Detailed Methodology

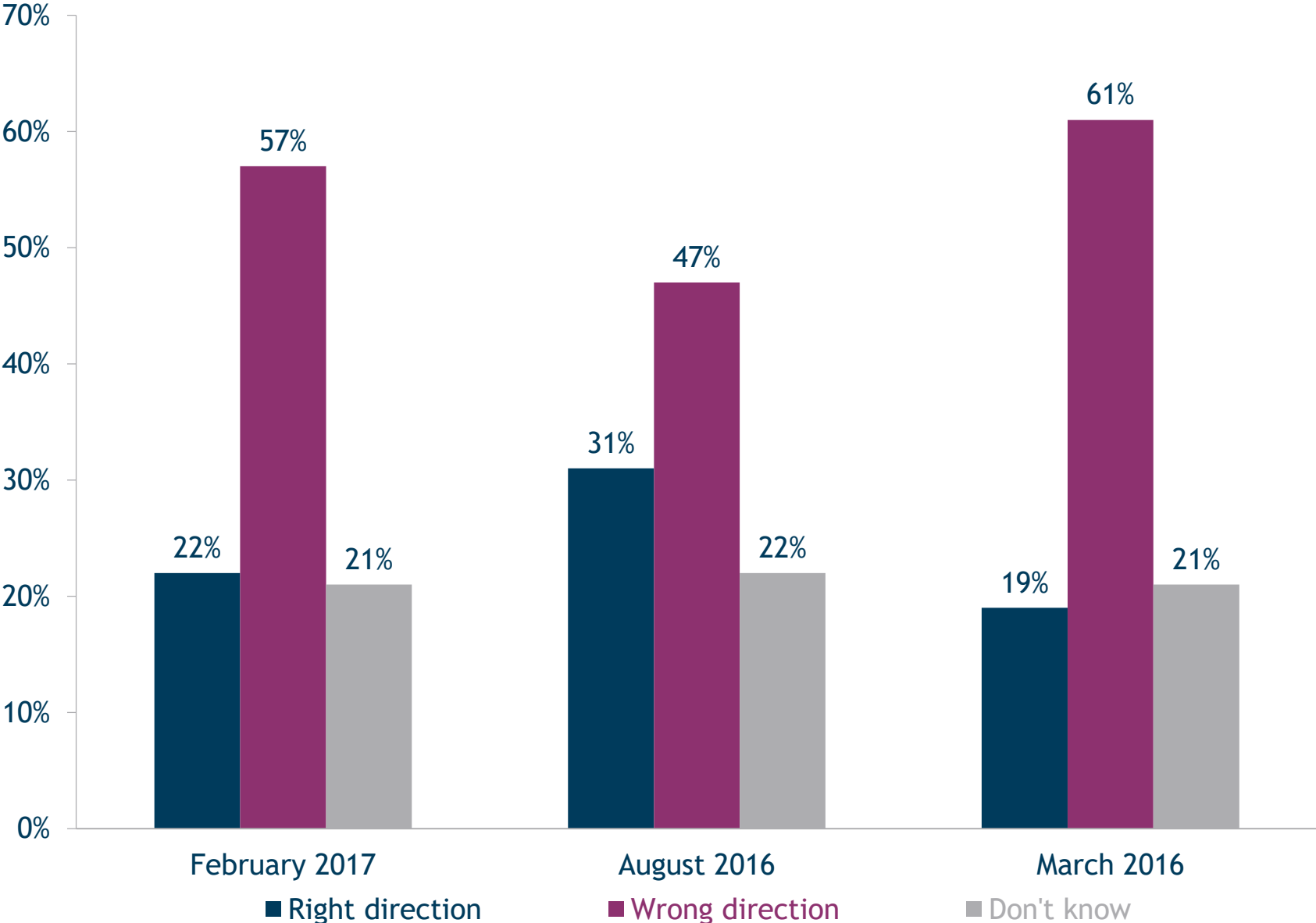
- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute by the **Social Policy Development Research Institute (SPDRI)** under the supervision of **Chesapeake Beach Consulting** between January 23 and February 5, 2017. The Government of Canada provides funding for this project.
- Data was collected through in-person, in-home interviews. The sample was stratified by 13 of Mongolia's 21 *aimags* (provinces) as well as Ulaanbaatar and then subdivided by *soum* (town) or district. Interviews were conducted in both urban and rural locations.
- The sample consisted of 5,000 respondents aged 18 and older, with a response rate of 97.2 percent and was representative of voting-age adults nationally.
- Within each of the selected 13 *aimags* outside of Ulaanbaatar, 2,799 interviews were conducted in three randomly selected *soums*. All nine districts in Ulaanbaatar were surveyed, with a total of 2,201 interviews. The number of interviews conducted within each *aimag* was determined using voter registration information from the 2013 presidential election.
- After identifying a centrally located starting point, a skip pattern was used to select households to interview. Within each household, the Kish Grid was then used to select respondents 18 years and older.
- Interview teams were comprised of both males and females.
- The margin of error does not exceed plus or minus 1.4 percent at the mid-range with a confidence level of 95 percent.
- This data has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies. Figures in charts and tables may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.

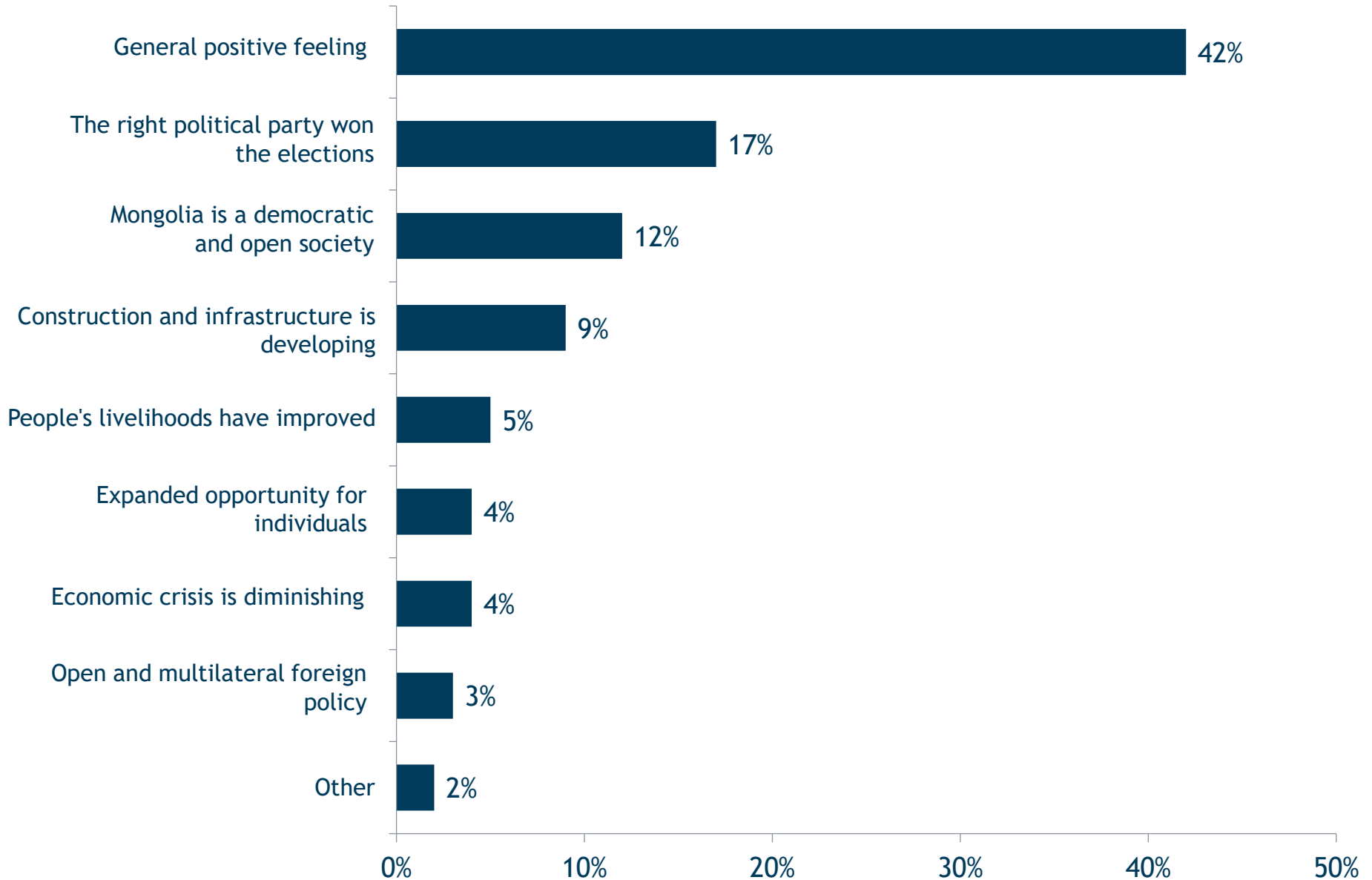


Overall, do you think Mongolia is headed in the right direction or the wrong direction?

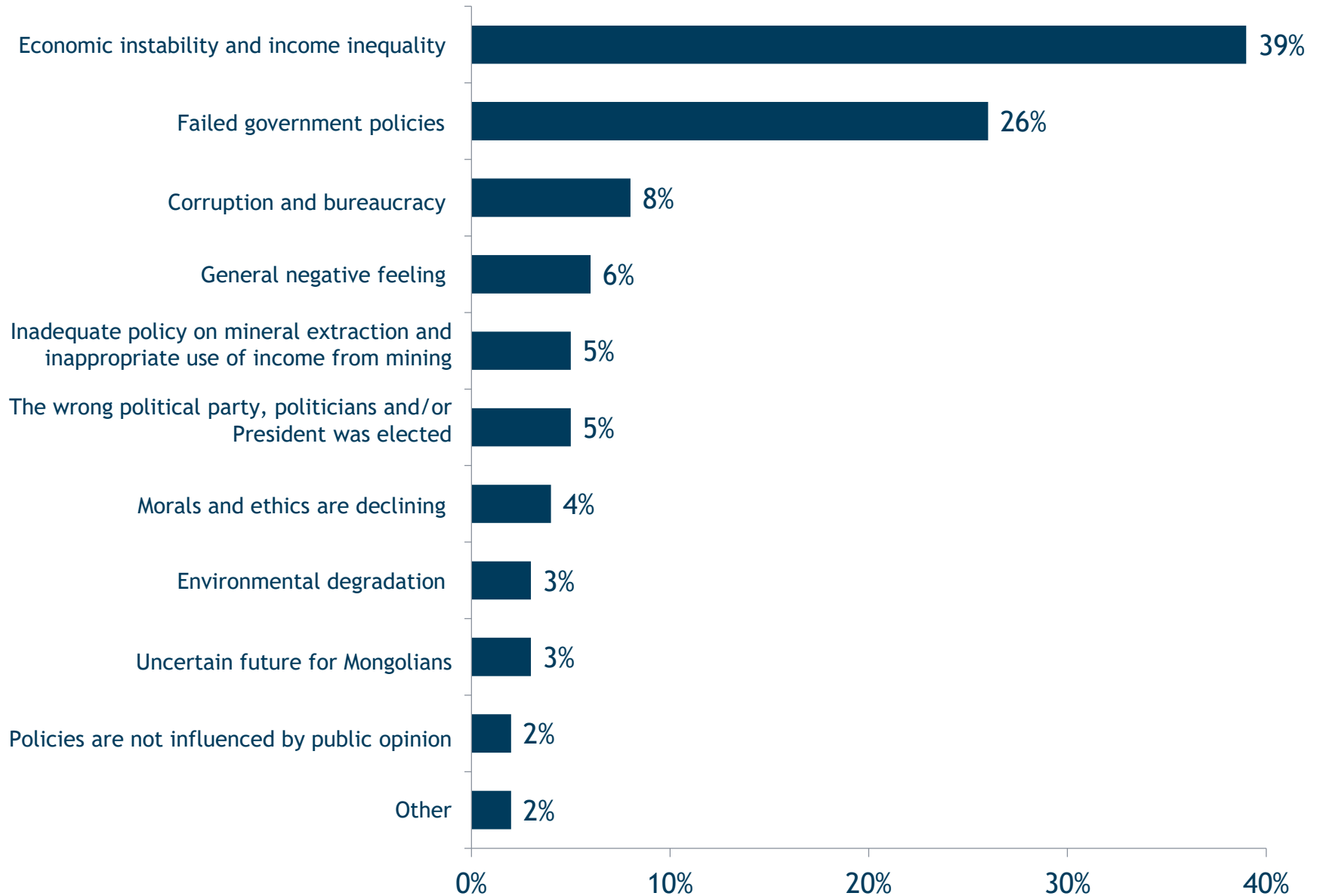


Why do you say right direction?

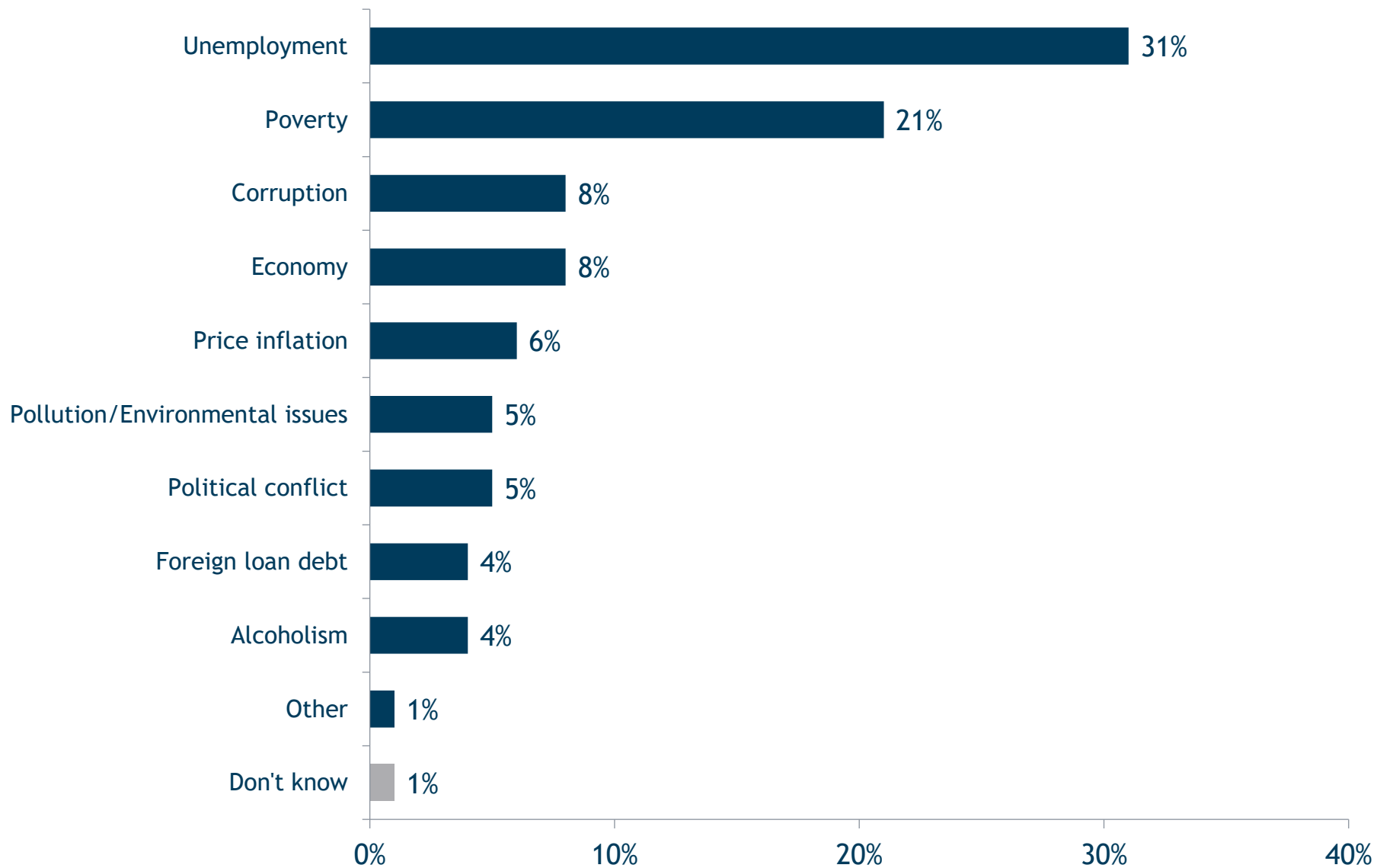

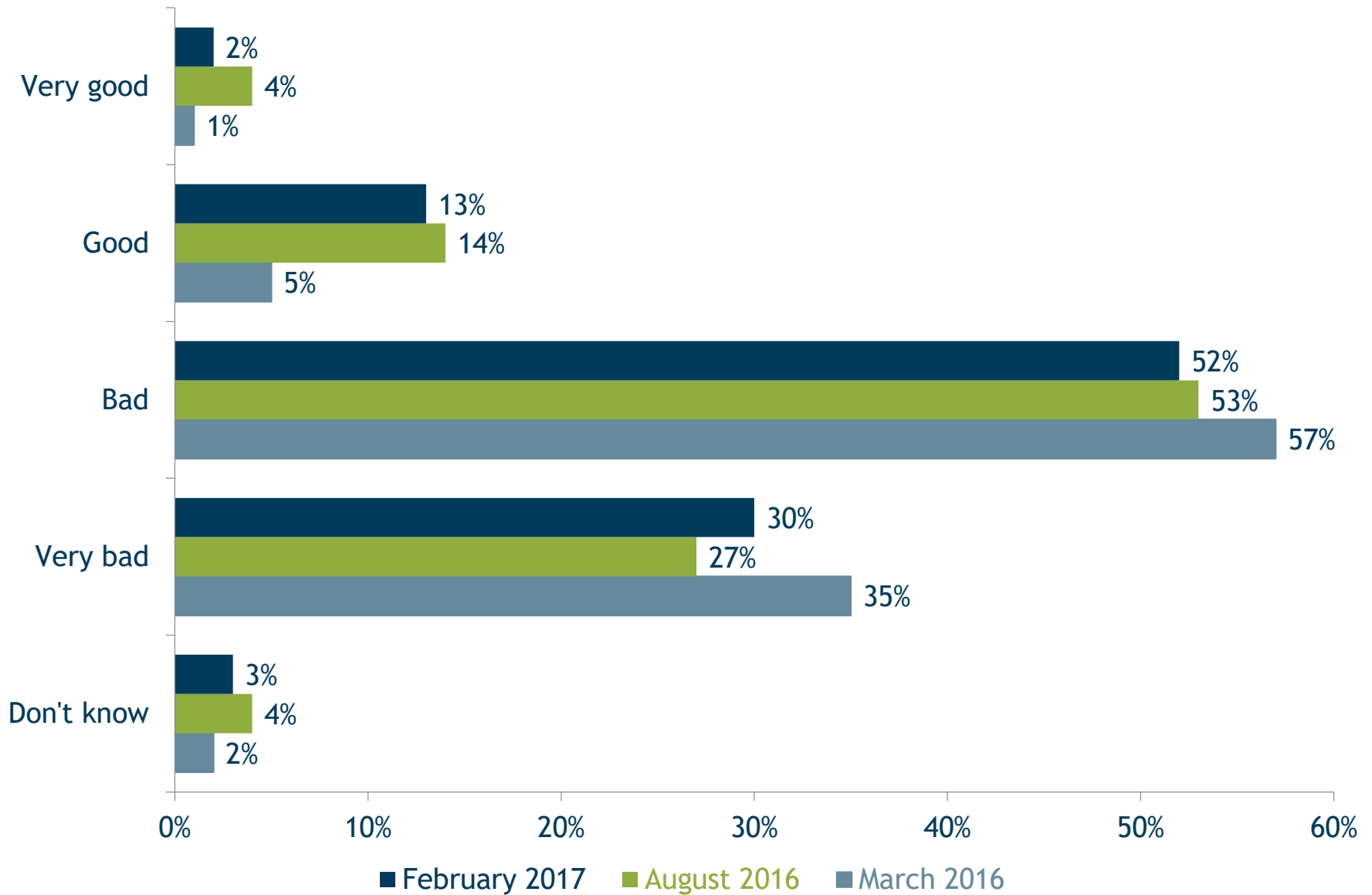
Why do you say wrong direction? (n=2,825, open-ended)



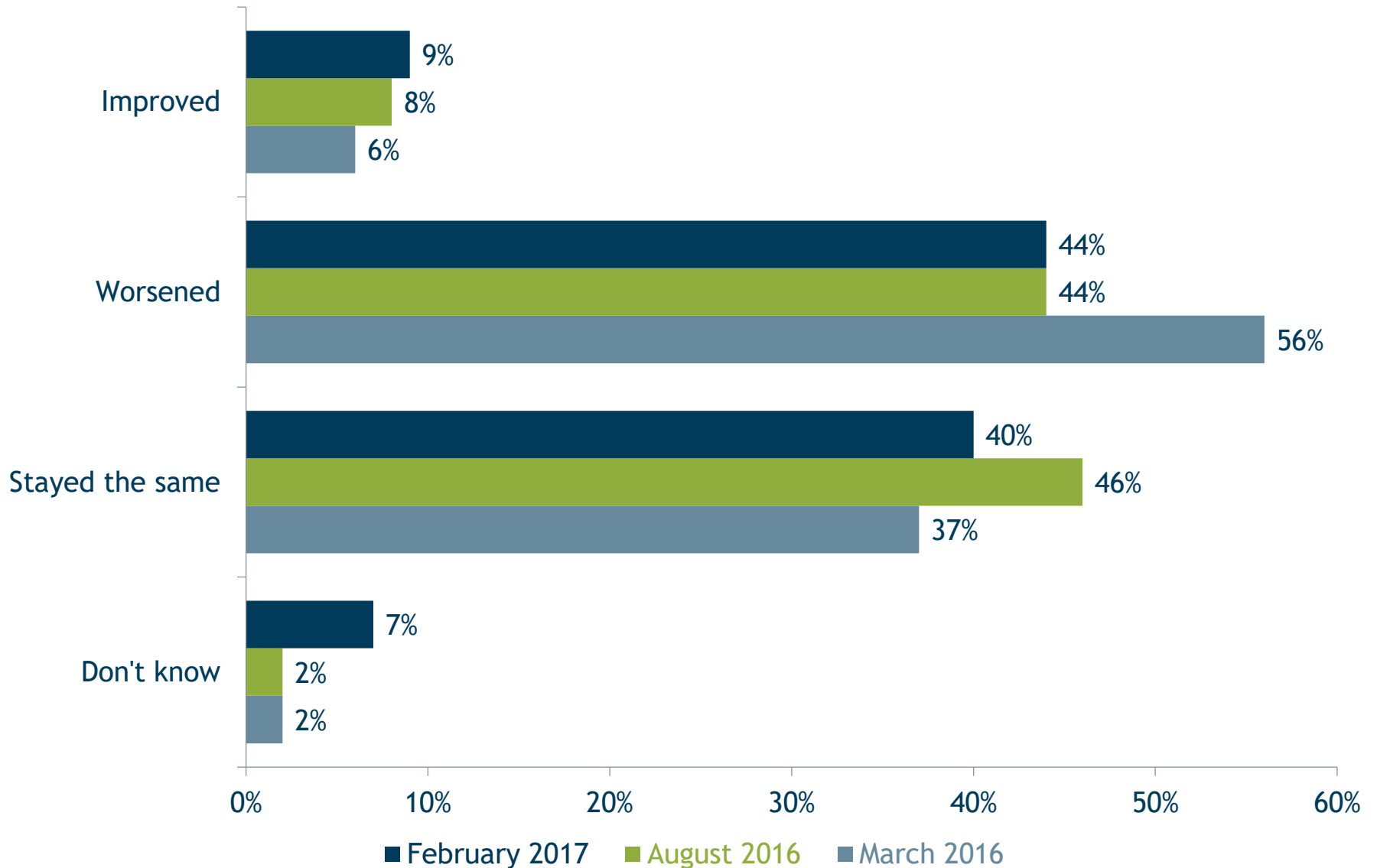
What is the most important problem facing Mongolia? (open-ended)



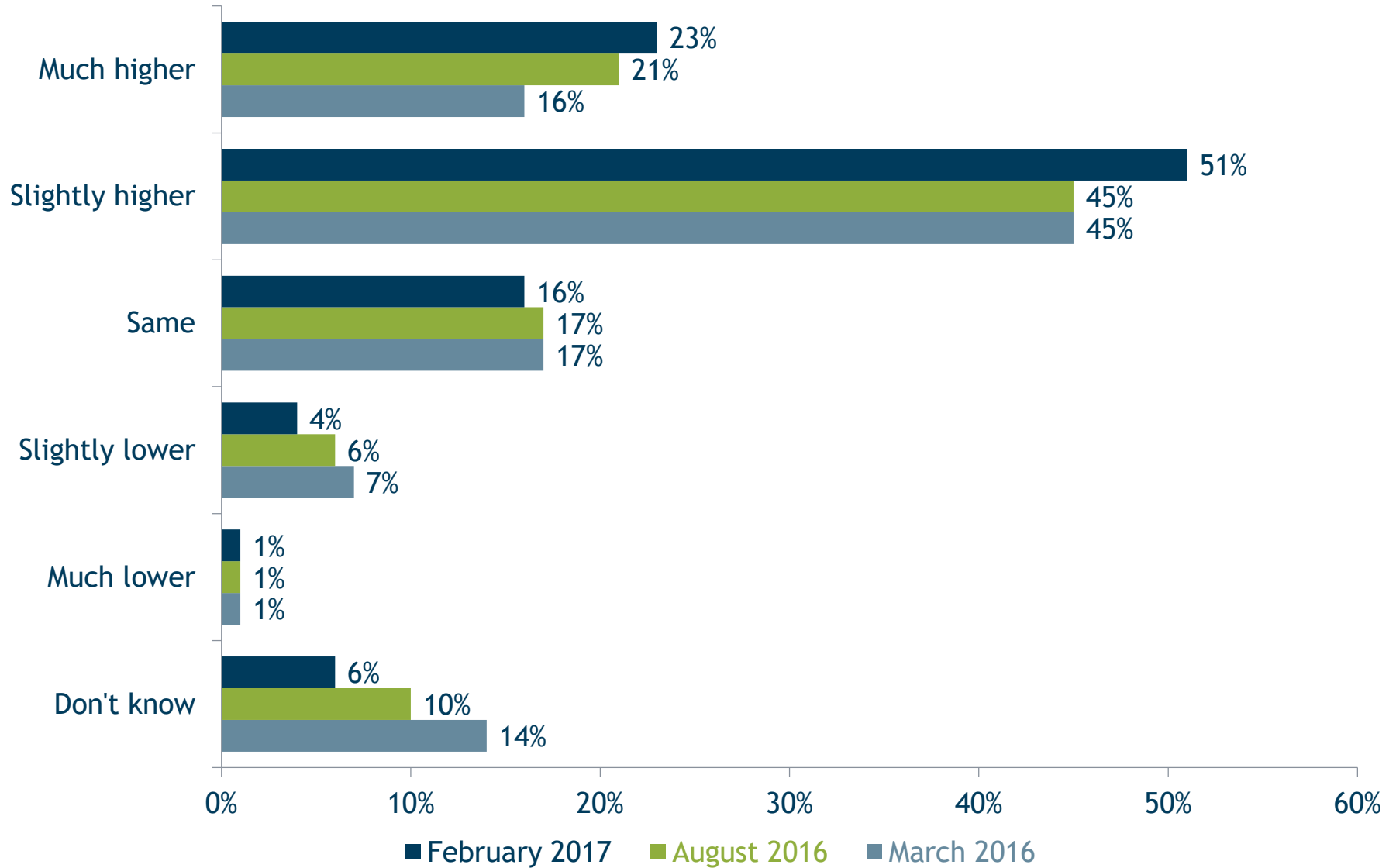
Overall, how would you rate the current economic conditions in Mongolia?



