Detailed Methodology


- The International Republican Institute carried out a survey of adult residents of Côte d'Ivoire aged 18 years and older.
- Face-to-face interviews were carried out with 1,500 respondents between April 20-30, 2015.
- Data was collected by Ivorian Services of Studies and Surveys under the supervision of Rob Varsalone of Global Strategic Partners.
- The survey is a national representative sample of adult residents of Côte d'Ivoire. The sample was distributed in 231 clusters in all 19 administrative regions of Côte d'Ivoire.
- A multi-stage probability sample was used. In the first stage, the sample was stratified by administrative region and was then further stratified by urban/rural location. The probability-proportional-to-size method was used to select departments, communes, sub-prefectures, and wards/towns/villages. Wards/towns/villages served as the primary sampling units (PSU) for this survey. Within each PSU, households were randomly selected through a skip pattern after a random starting point was determined and the left hand rule employed. The Kish Grid was then used to select the appropriate individual in the household for interview. Individual interviews were conducted by a team of 64 interviewers who worked under the control of 32 supervisors. Interview teams were comprised of both males and females.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies. The confidence interval does not take into account design effect.
- The sampling error is plus or minus 2.5 percent at the mid-range with a confidence level of 95 percent. The response rate for the survey was 81 percent.
- Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding error.


Progress in National Reconciliation but Issues Remain



Do you feel that justice has been served to all Ivorians after the 2010/2011 post-election crisis?




Overall, would you say you approve or disapprove of the job being done by each of the following institutions?



Youth Lacking Representation








Economic Concerns Prominent, Desire for Democracy Stronger


In your opinion, what is the single most important issue Côte d'Ivoire is facing today?



Now thinking about the year ahead, do you think your personal economic situation will improve, worsen or stay the same?




If you could only choose one or the other, which is more important to you: a democratic system of government or a prosperous economy?


More Support for Democratic Governance Needed

In your opinion, how likely is it that you are able to talk to your member of parliament about an important issue?










Overall, how would you rate the security situation of Côte d'Ivoire?


Overall, how would you rate the political stability of Côte d'Ivoire?



Over the past year, would you say that your personal economic situation has improved, worsened or stayed the same?




How willing are you to live through some economic sacrifices today (for example, higher prices) if it leads to future improvements in the quality of your life?



For how long are you willing to sacrifice before you expect to see a longterm economic benefit?




To what extent do you think that corruption is a problem in Côte d'Ivoire?


When it comes to fighting corruption, how would you rate the job the national government is doing?





Overall, would you say Ivorians have a civic responsibility to participate in any of the following?




Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: "Voting gives me a chance to influence decision-making in Côte d'Ivoire."






Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: "Politicians do not listen to the needs and ideas of women"?


If there are two candidates running for office and they are exactly the same aside from the fact that one is a man and one is a woman, which candidate would you prefer?









In general, do you feel safe in your daily life?




Who is primarily responsible for the security of Côte d'Ivoire?




Which of the following types of violence concerns you the most in your daily life?




Do you feel the Disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration process is making progress?



In your opinion, who is primarily responsible for leading reconciliation in the country?




Right now, what is the most important thing to bring about national reconciliation? (open-ended)












How important do you think the participation of opposition parties is in determining the future of the country?







Are ethnic issues important to you?




In your opinion, will ethnicity influence the 2015 national election?






In general, do you believe the Ivorian public media reports political news objectively?
