a major concern for people. What type of violence concerns you the most in your daily life? By State




How satisfied are you with the government's efforts to resolve local conflicts in different areas of this country?






Have you ever read, seen or heard about the Transitional Constitution of your state? By State




Thinking about current political developments in Juba, have you heard about the national constitutional process to draft a permanent constitution for South Sudan?



In your opinion, should the President of South Sudan have the power to remove from office any of the following officials in the event of a crisis?









Why do you say that (you are satisfied/not satisfied with the SPLM's performance)?







How many political parties do you think there are in South Sudan? Open-ended, Top 7 Responses




When thinking about political parties, do you think there are currently too many, too few, or just the right amount?




How favorable are you towards the following political parties? For each one, please tell me whether you think very favorably, favorably, unfavorably or very unfavorably about them.




Do you think the current representation of political parties in national government should be higher, lower or stay the same?



Do you think the current representation of political parties in state government should be higher, lower or stay the same?






If you are a member of a political party, which party?






What is your present occupation?

Which radio station do you listen to most often for news and information?