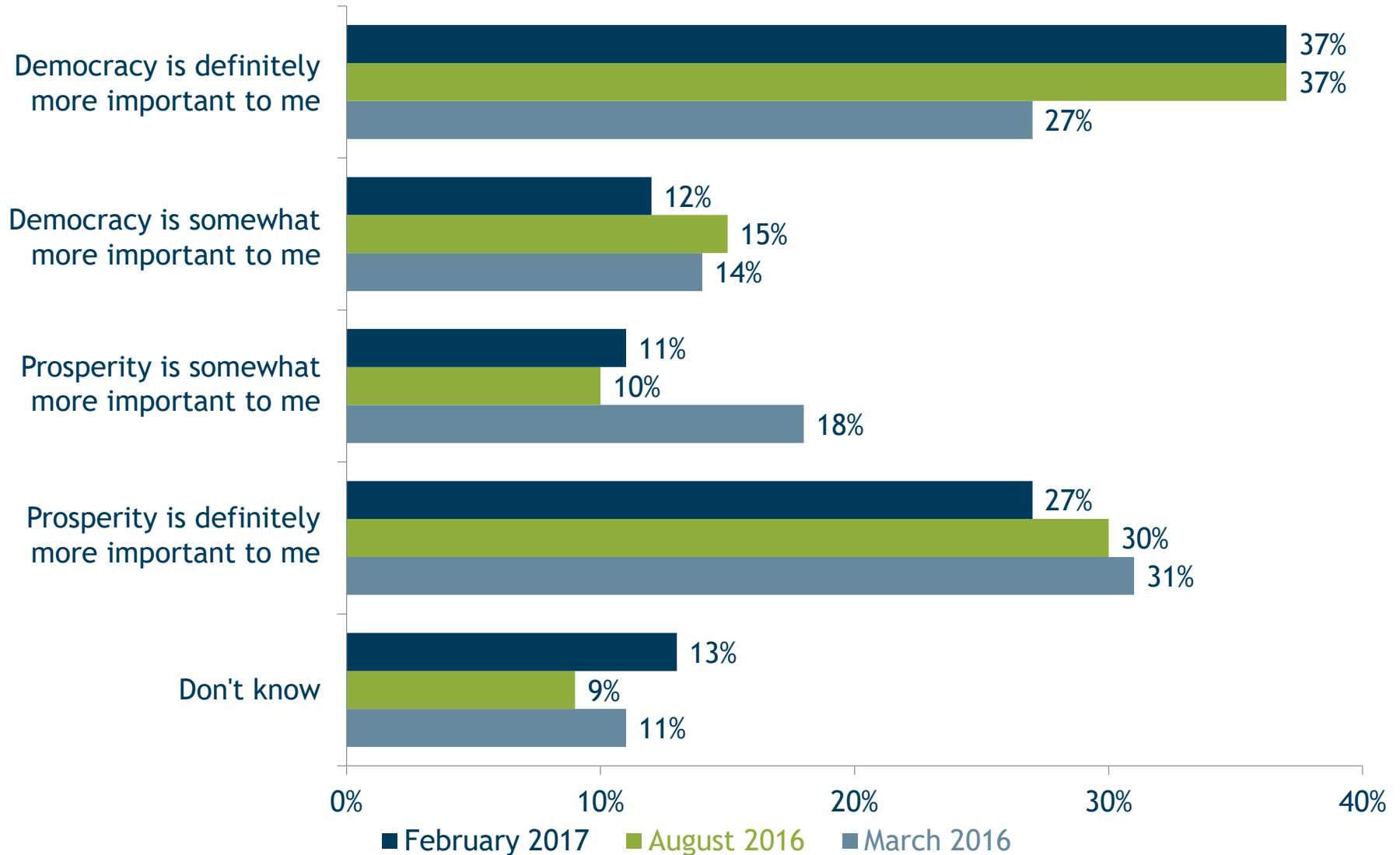
Has the economic situation of you or your family improved, worsened or remained the same in the past year?



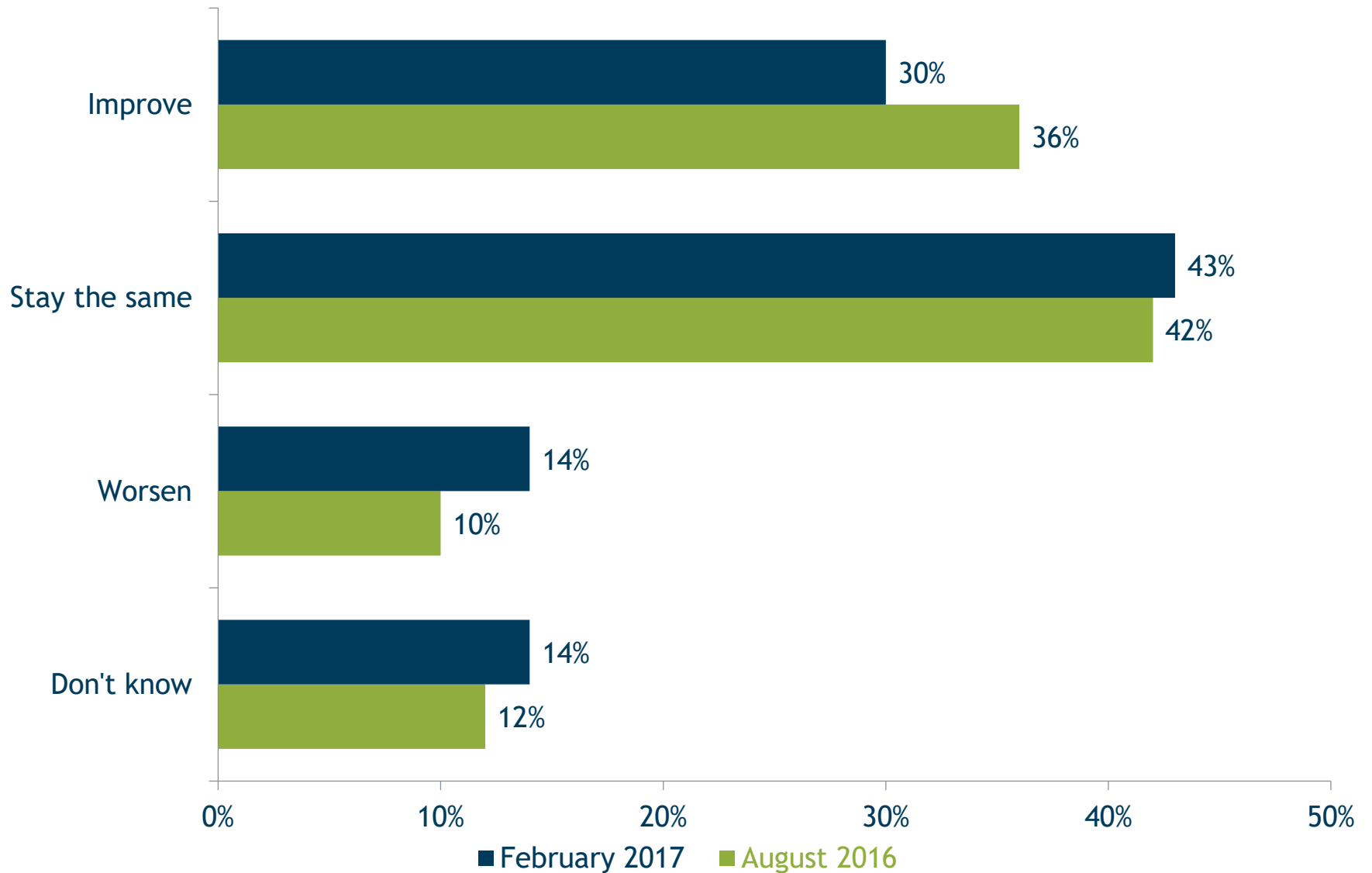
Do you expect the price of basic commodities such as milk, bread and meat to be higher or lower one year from now?



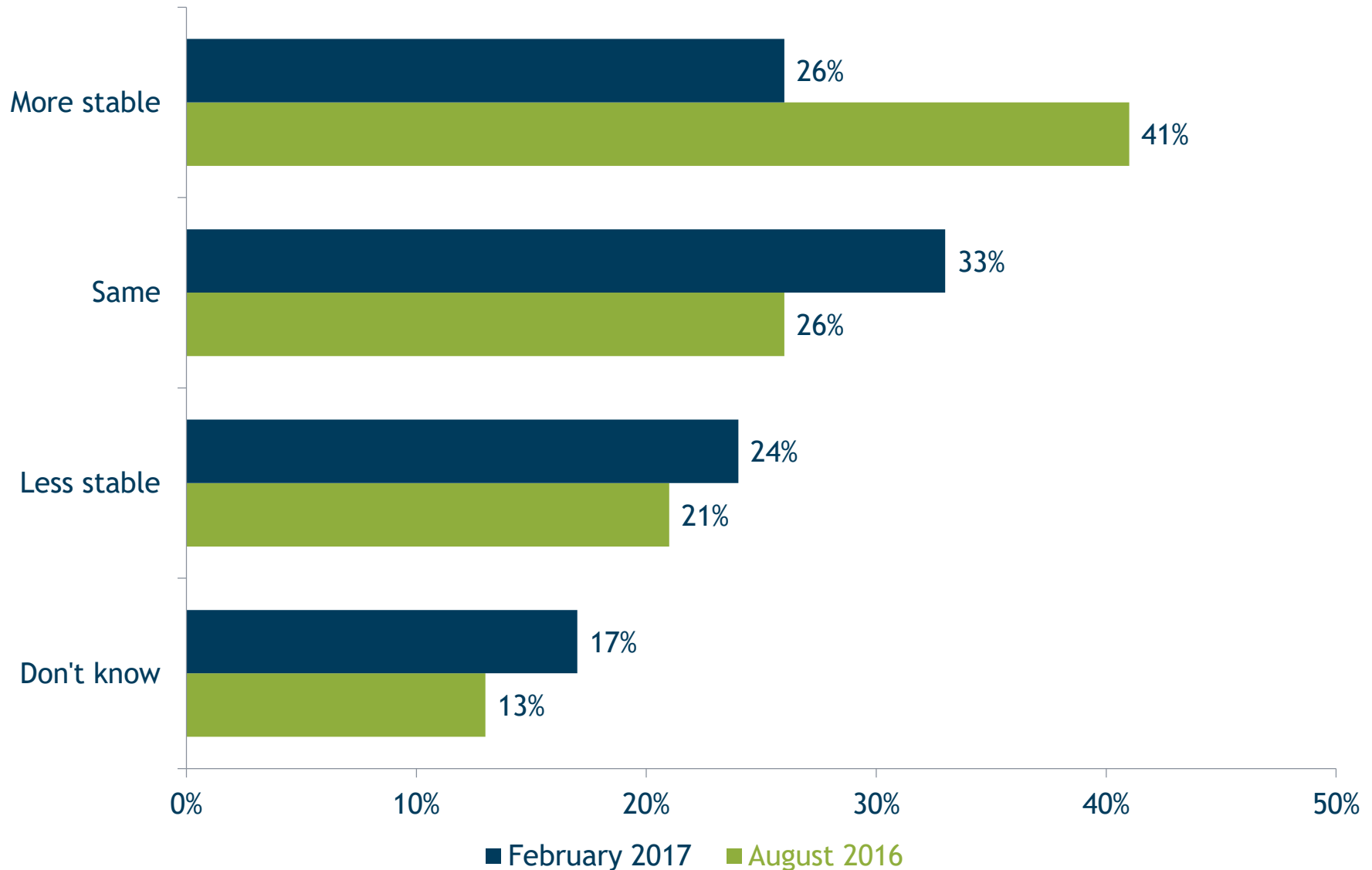
If you could have only one or the other, which is more important to you: a democratic system of government or a prosperous economy?

Do you expect the national government of Mongolia to be more stable, less stable or remain the same for the next year?

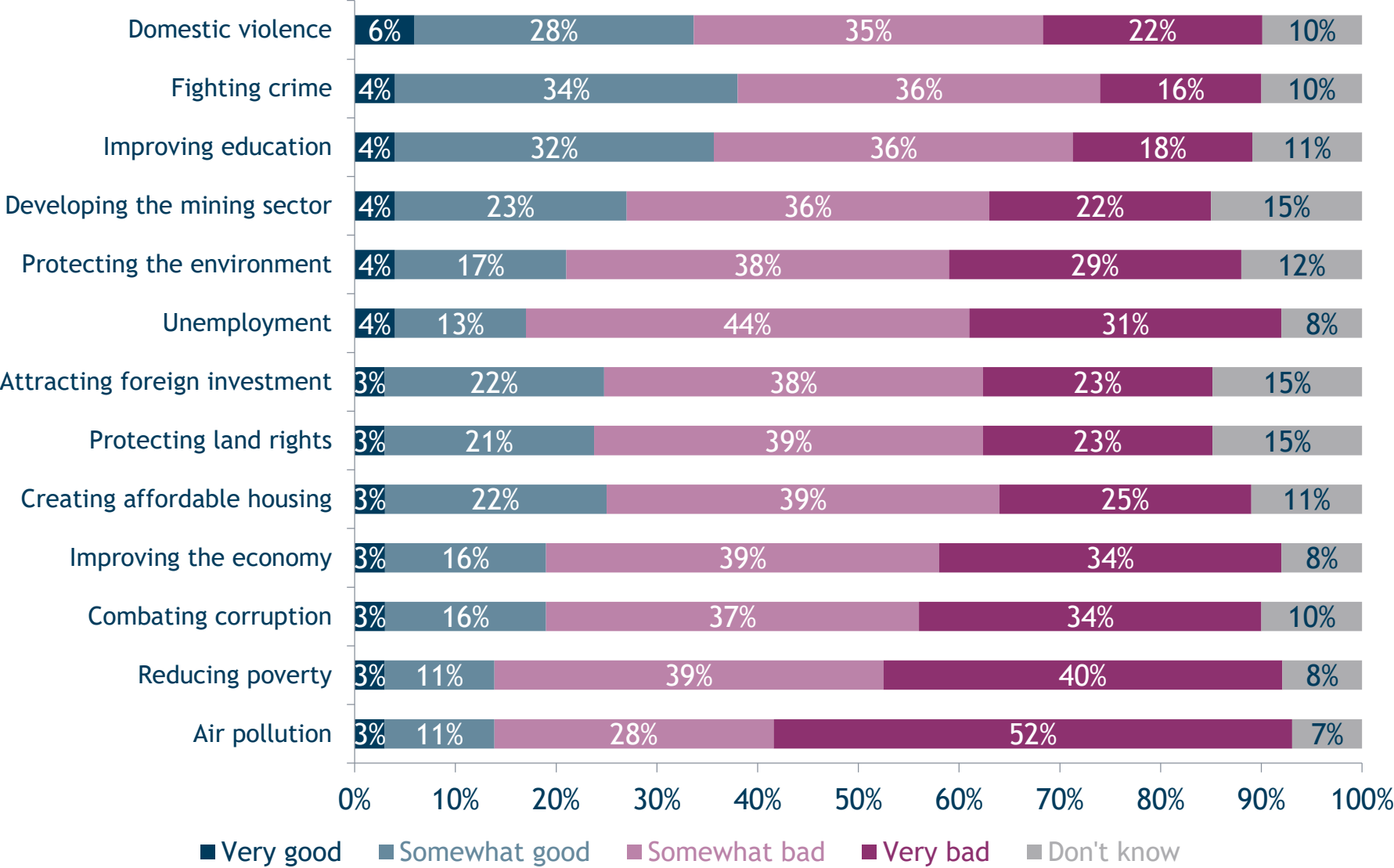




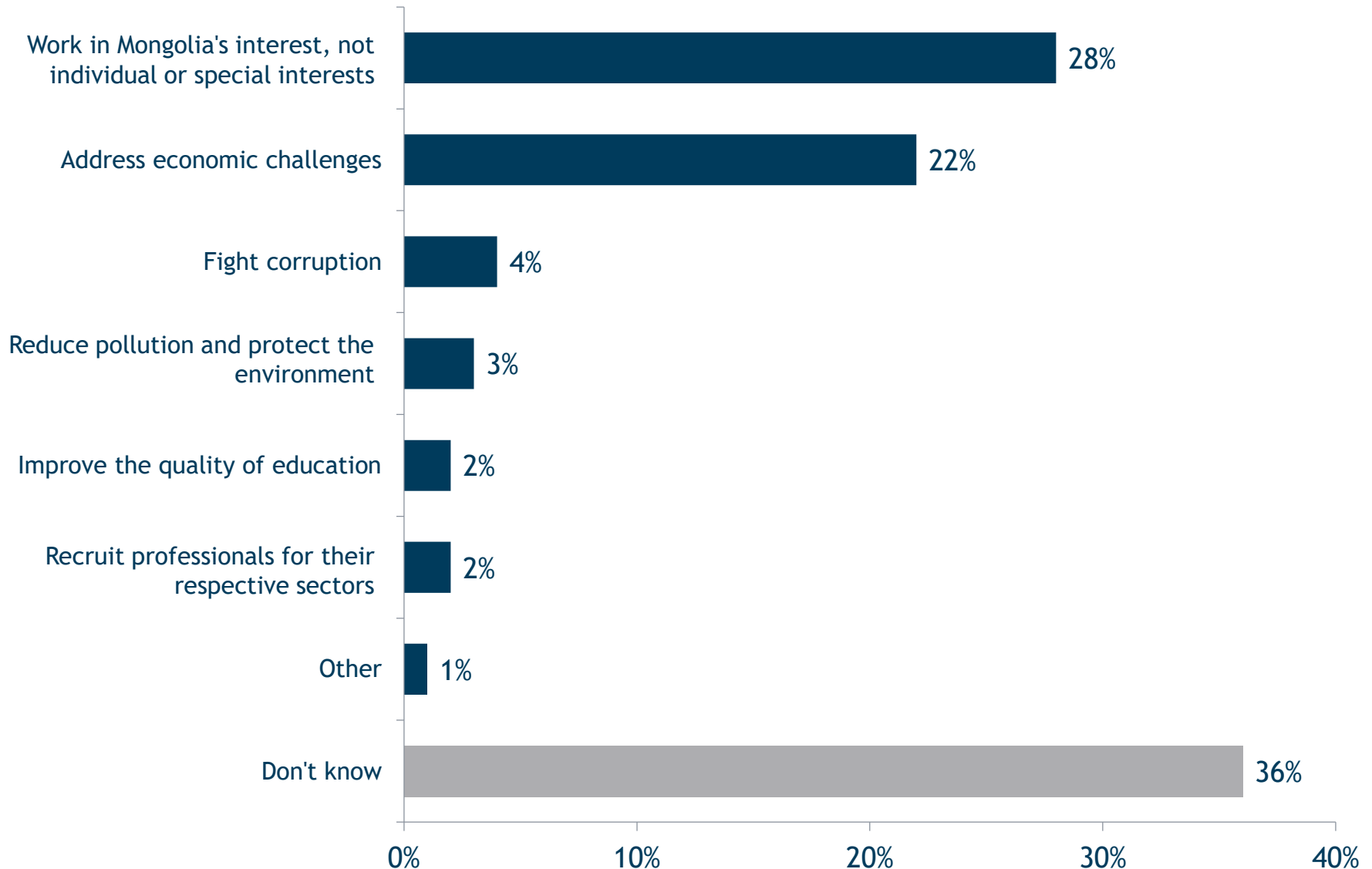

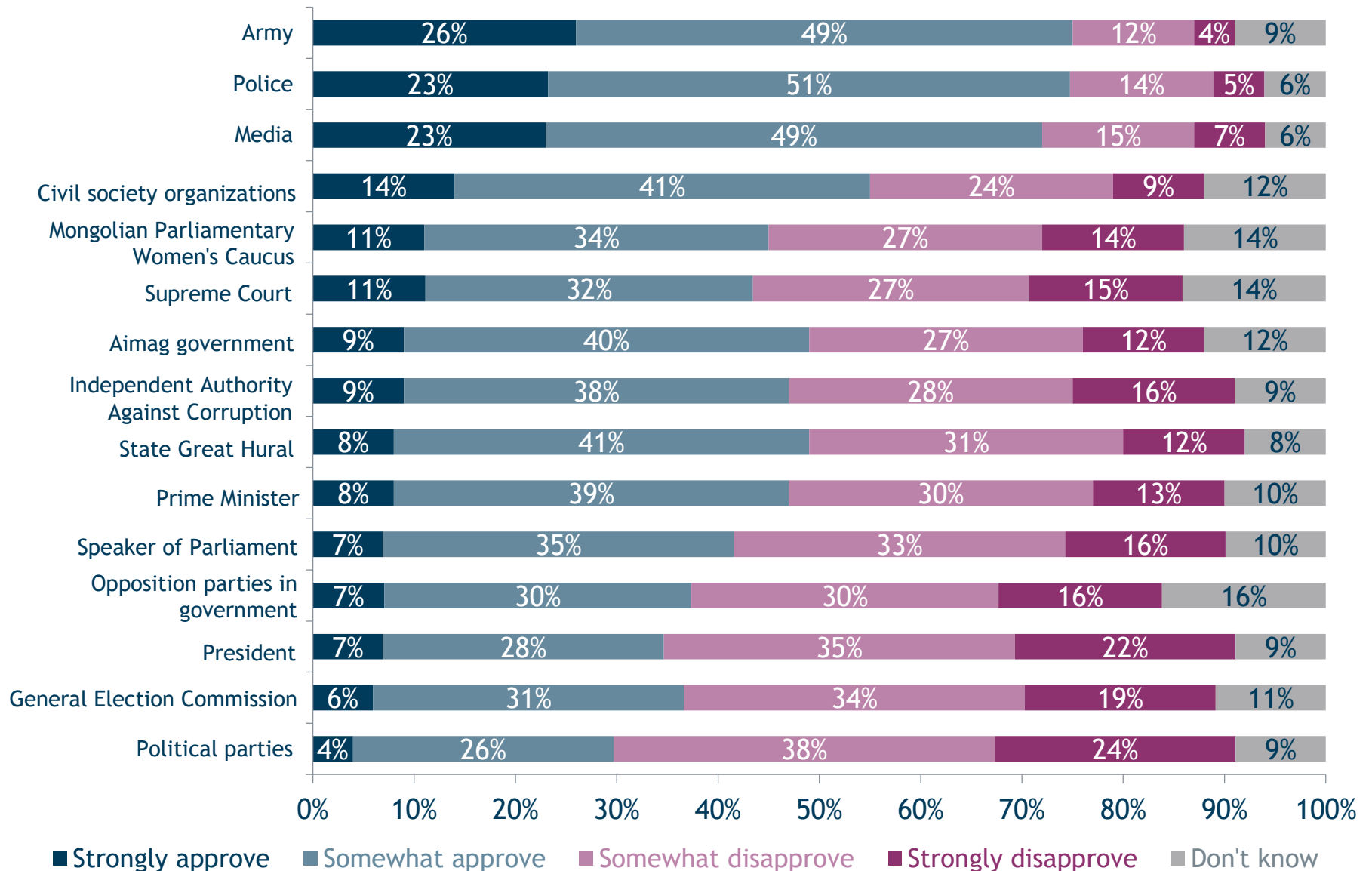
Since Parliament's autumn session began, would you say the government has done a very good, somewhat good, somewhat bad or very bad job of addressing the following issues:

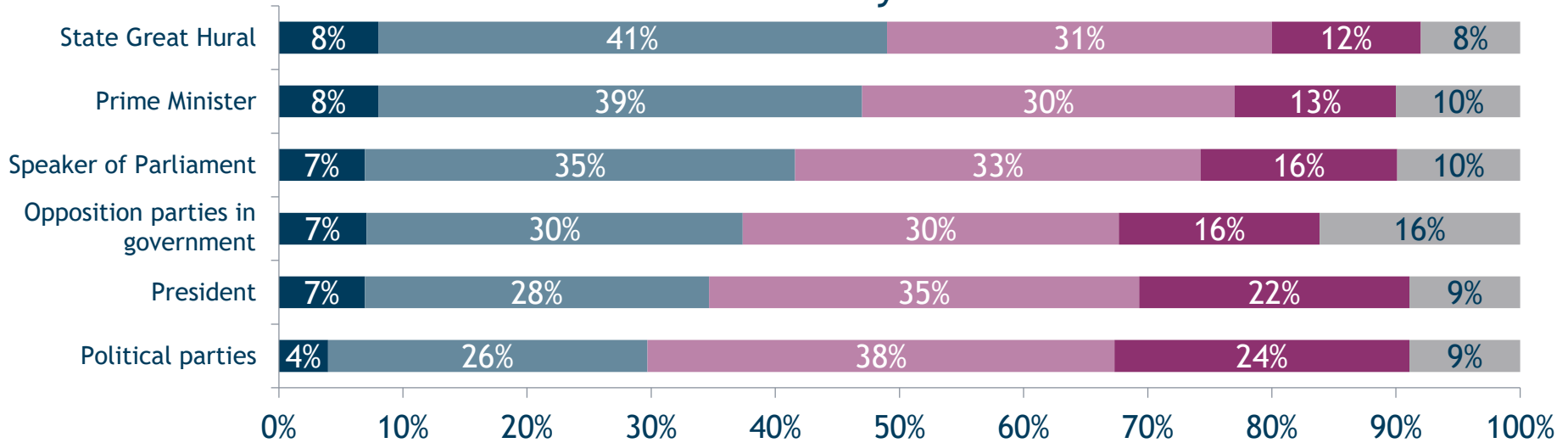


Do you approve or disapprove of the performance of the following institutions?

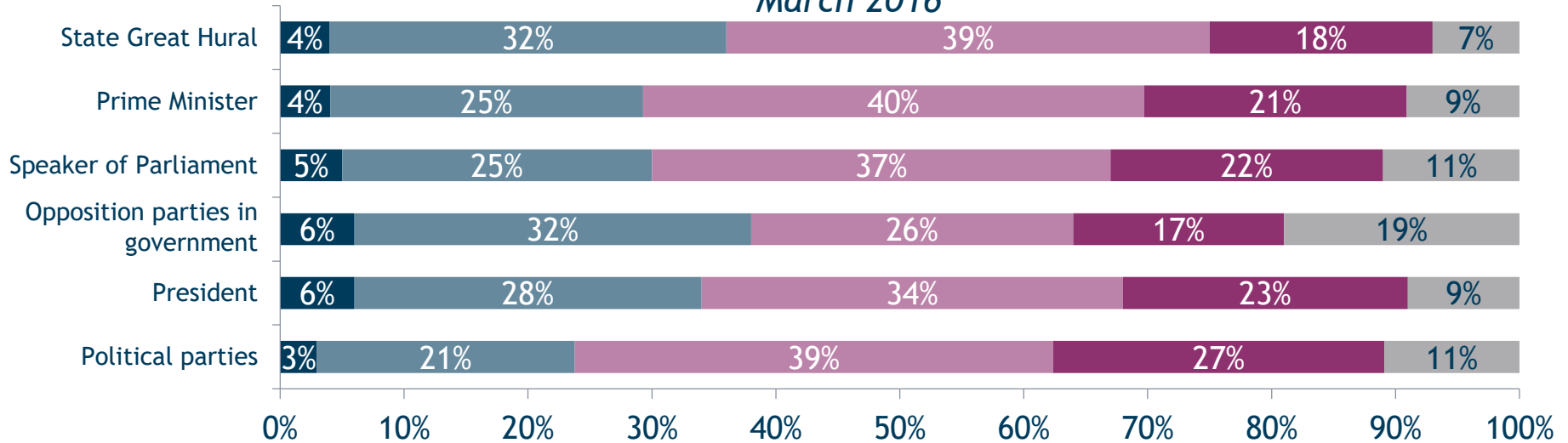


Do you approve or disapprove of the performance of the following institutions?

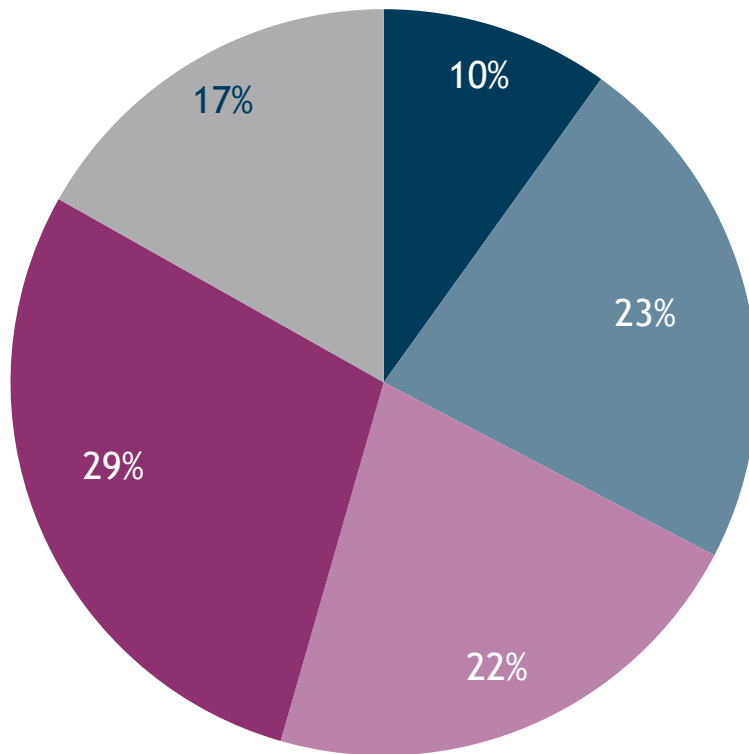

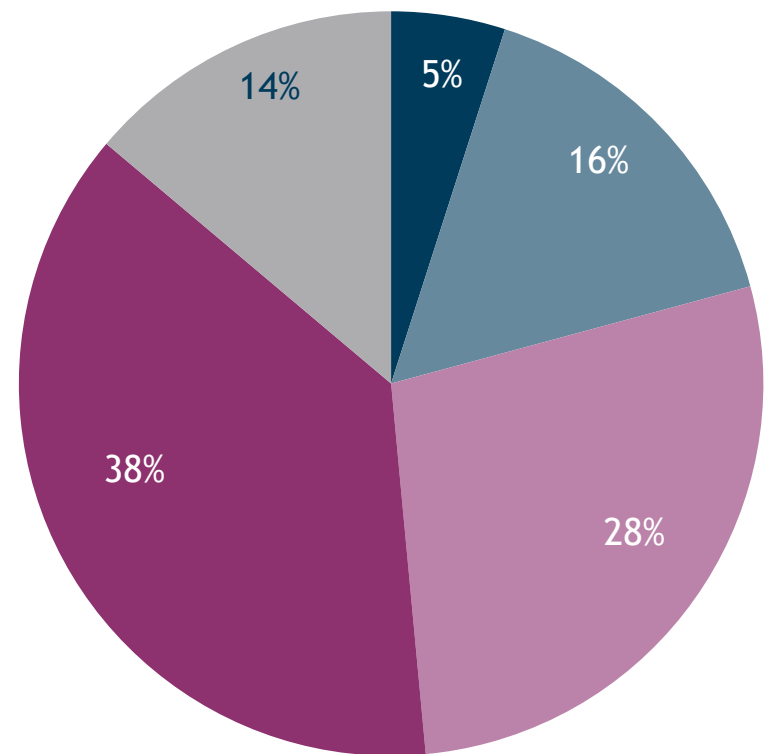
Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?

“It is easy to have my voice heard by my elected government representatives.”



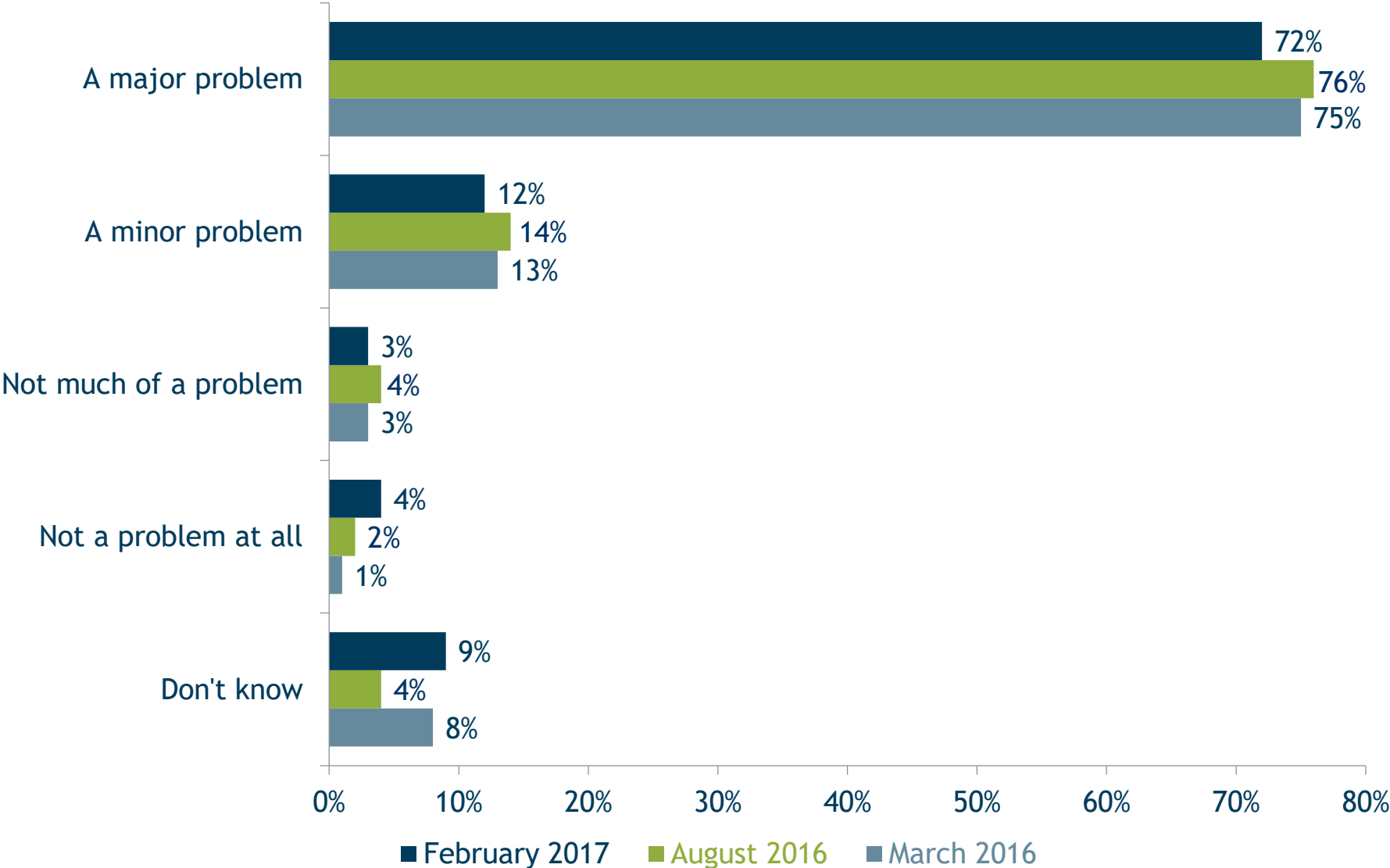

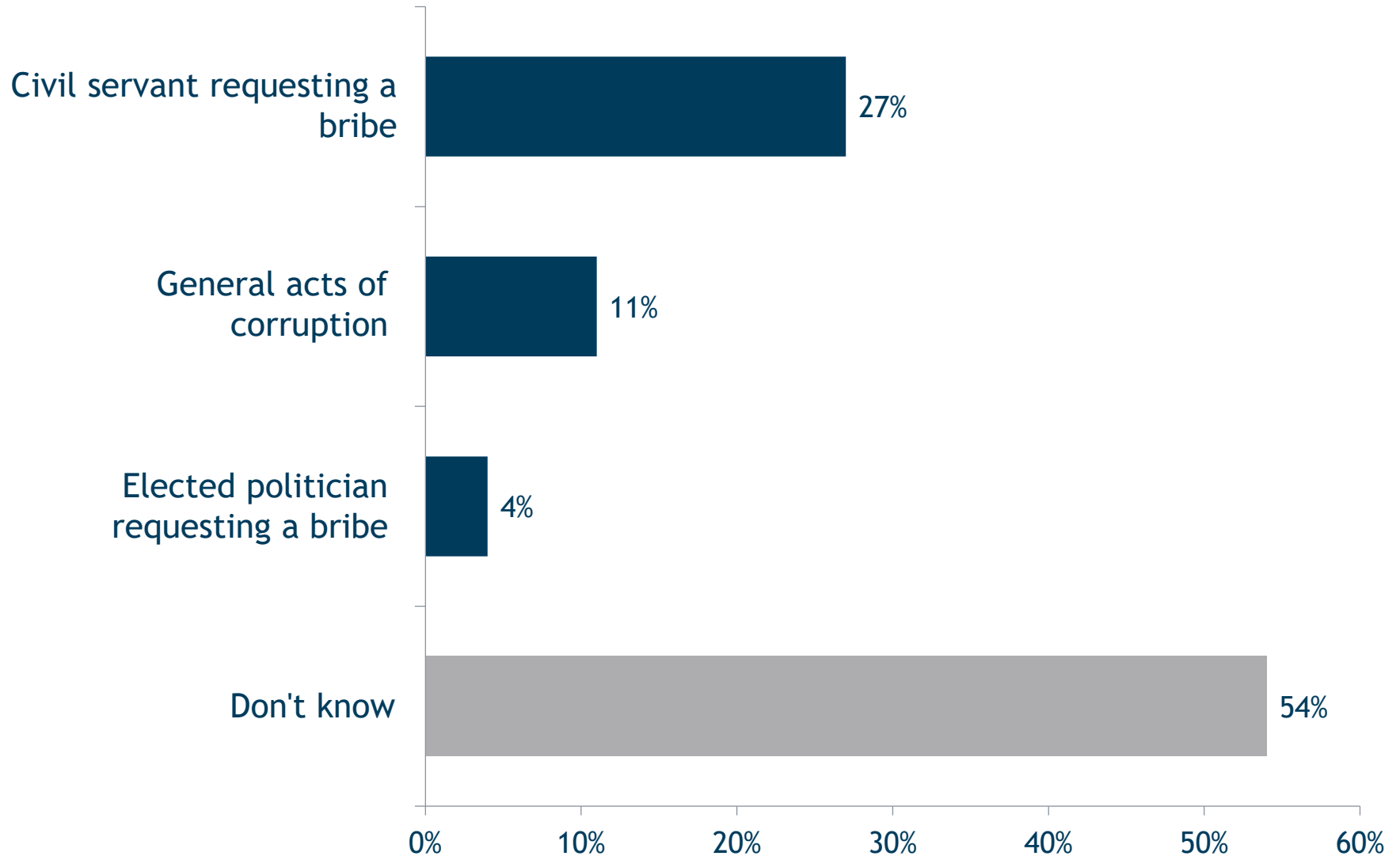


Do you believe that corruption is a major problem, a minor problem, not much of a problem or not a problem at all?

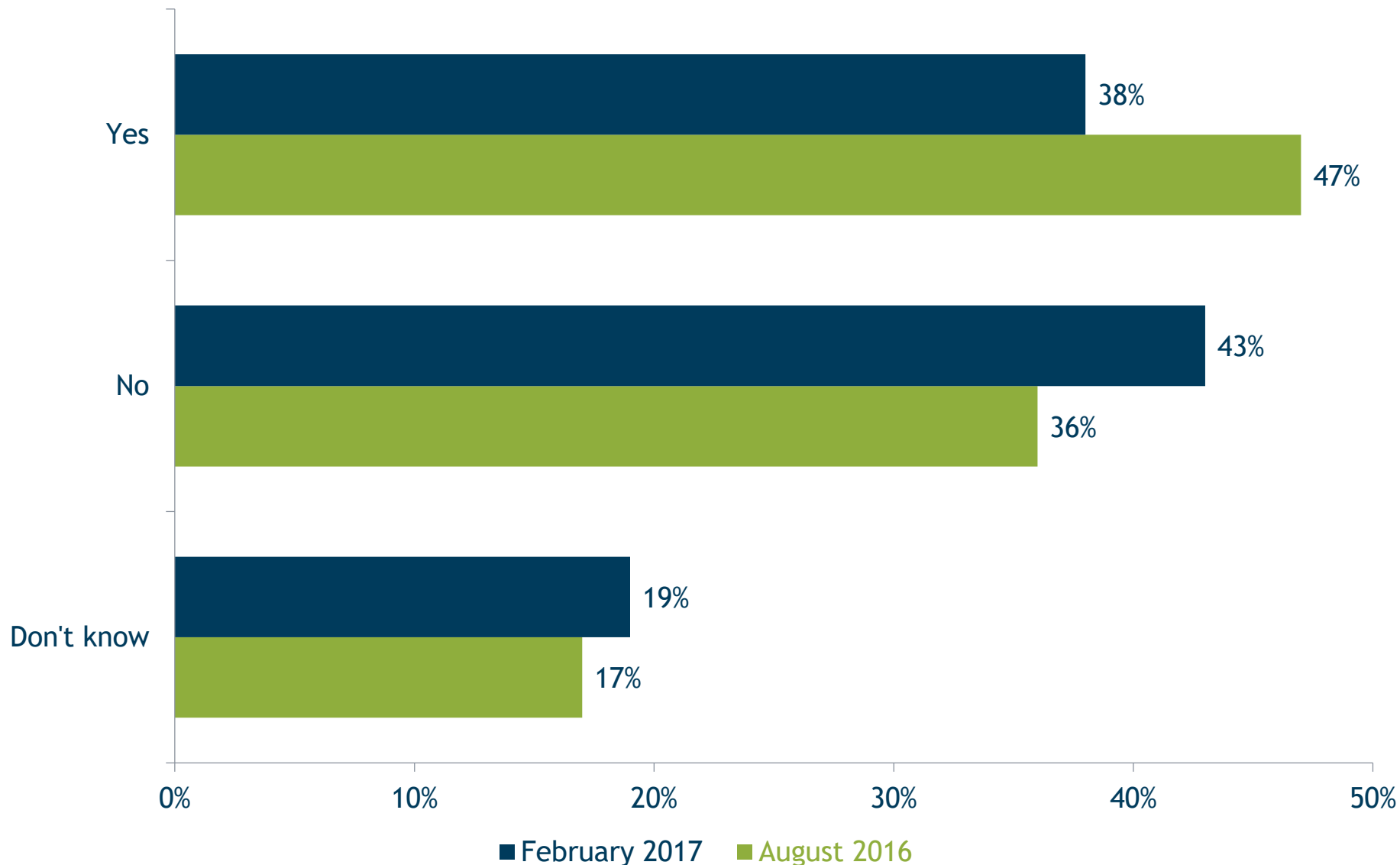




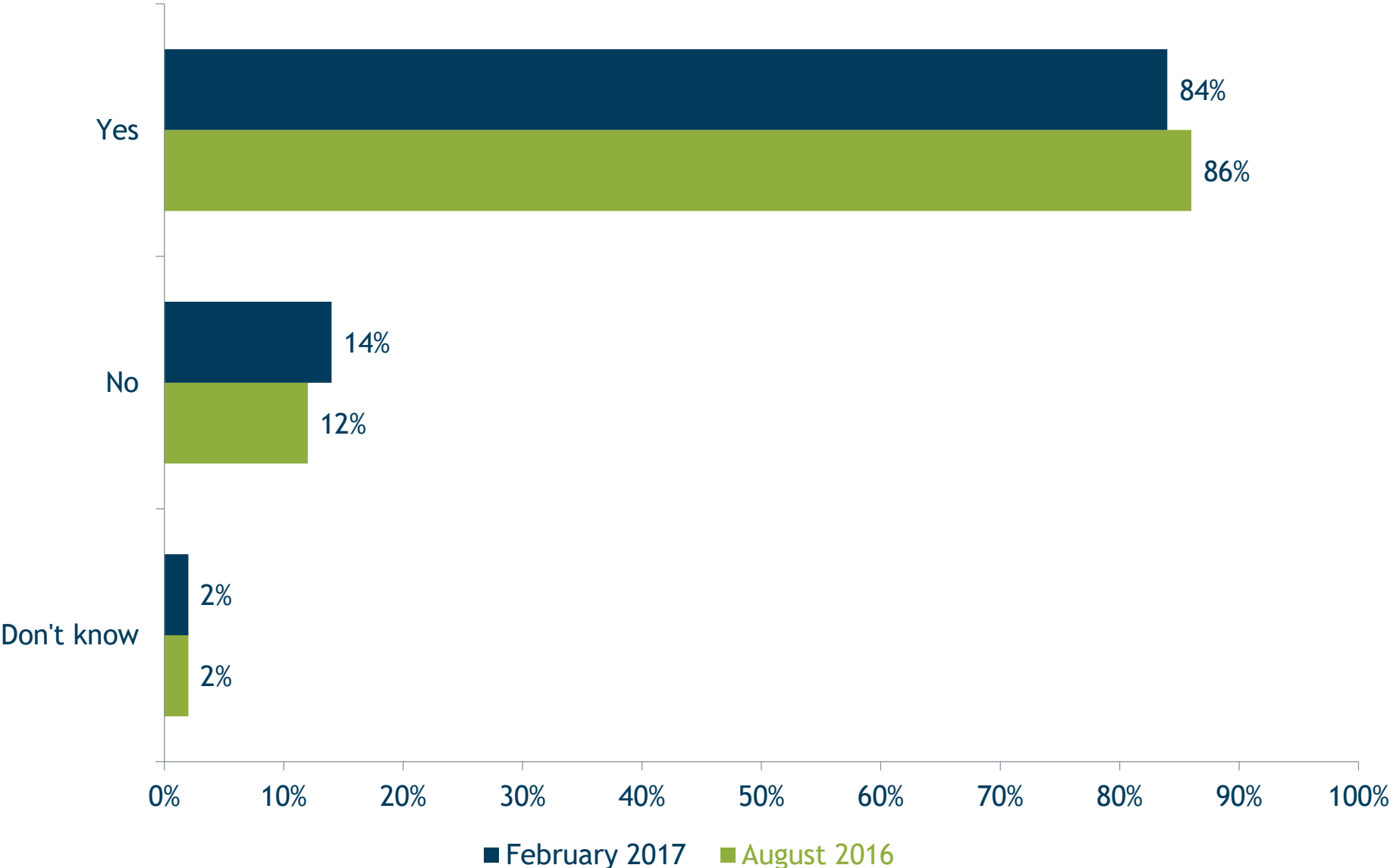
Voting and Elections

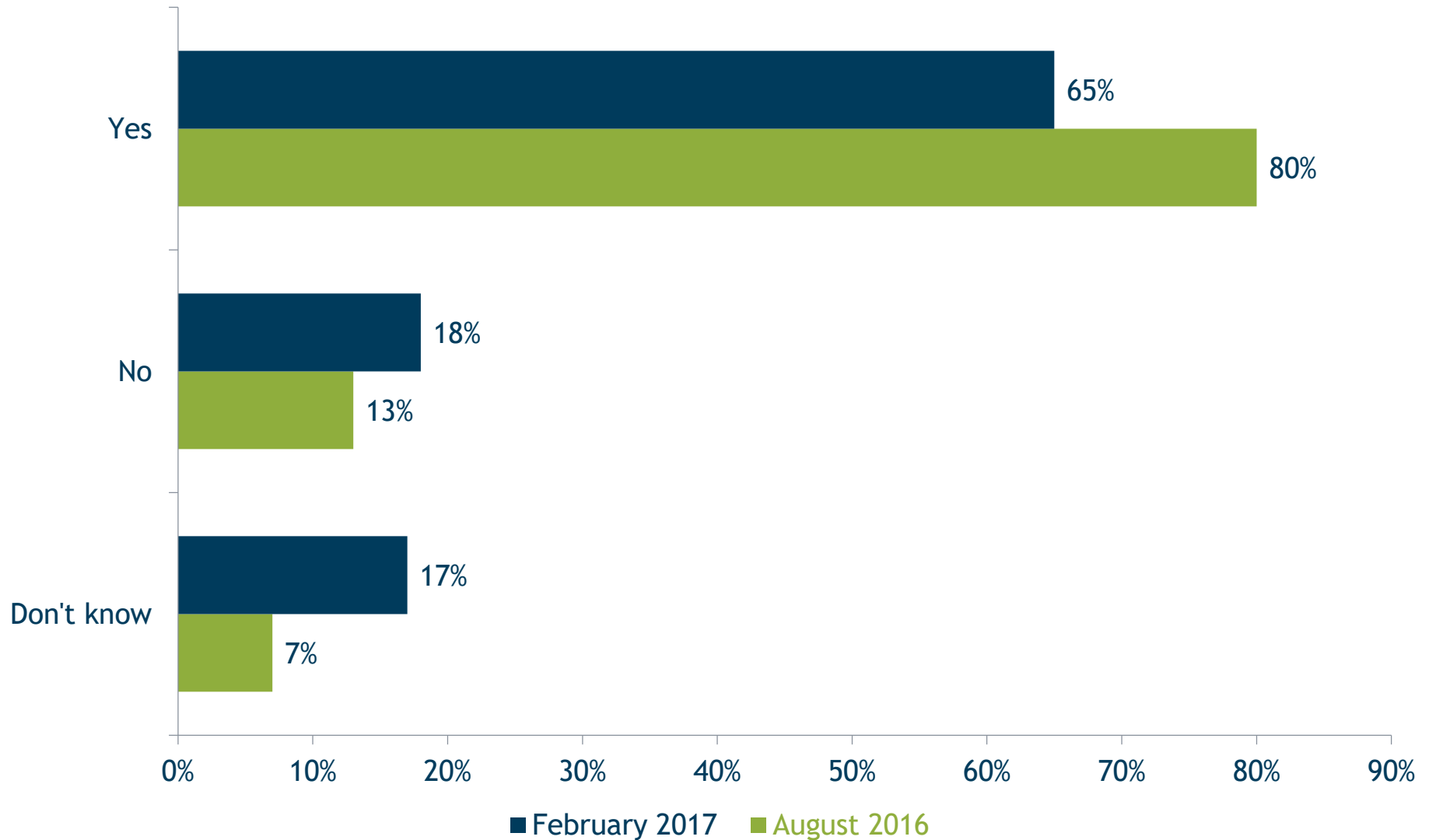


Did you vote in the 2016 parliamentary elections?

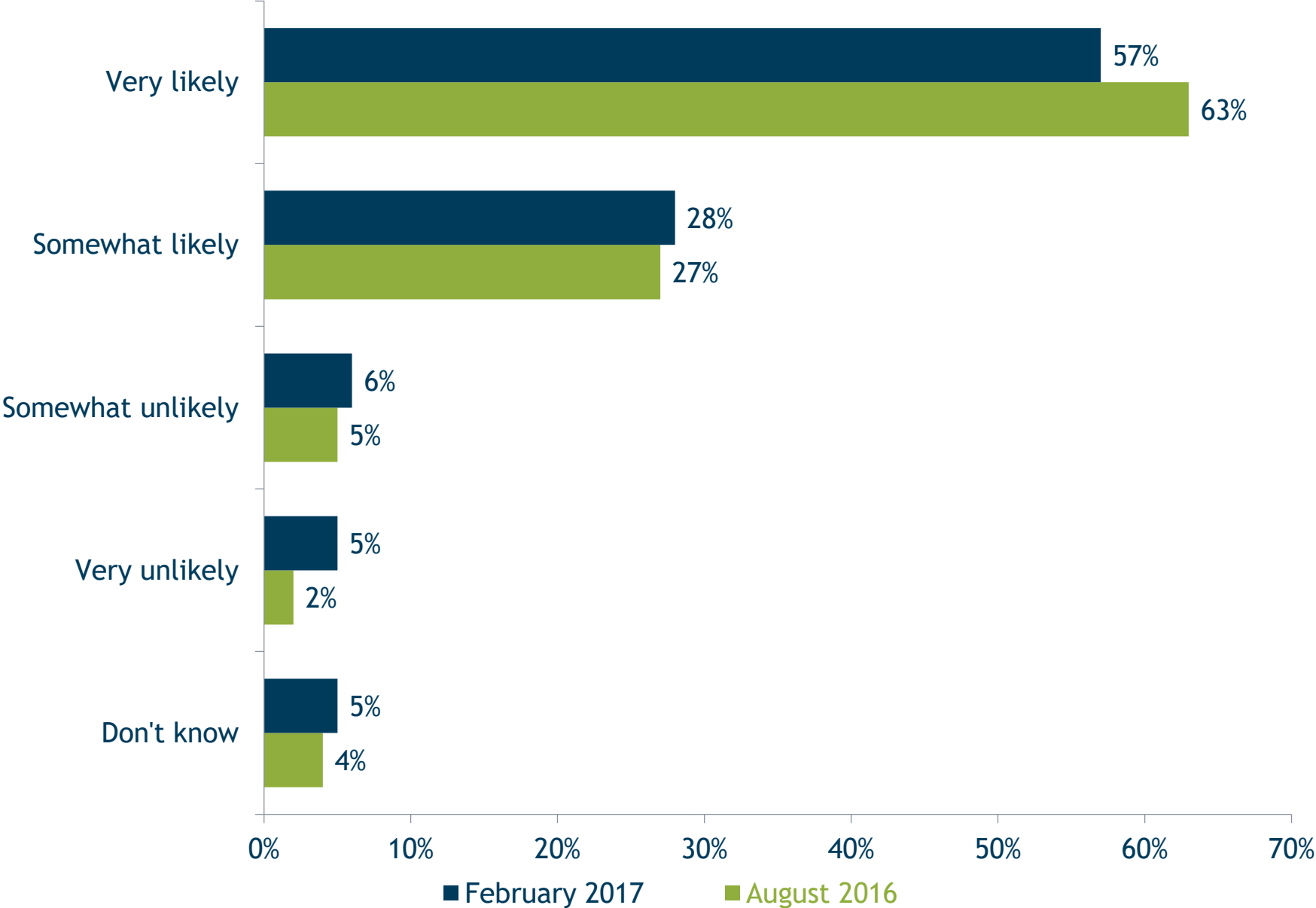


If the parliamentary elections were held today, would you vote the same way that you voted on June 29, 2016?

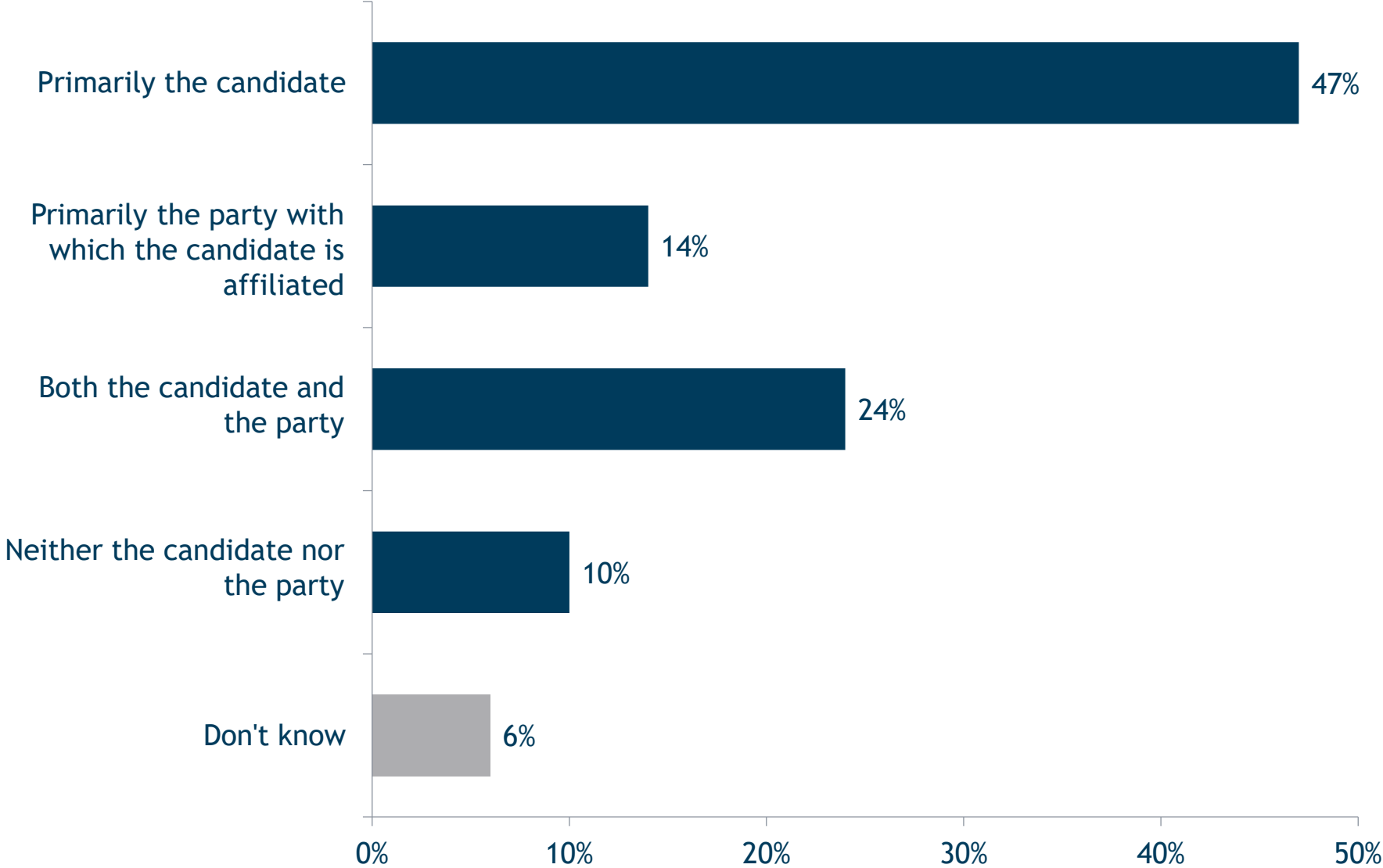


How likely, if at all, are you to vote in the presidential election in 2017?

(Respondents who intend to vote in the 2017 election: n=4,765)

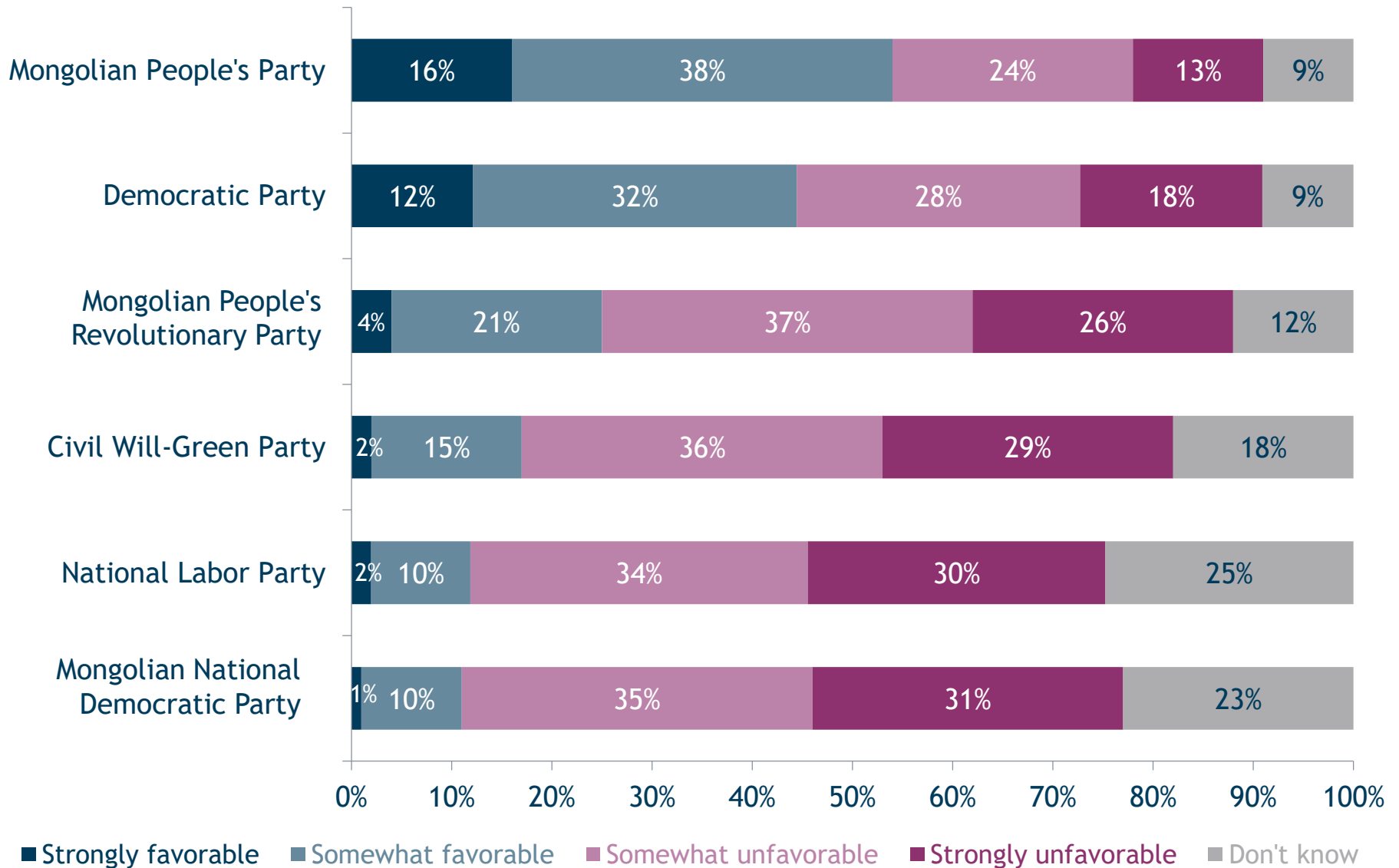




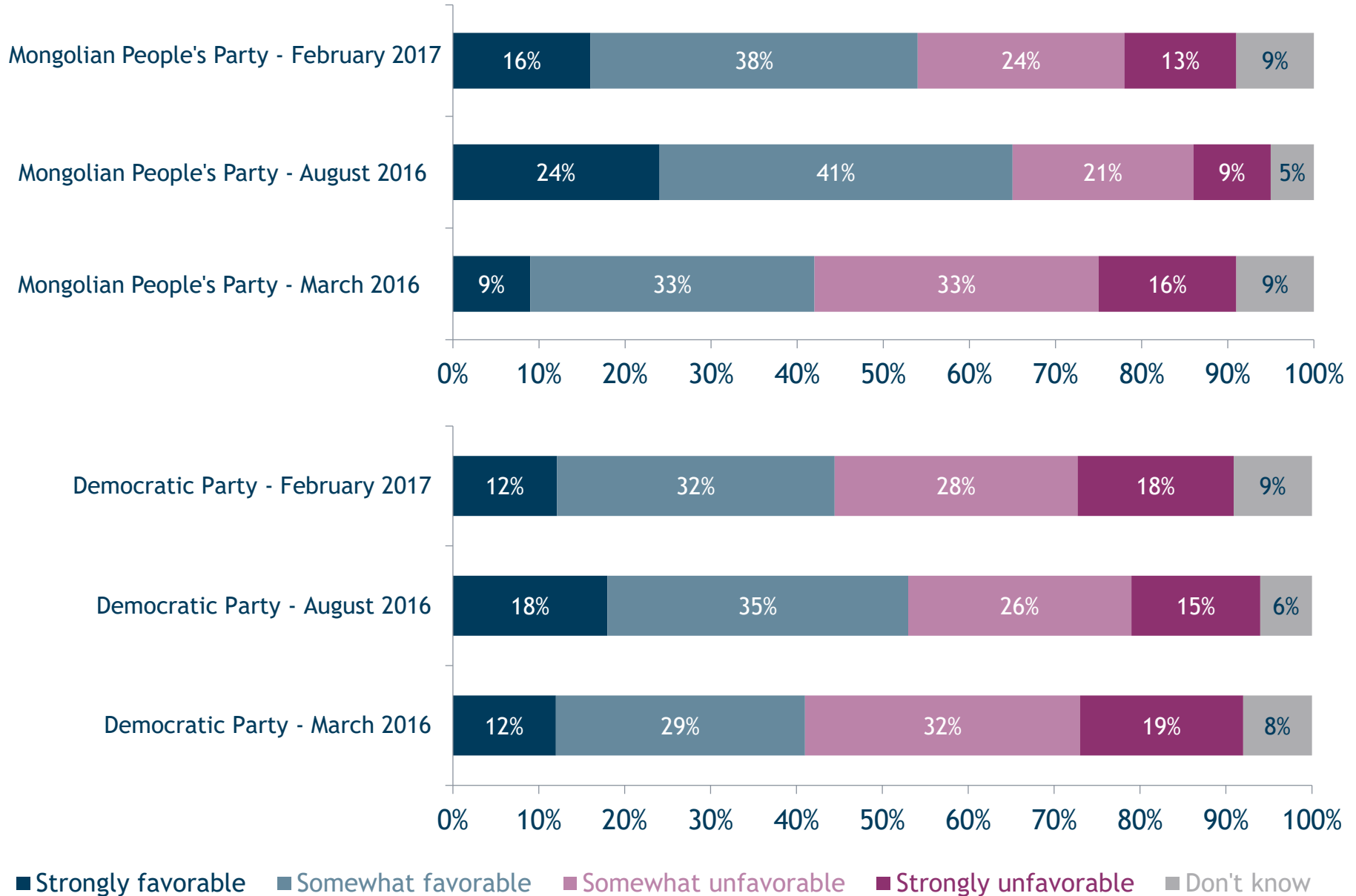

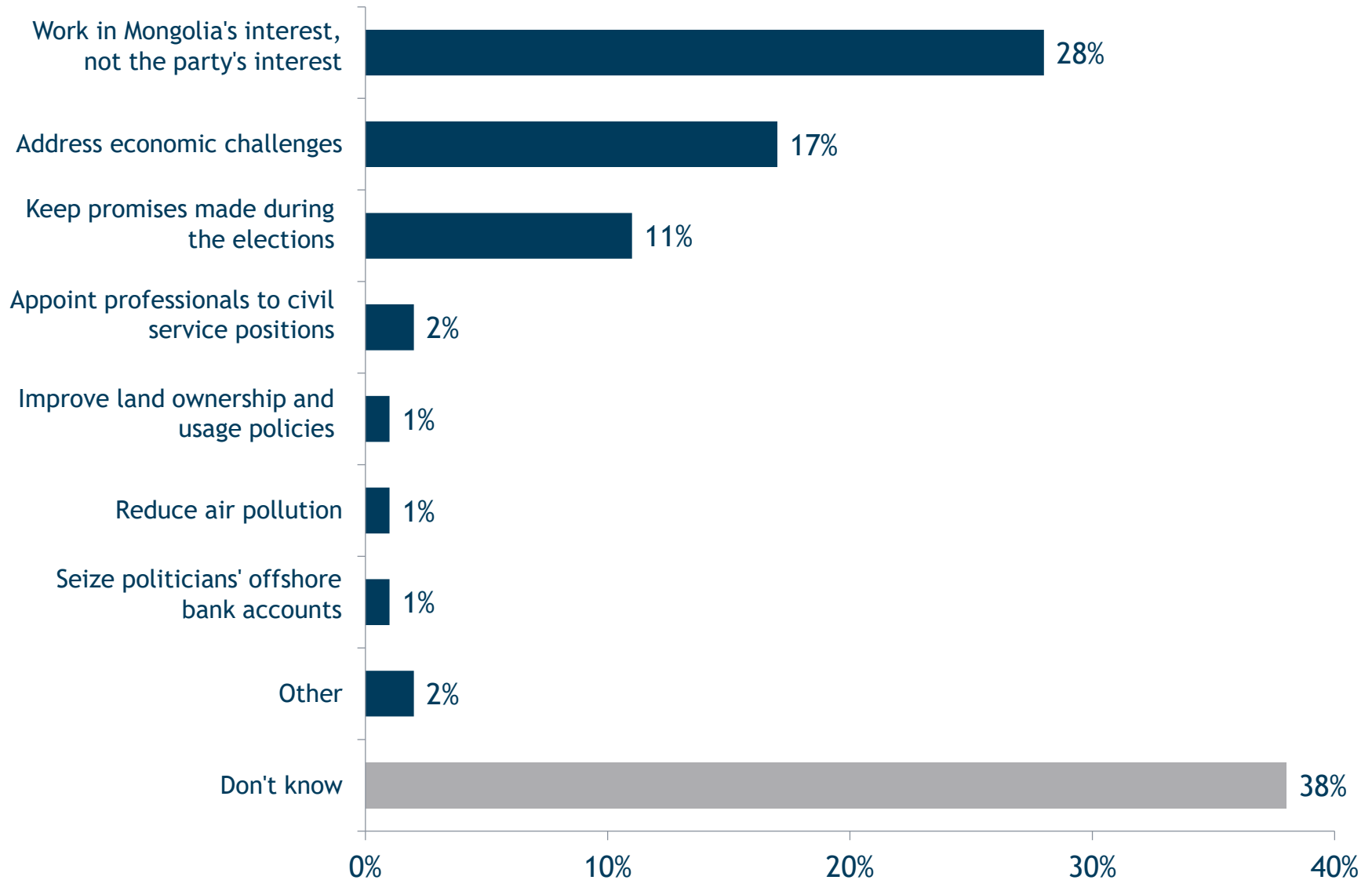
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the following political parties?

If you could give one piece of advice to the leaders of the various political parties, what would it be? (open-ended)

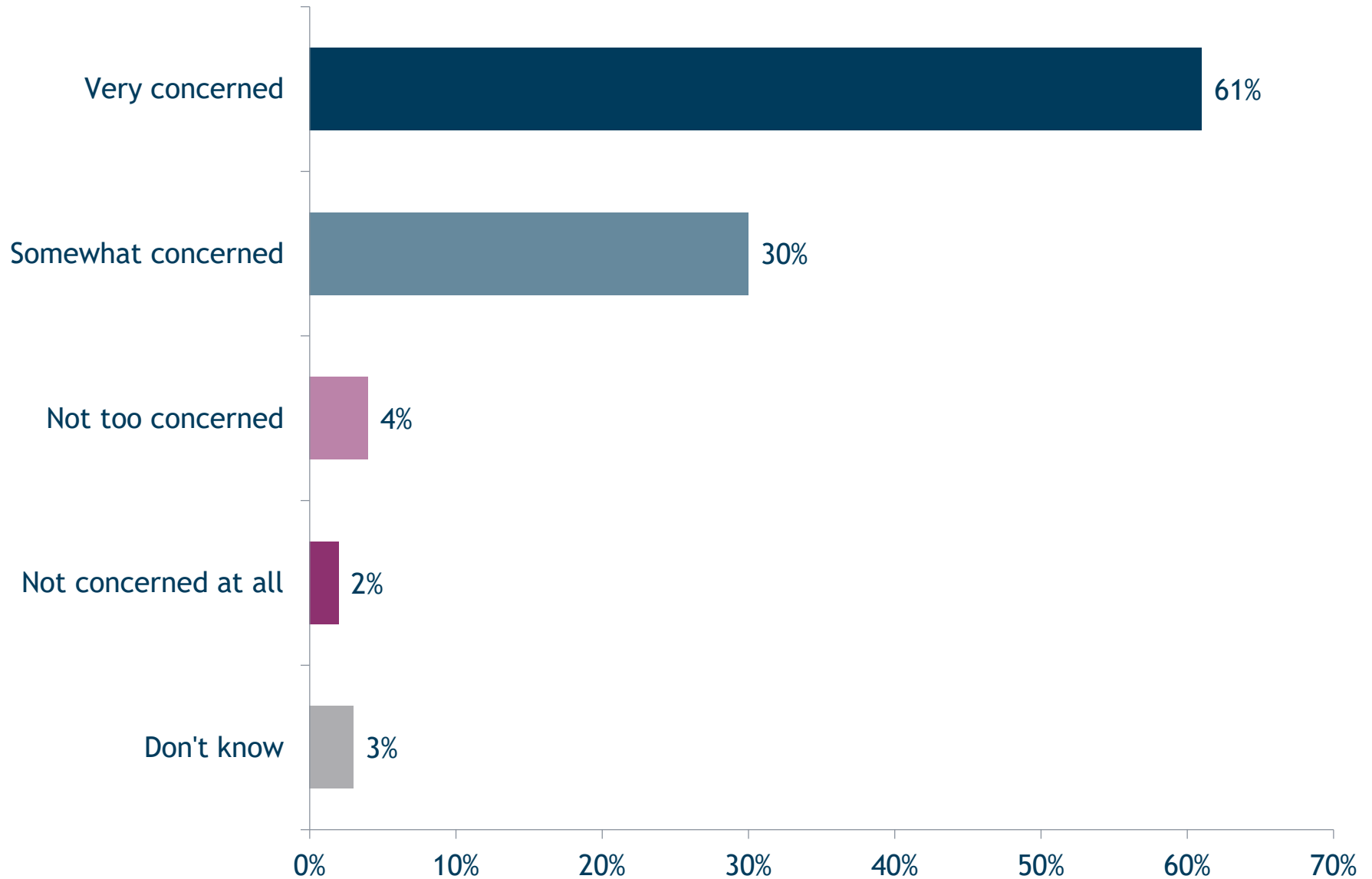




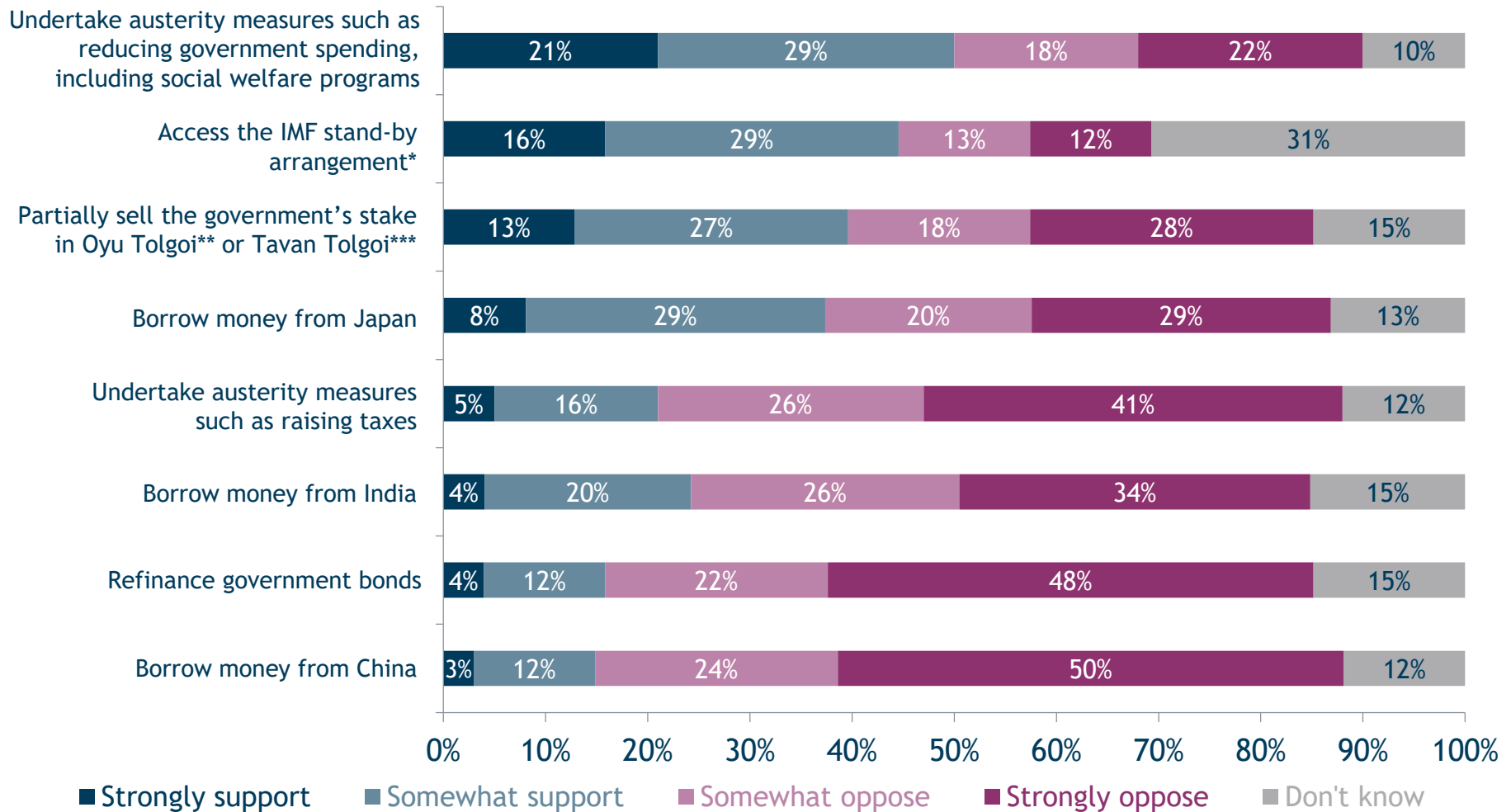

The following measures have been suggested as ways to reduce Mongolia's national debt. Do you support or oppose these measures?

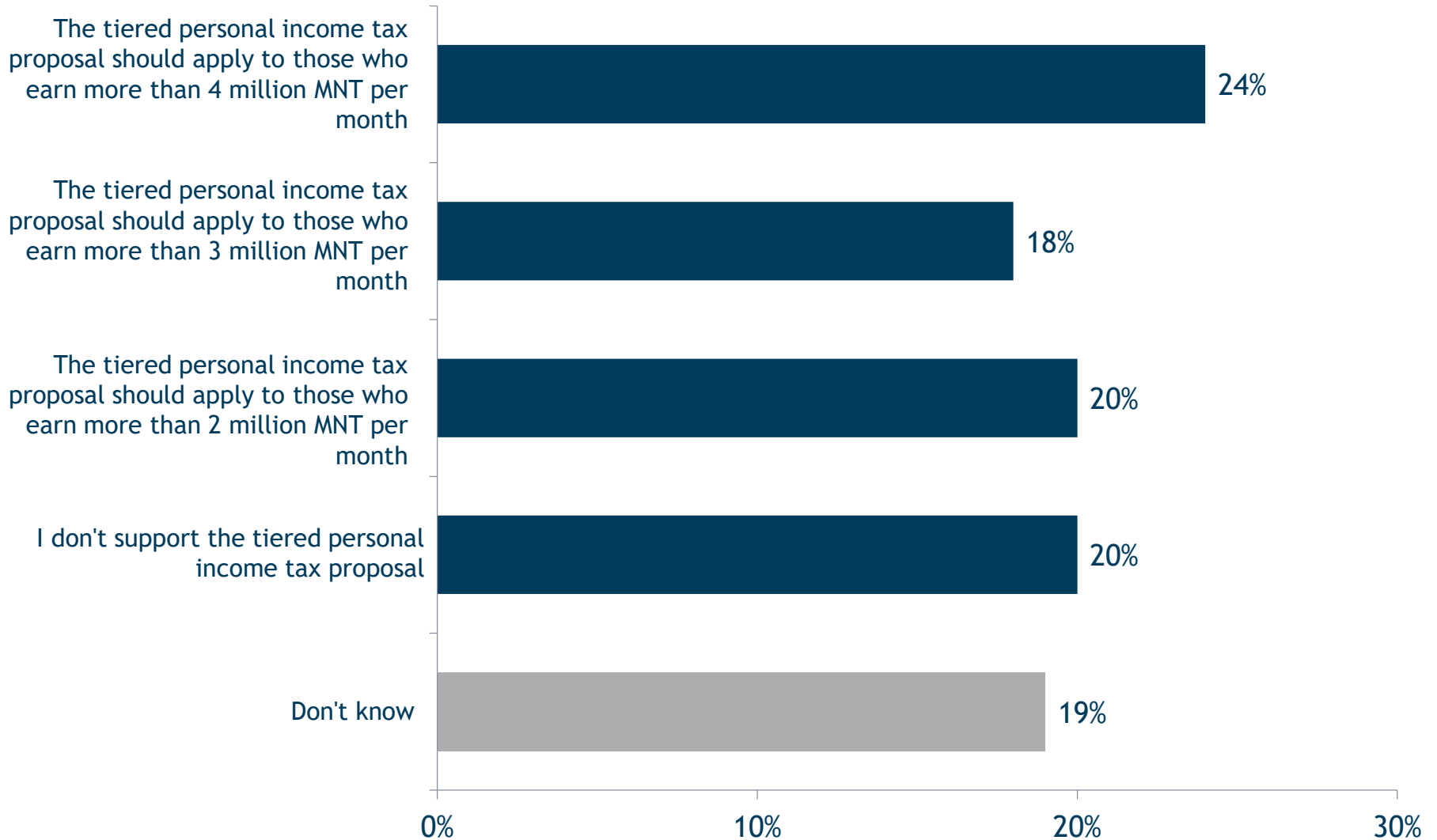

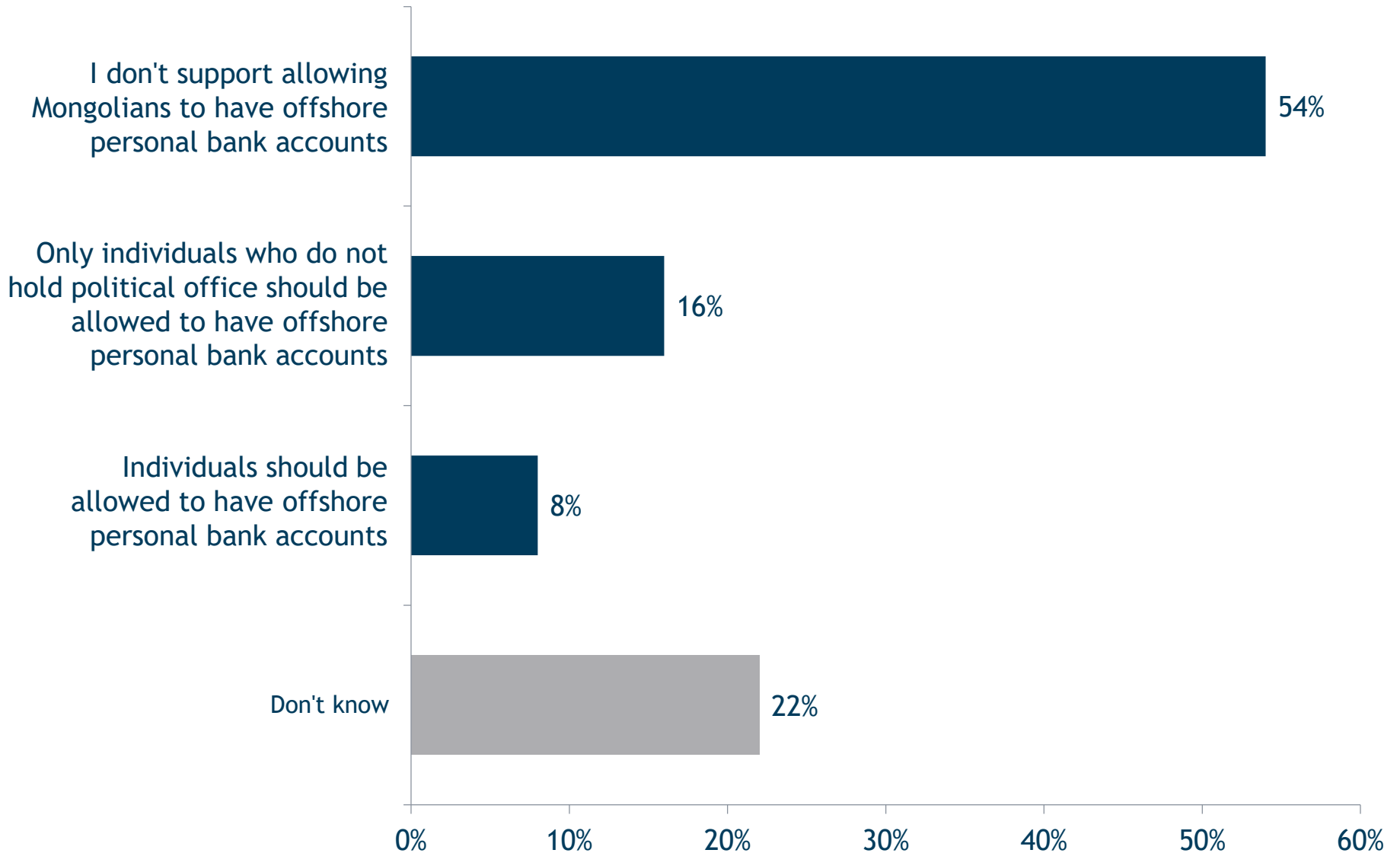

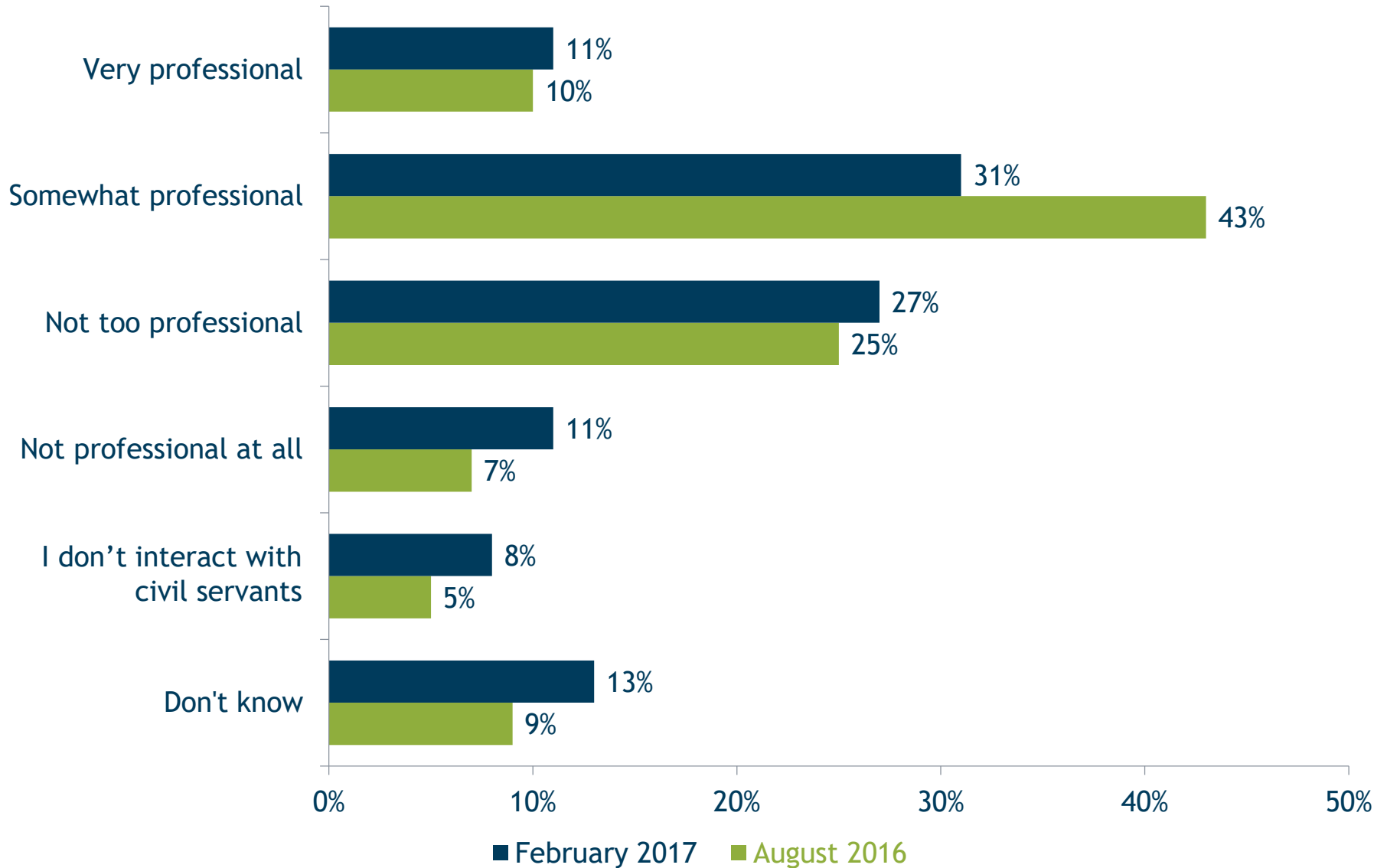
The State Great Hural has introduced a proposal to create a tiered personal income tax system imposing higher taxes on upper income brackets. What is your view of this system?



Which of the following statements is closest to your personal opinion?

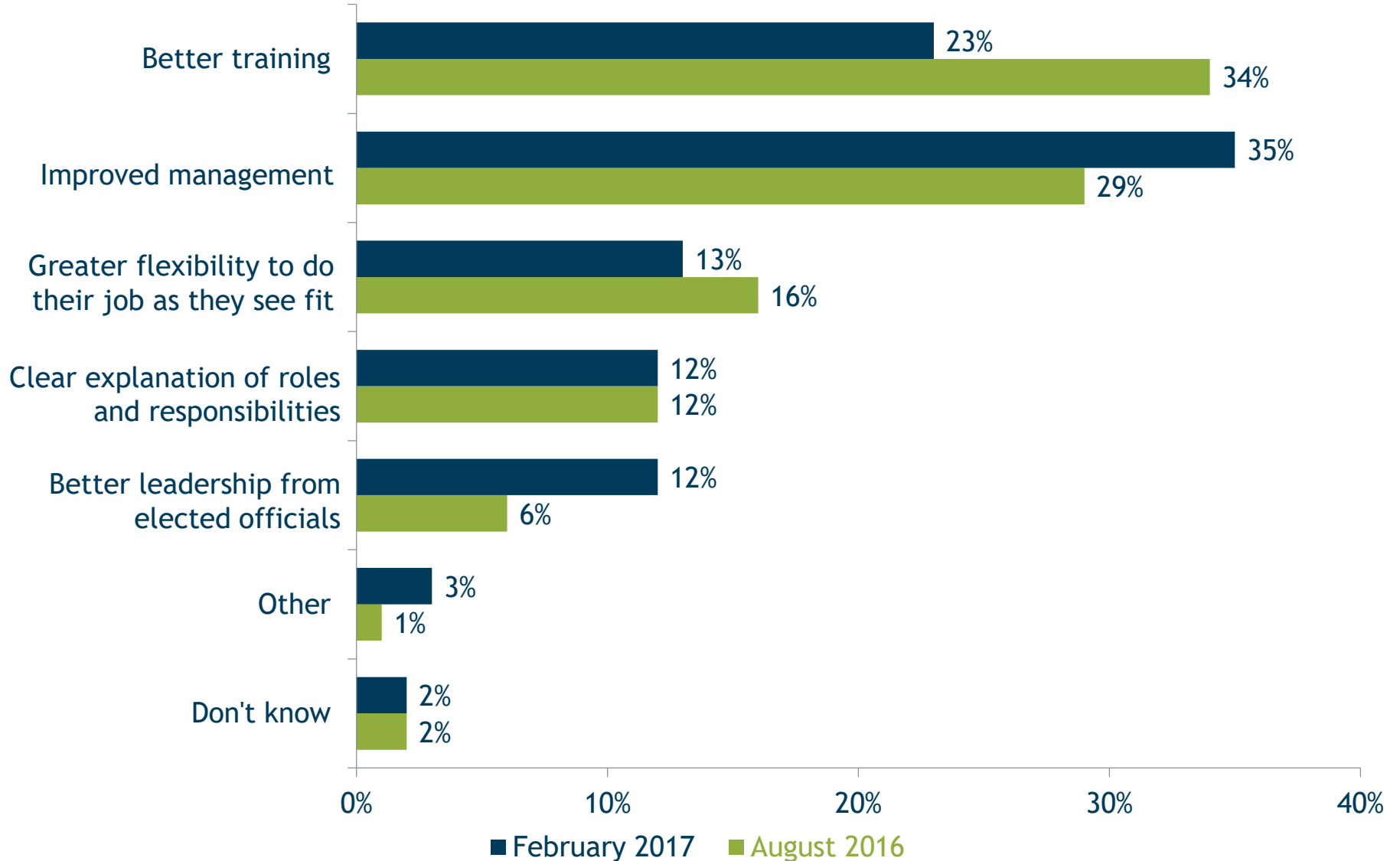


How professional are civil servants (i.e. non-elected government employees)?

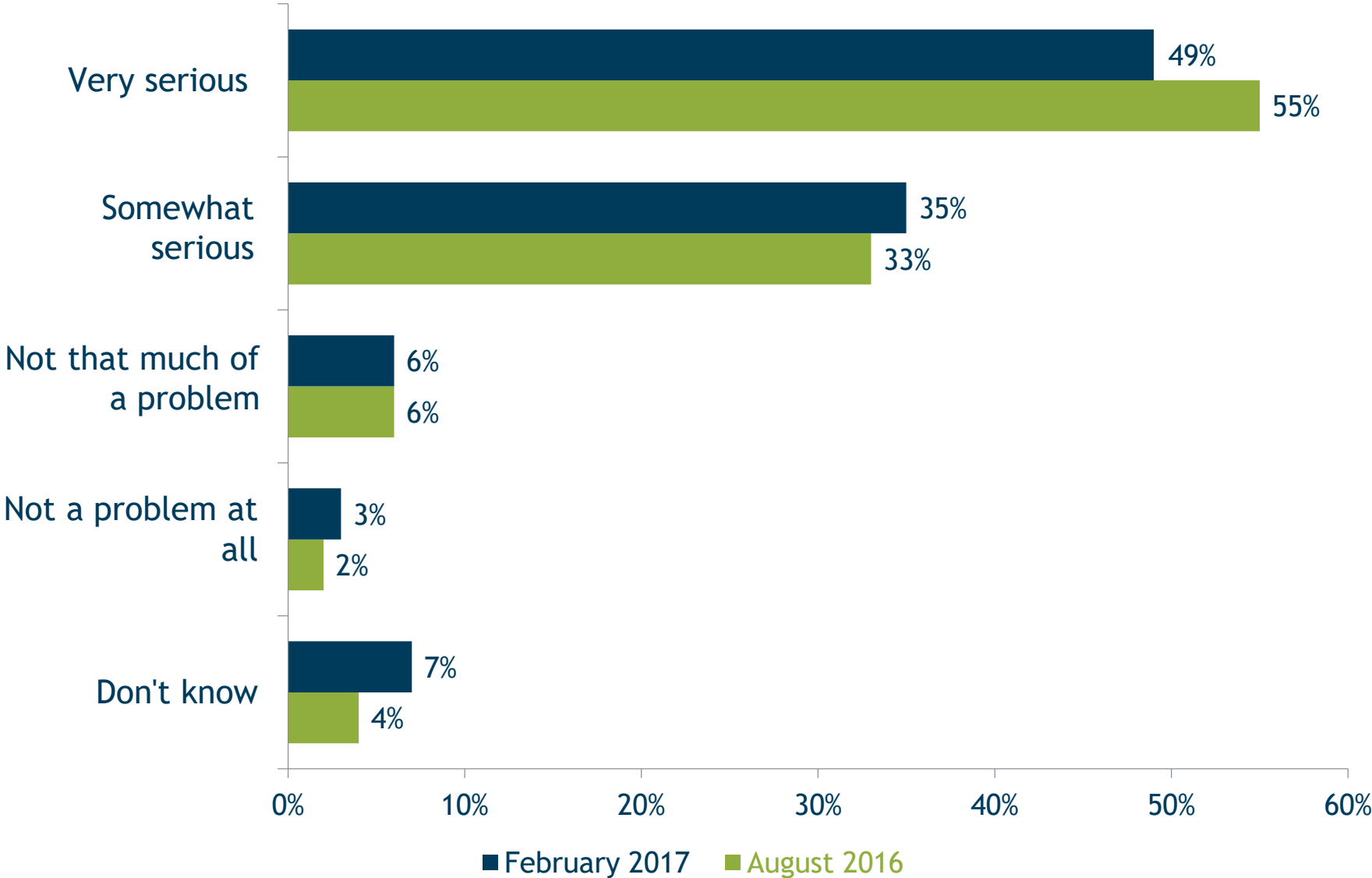


Which of the following measures do you believe would improve the level of professionalism among civil servants?

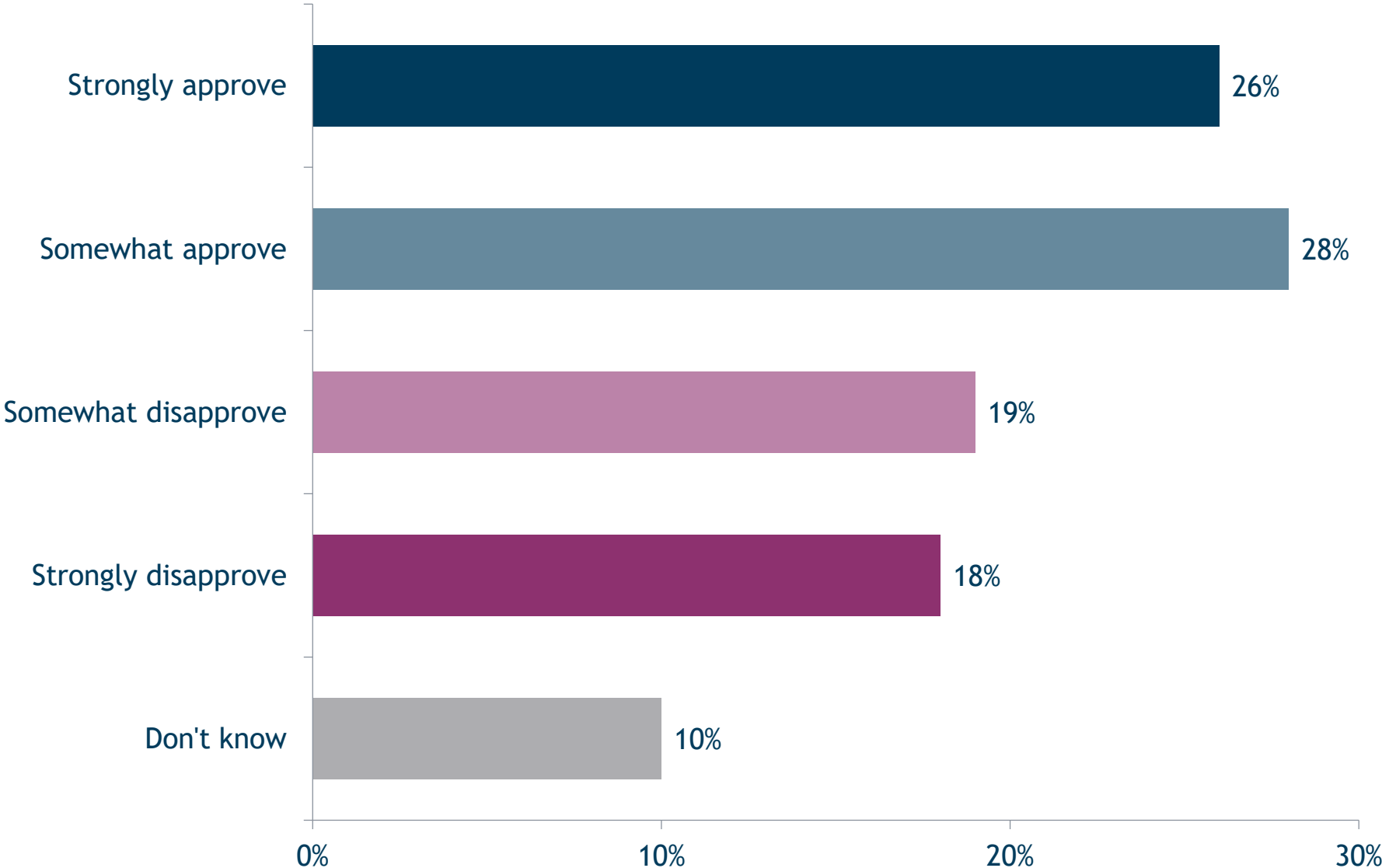

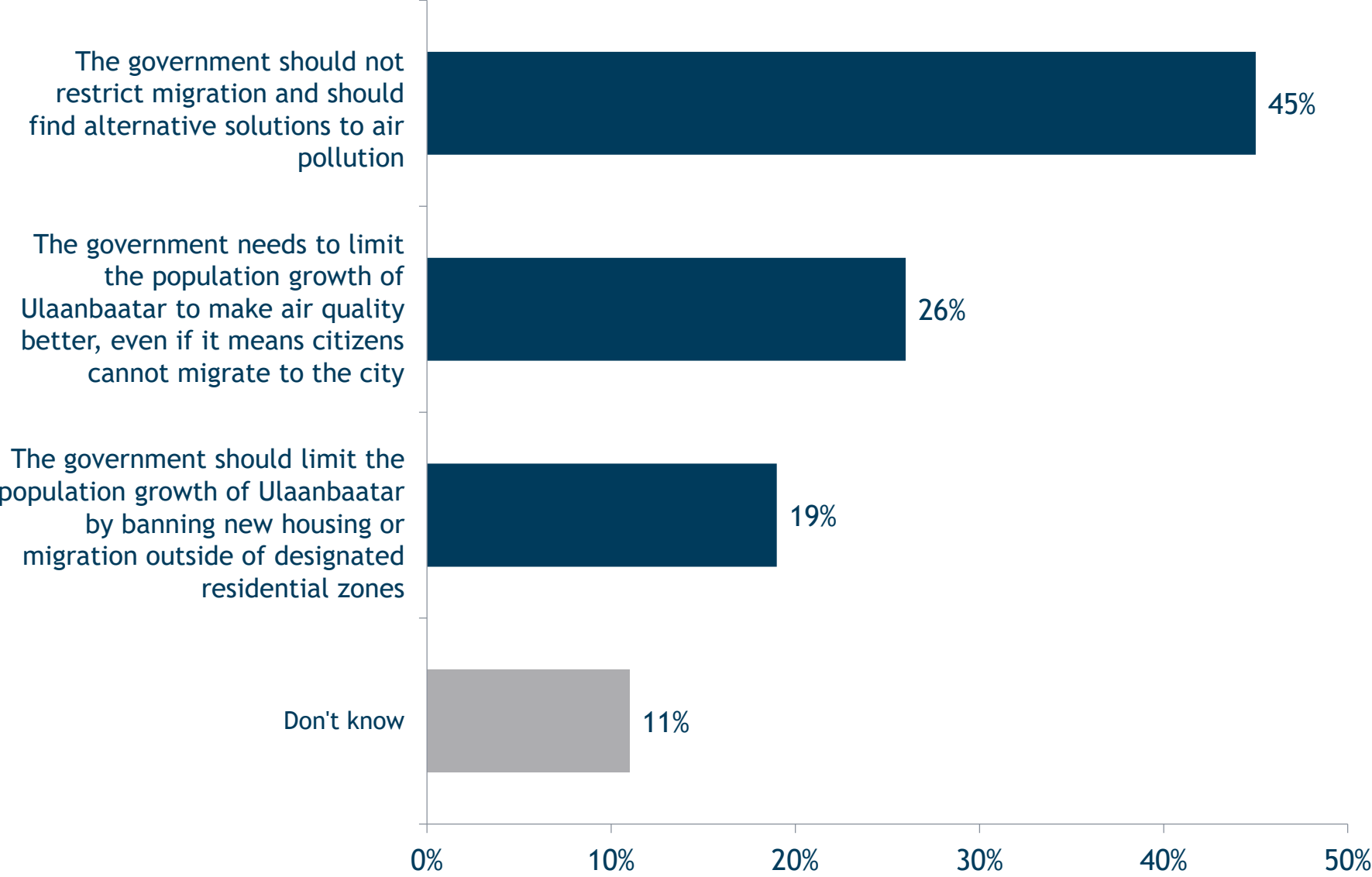
In your opinion, how serious is the problem of climate change?

Which of the following statements comes closest to your personal opinion?

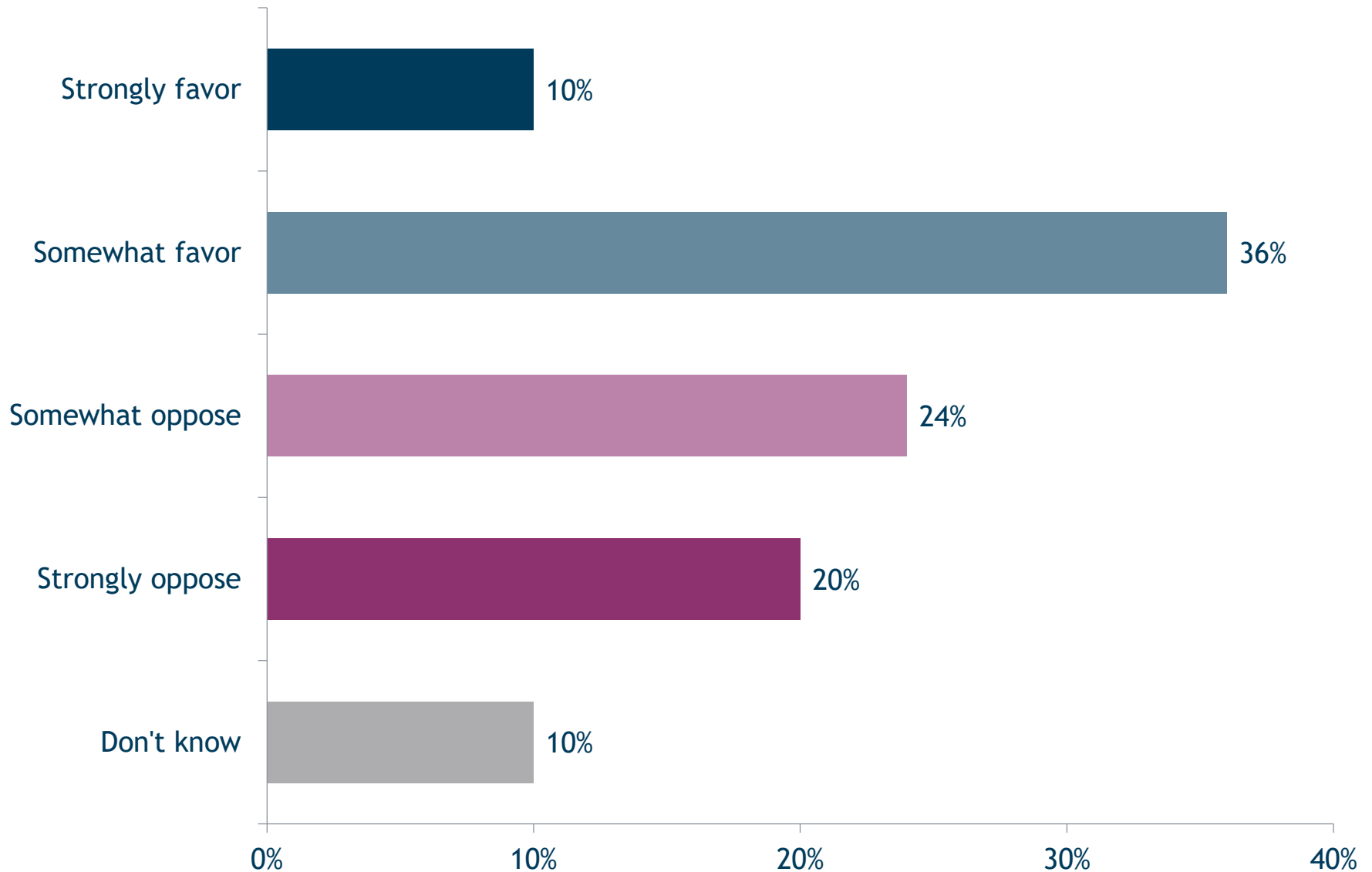




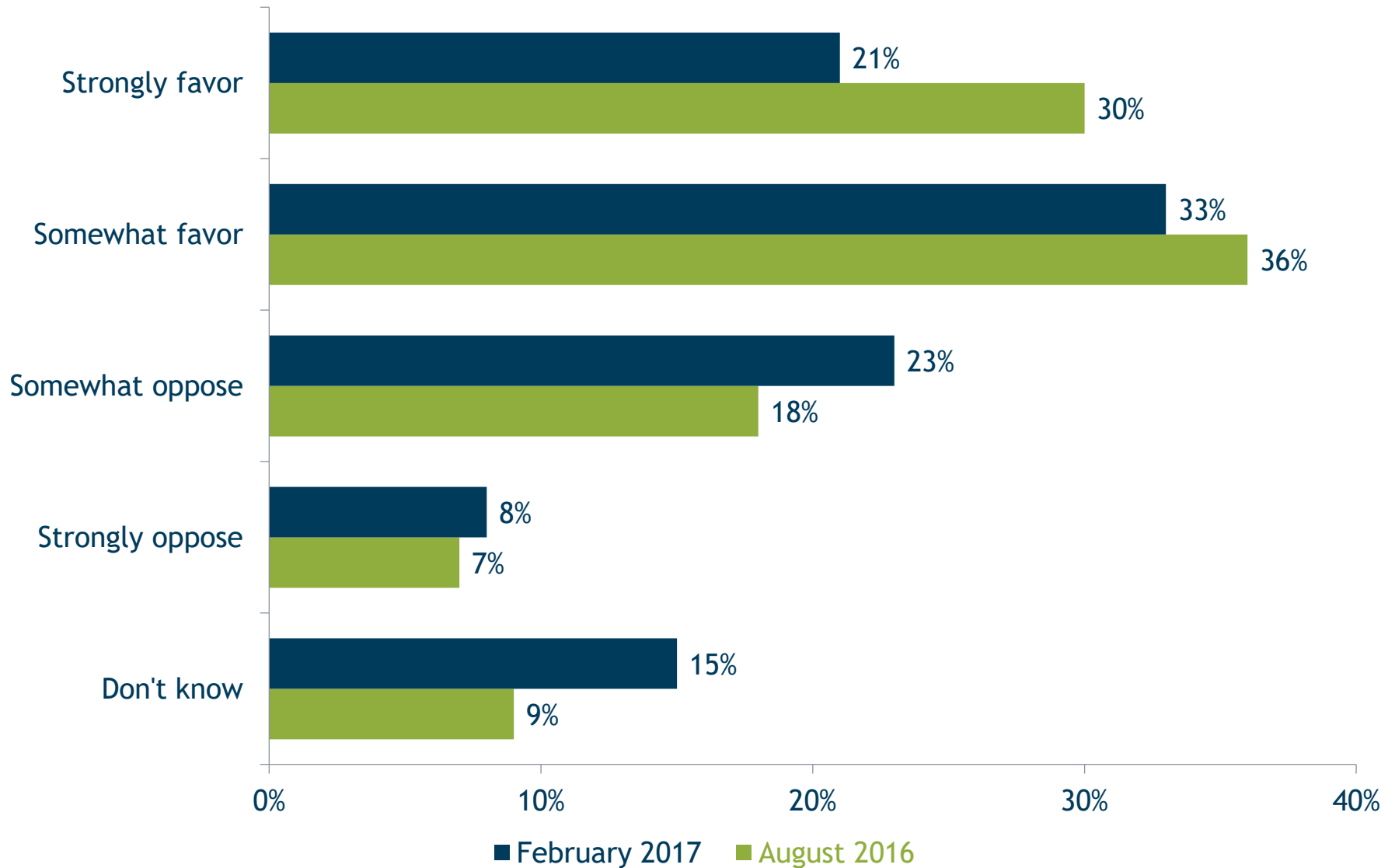

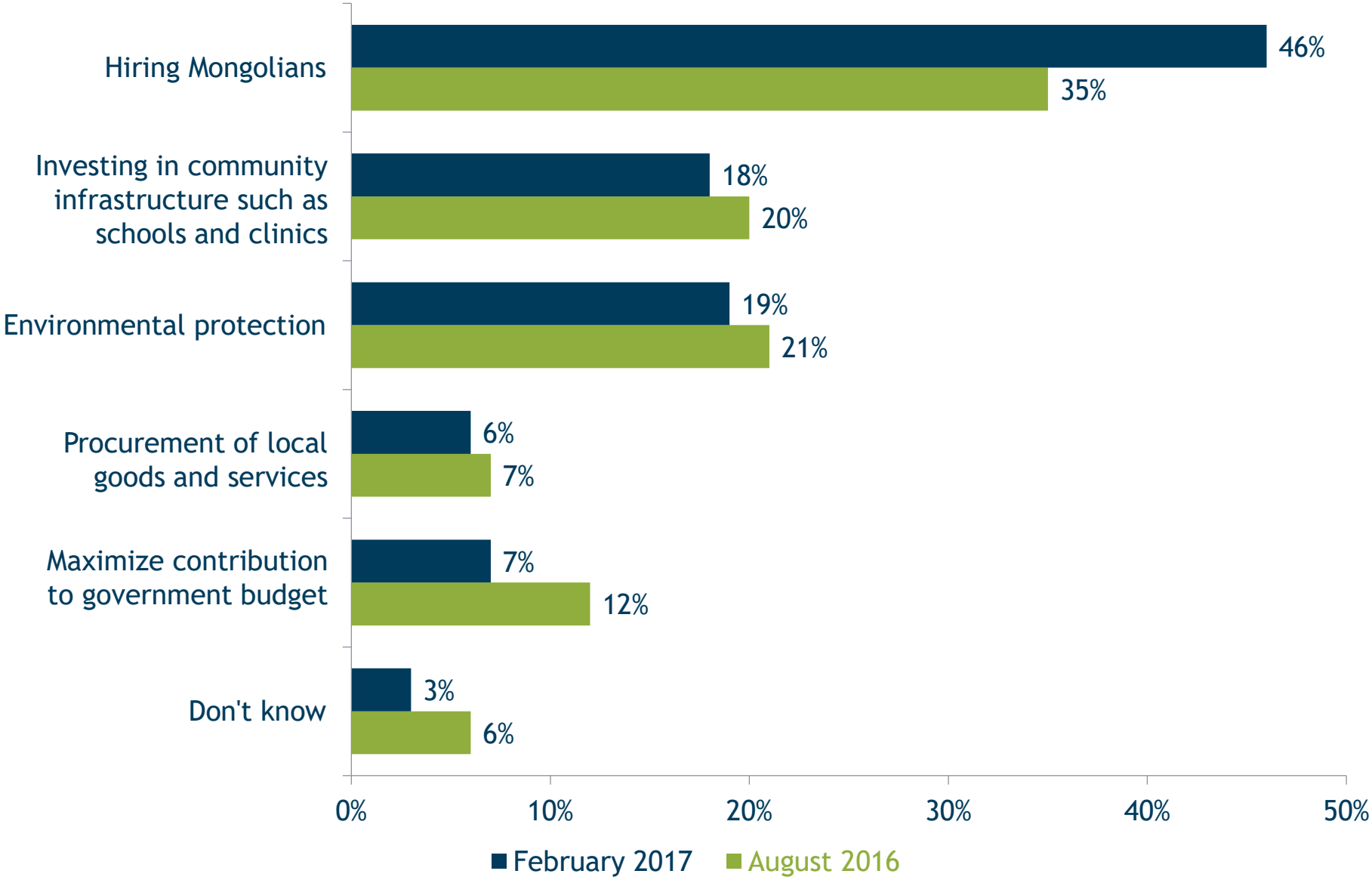
Do you favor or oppose the involvement of foreign companies in mining operations?



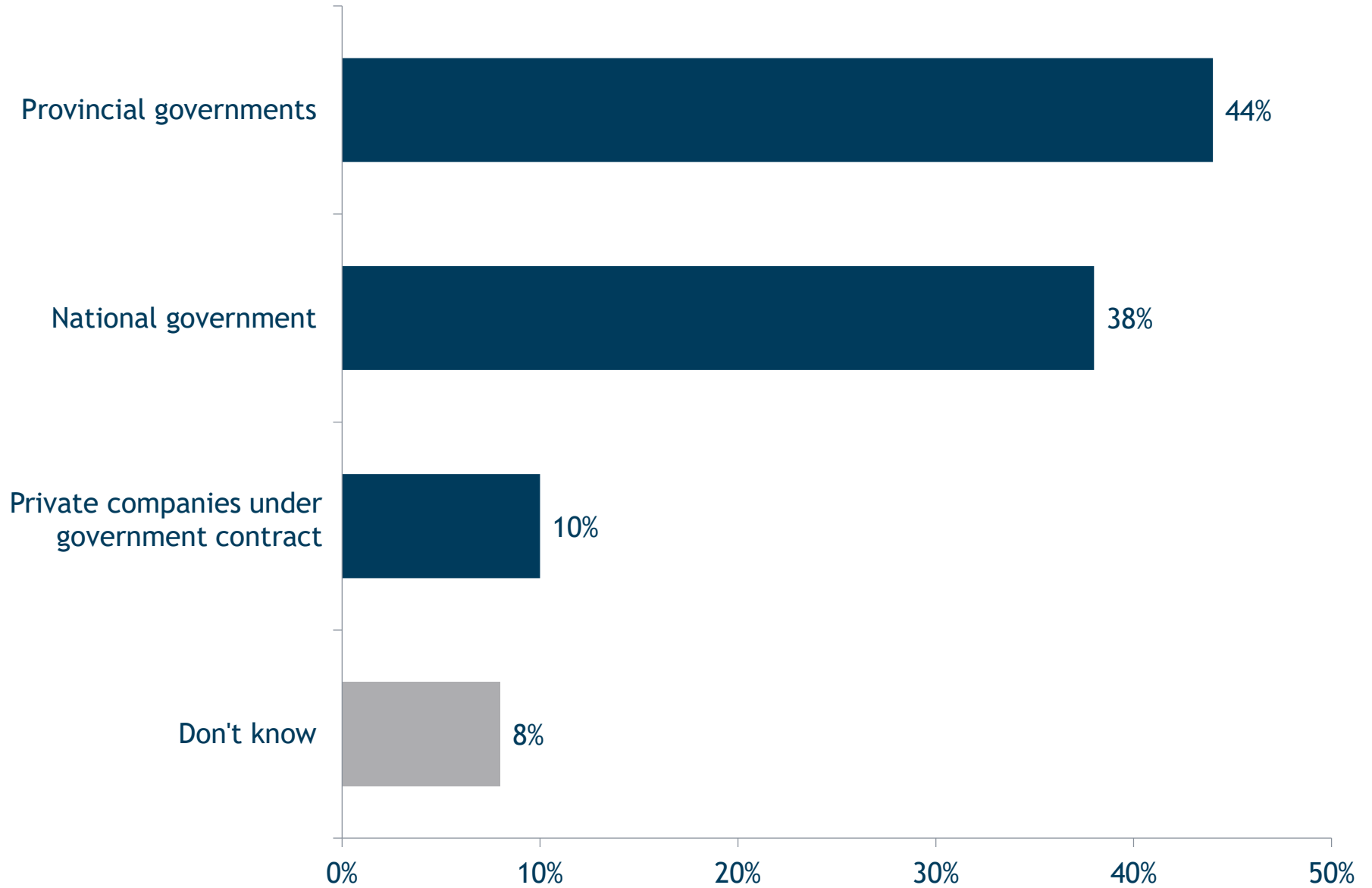
Would you favor or oppose Parliament passing laws to prevent foreign investment in mining operations?



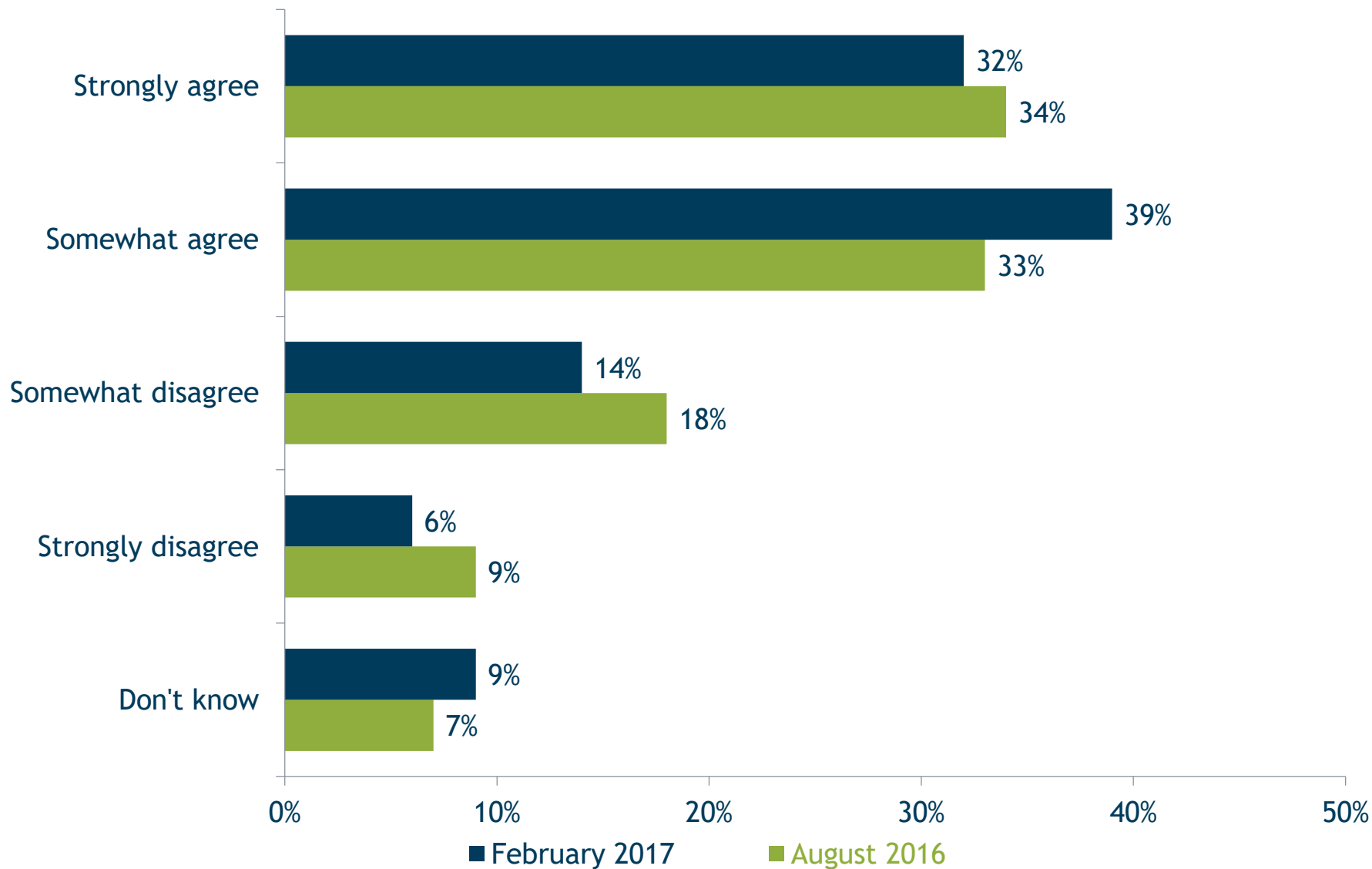
What do you think foreign investors in the mining industry should focus on the most?



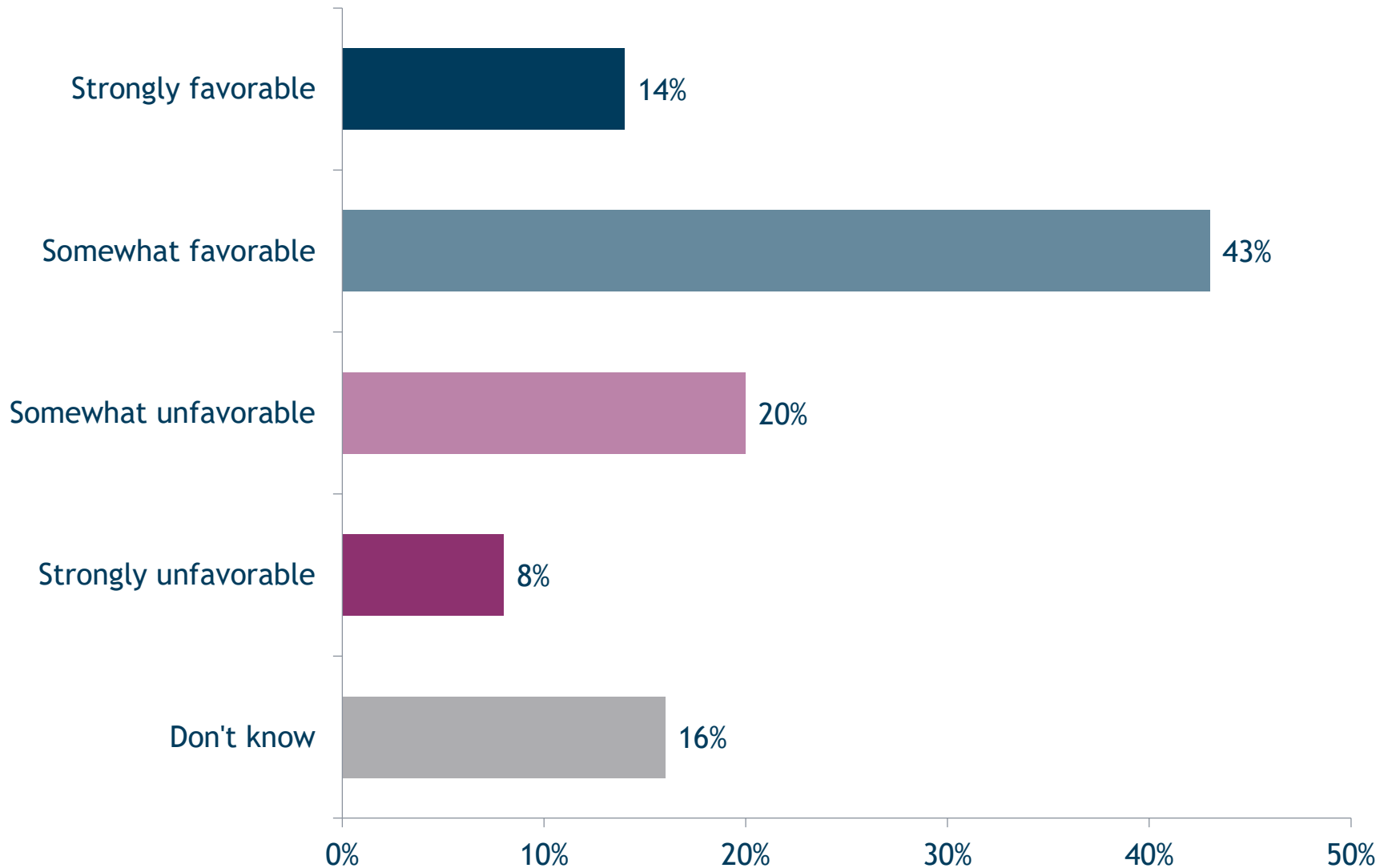
Who should have primary responsibility for overseeing the mining industry?

“Provinces should be given a proportional share of revenue from natural resources to address local problems.”

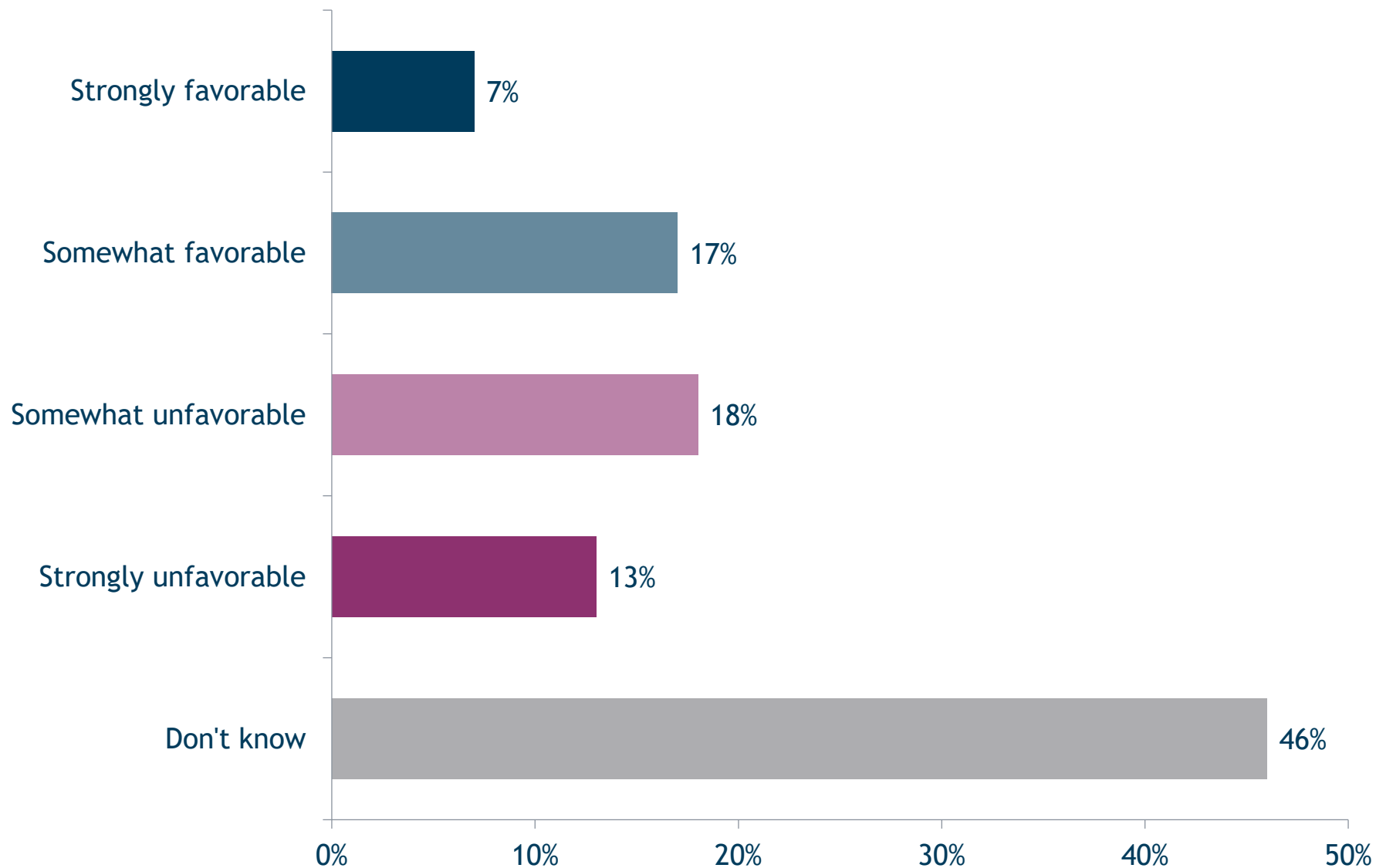


Is your opinion of Oyu Tolgoi LLC* favorable or unfavorable?



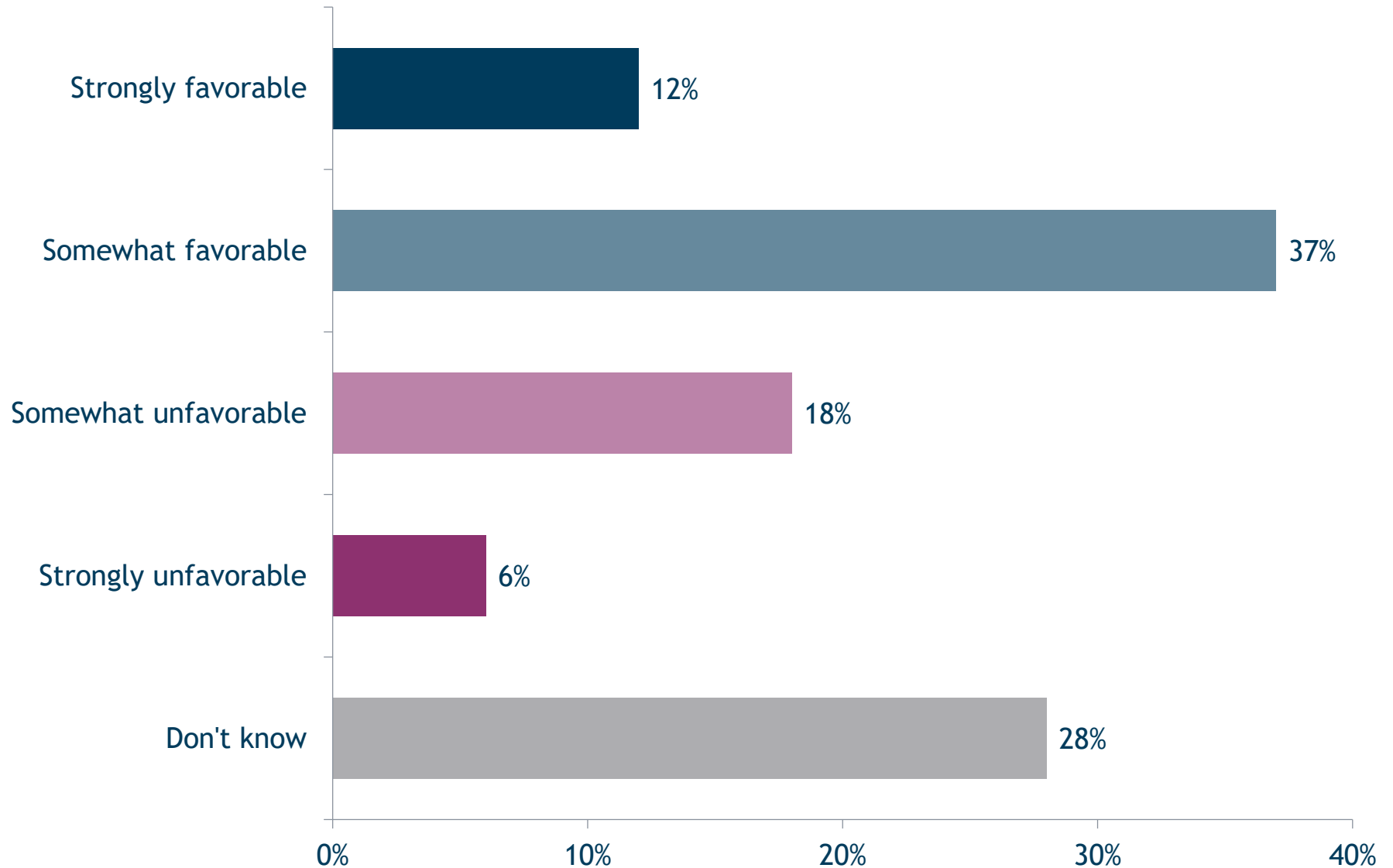

Is your opinion of Centerra Gold* favorable or unfavorable?



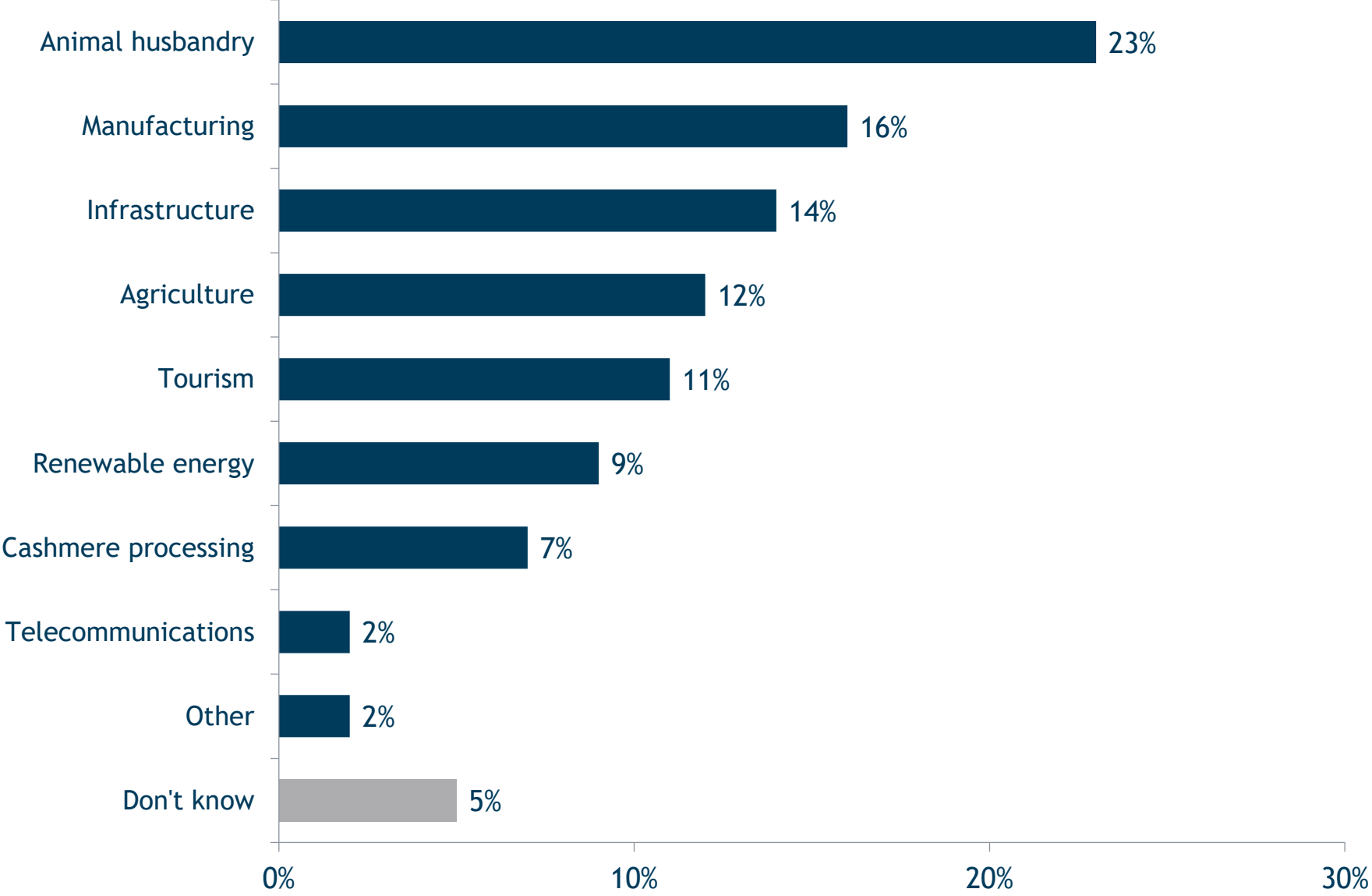

Is your opinion of Erdenes Mongol* favorable or unfavorable?

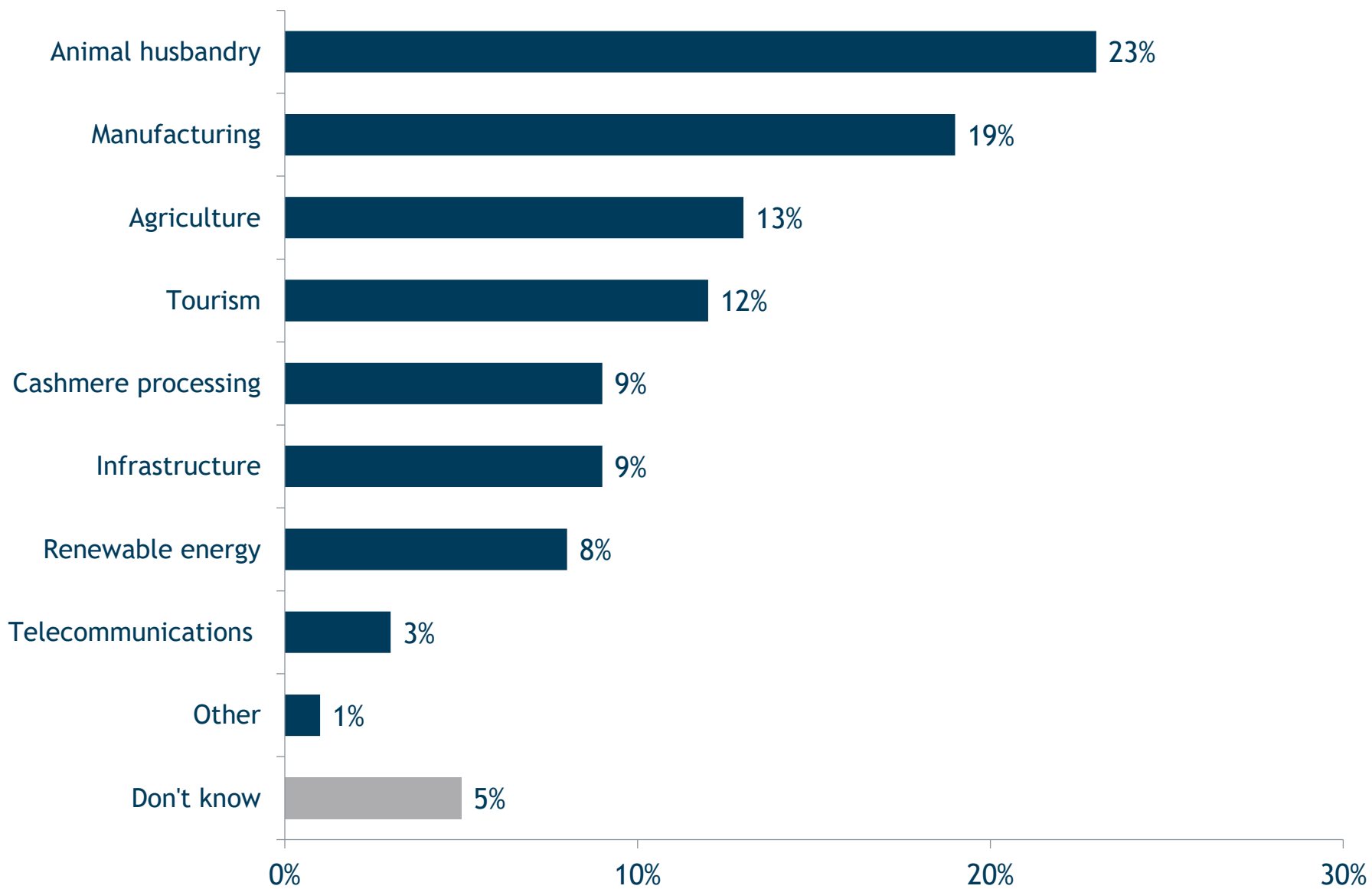

In which industry would you like to see more private domestic investment?

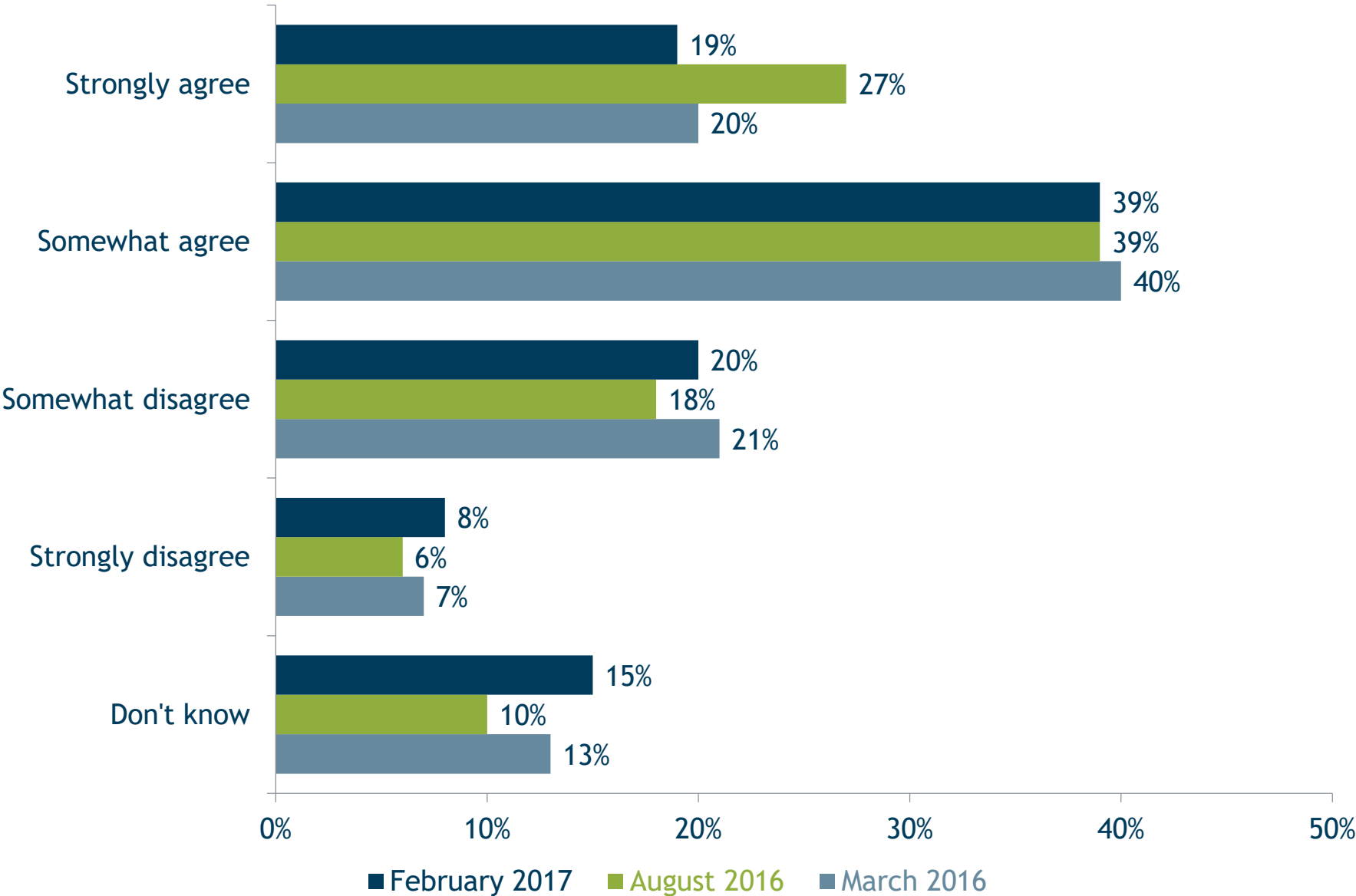




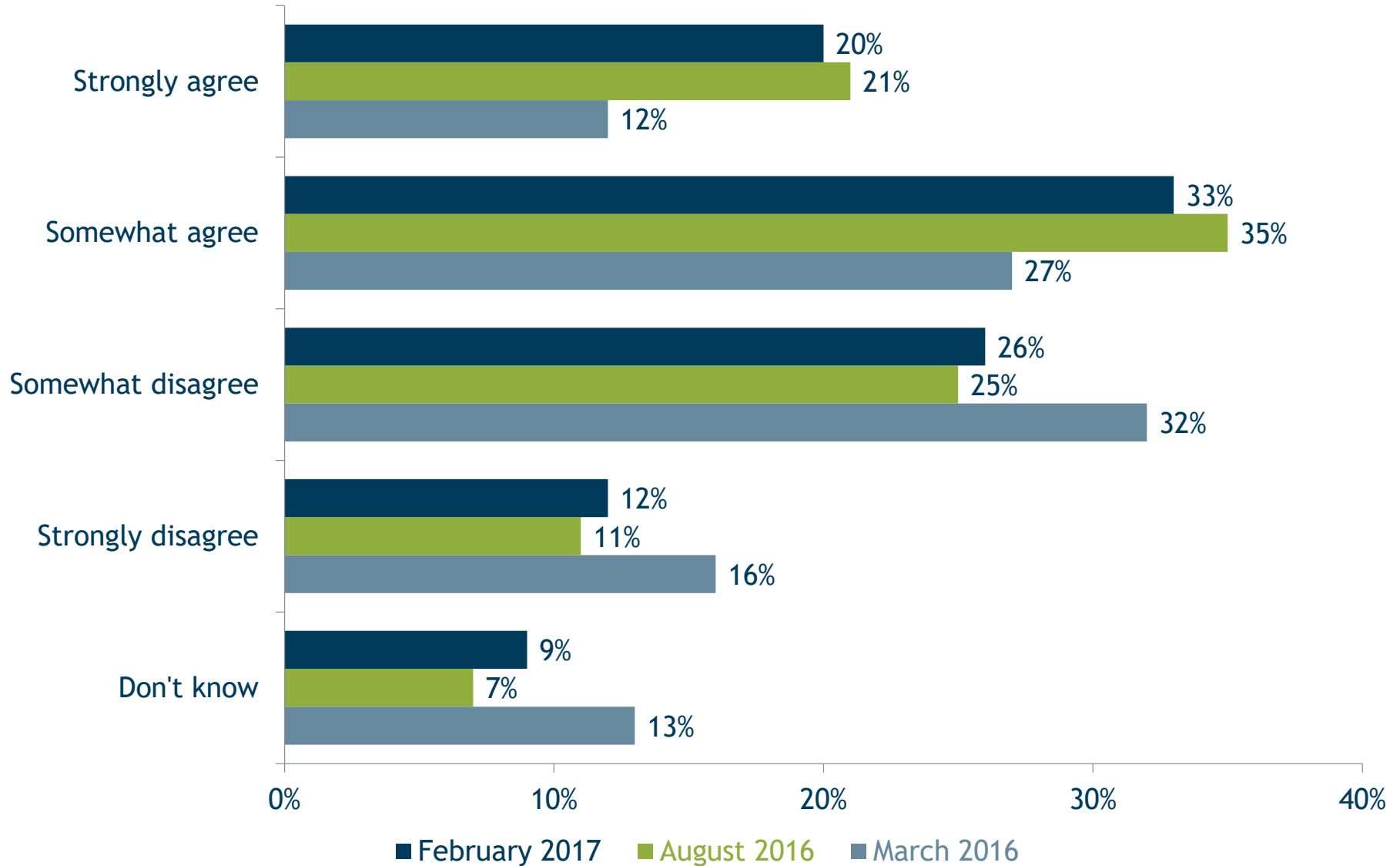

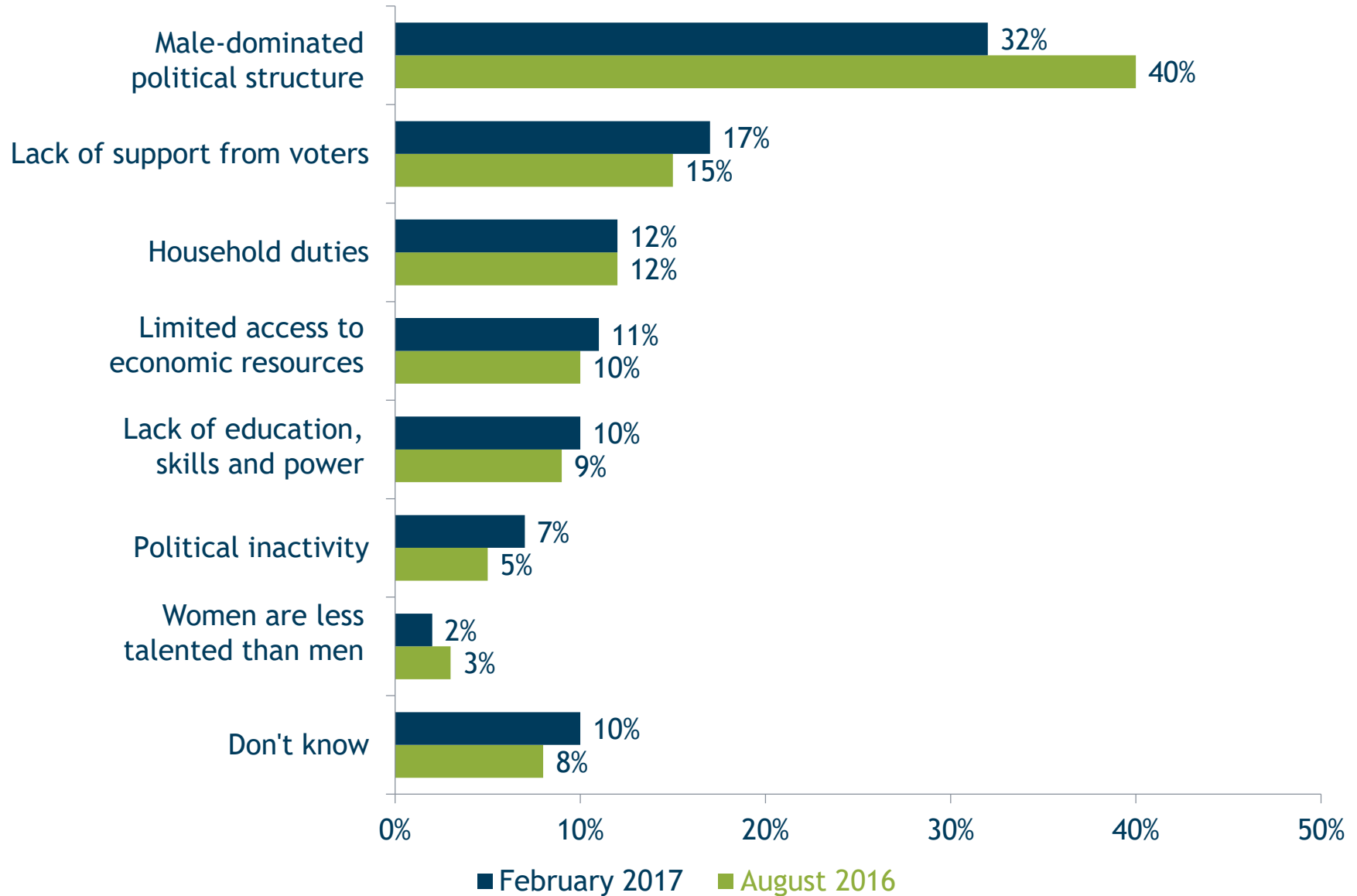
Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: “Politicians do not listen to the needs and ideas of women.”



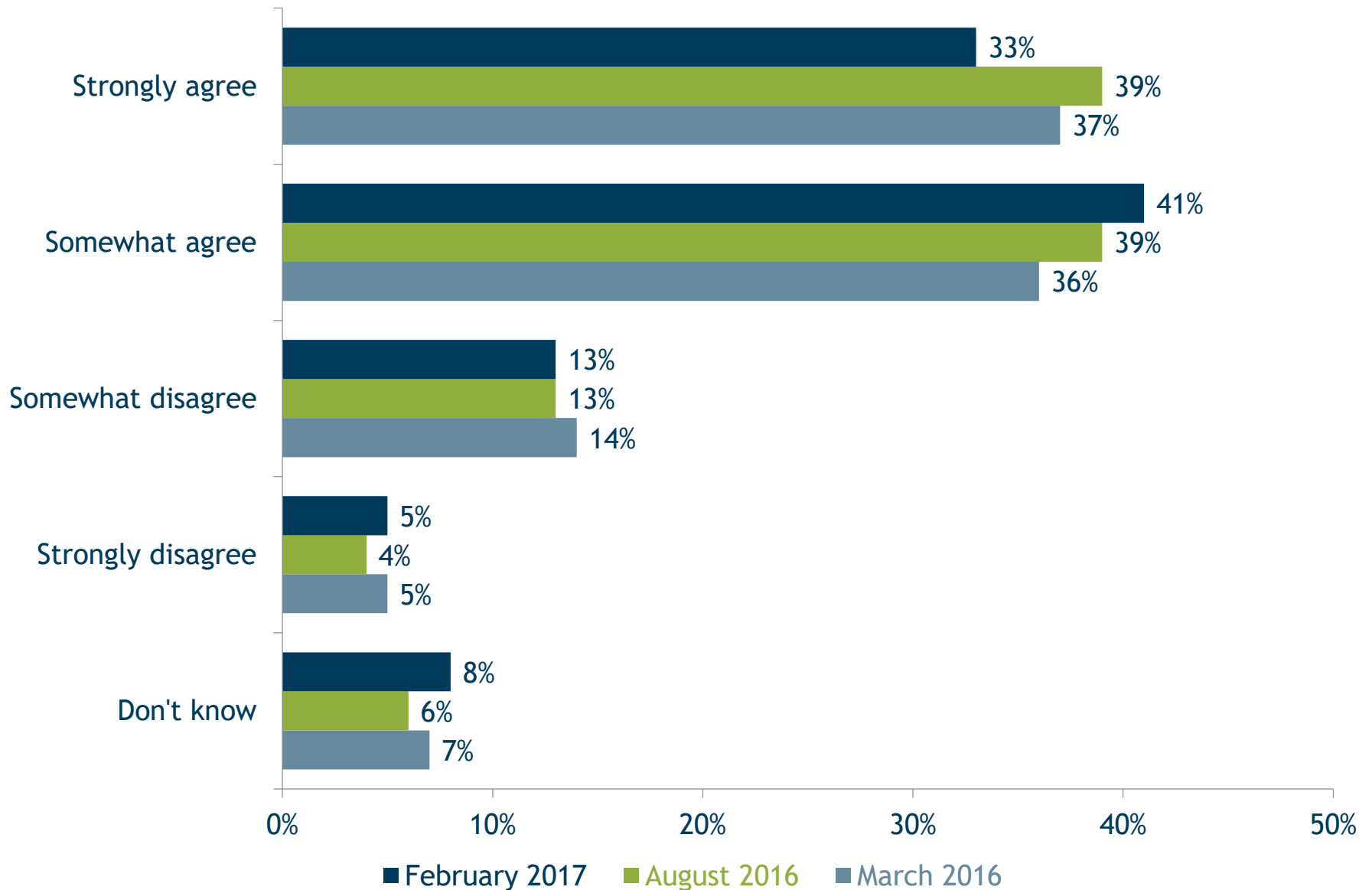
Do you agree or disagree with the following statement:
“Women are equally represented in political decision-making positions in Mongolia.”



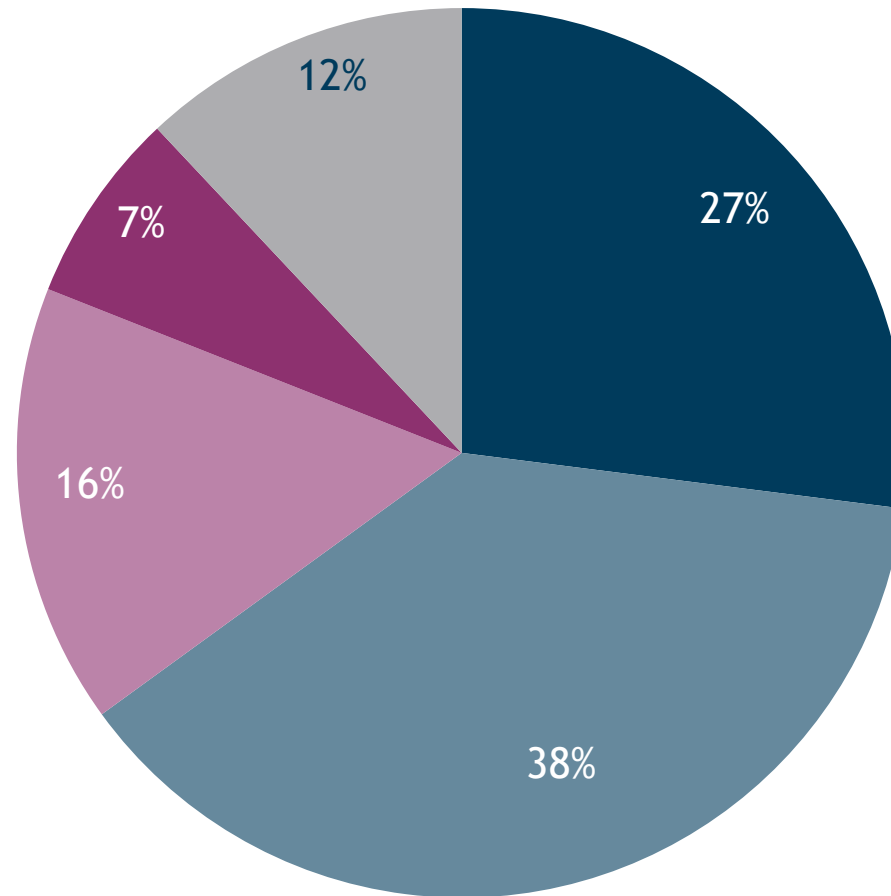
Which of the following would you say is the greatest barrier to greater women's participation in political decision making:

“Women can compete equally with men for positions of elected office.”



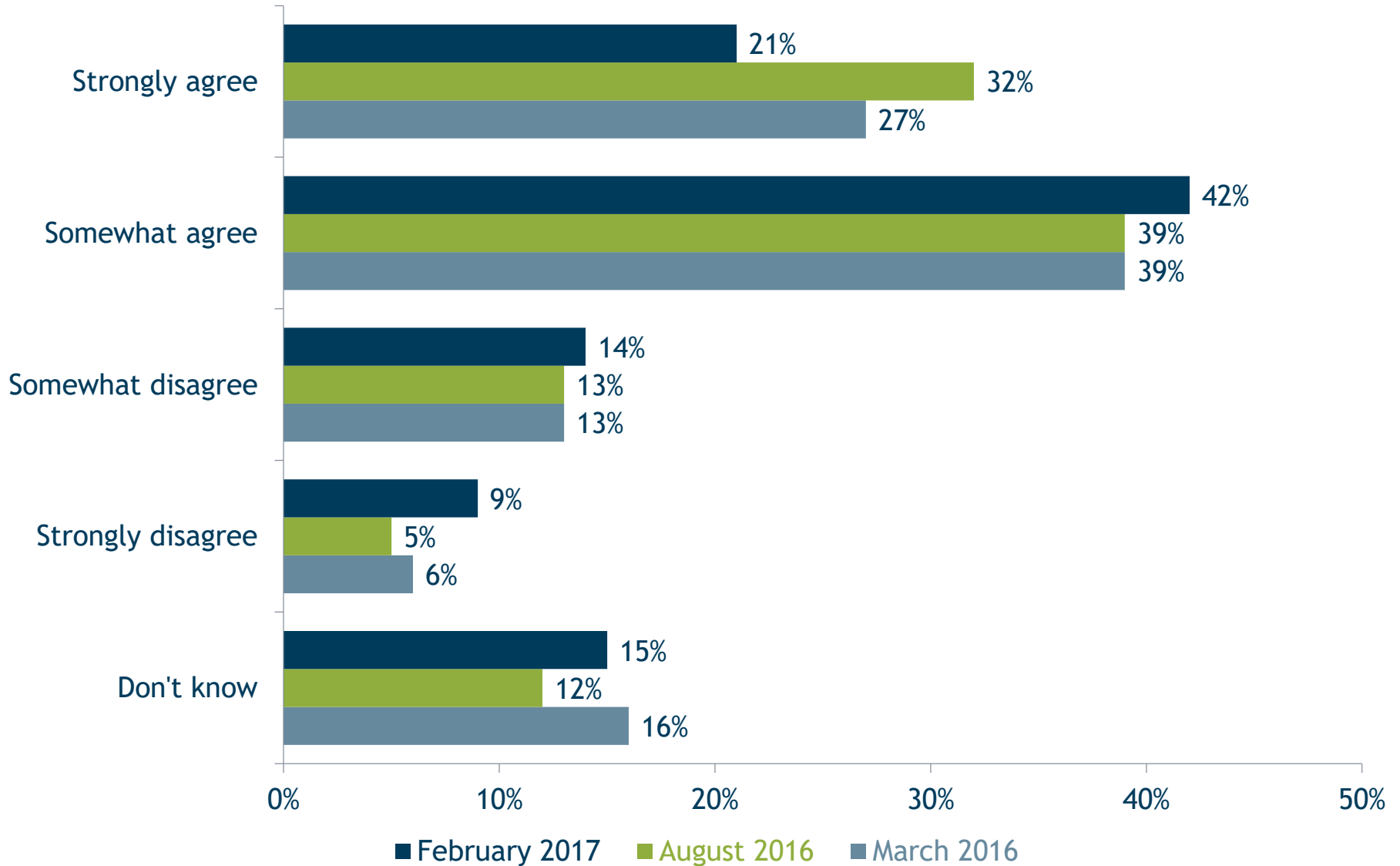

nominated by a political party in future elections.”



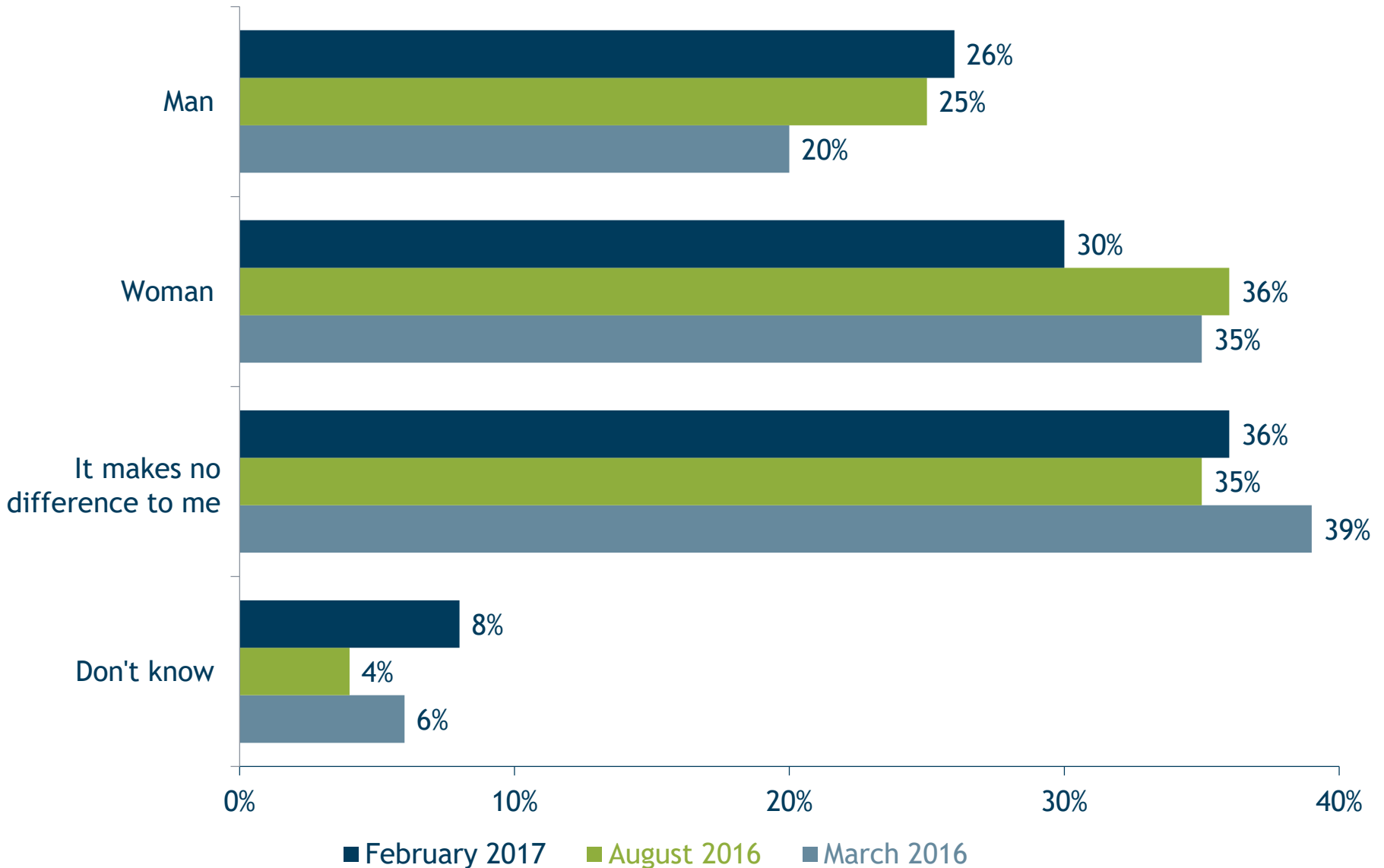

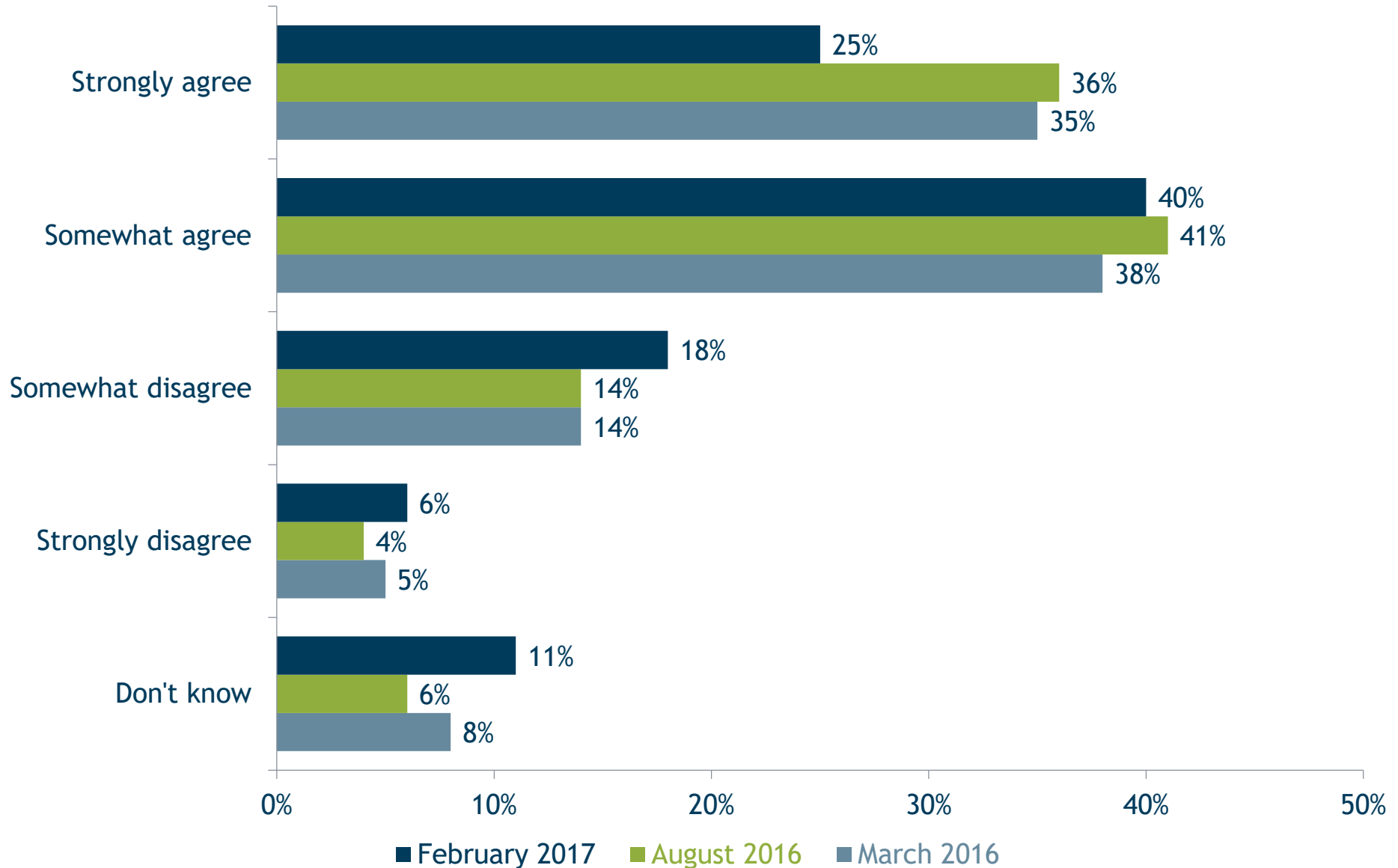
Do you agree or disagree with the following statement:

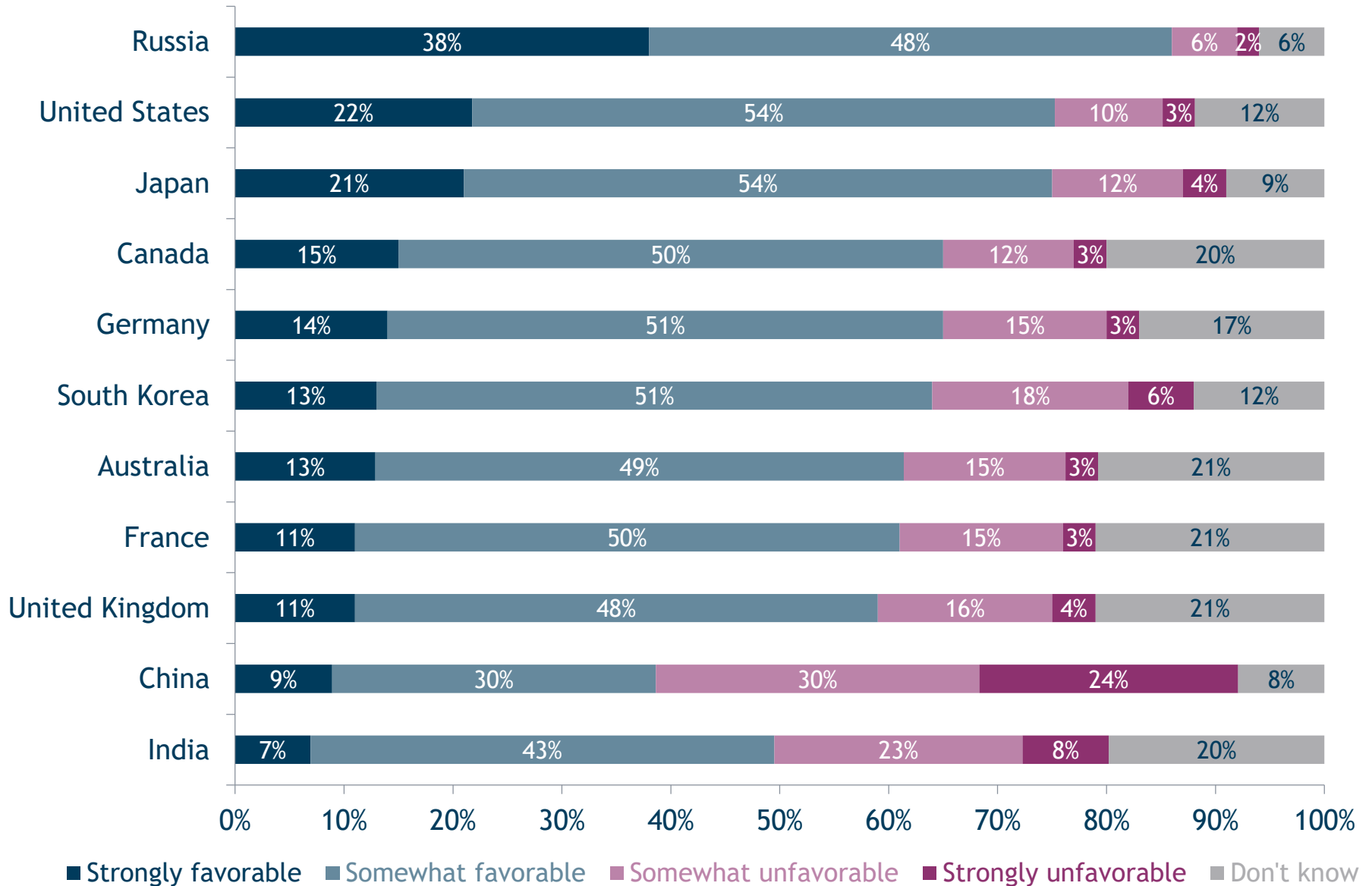




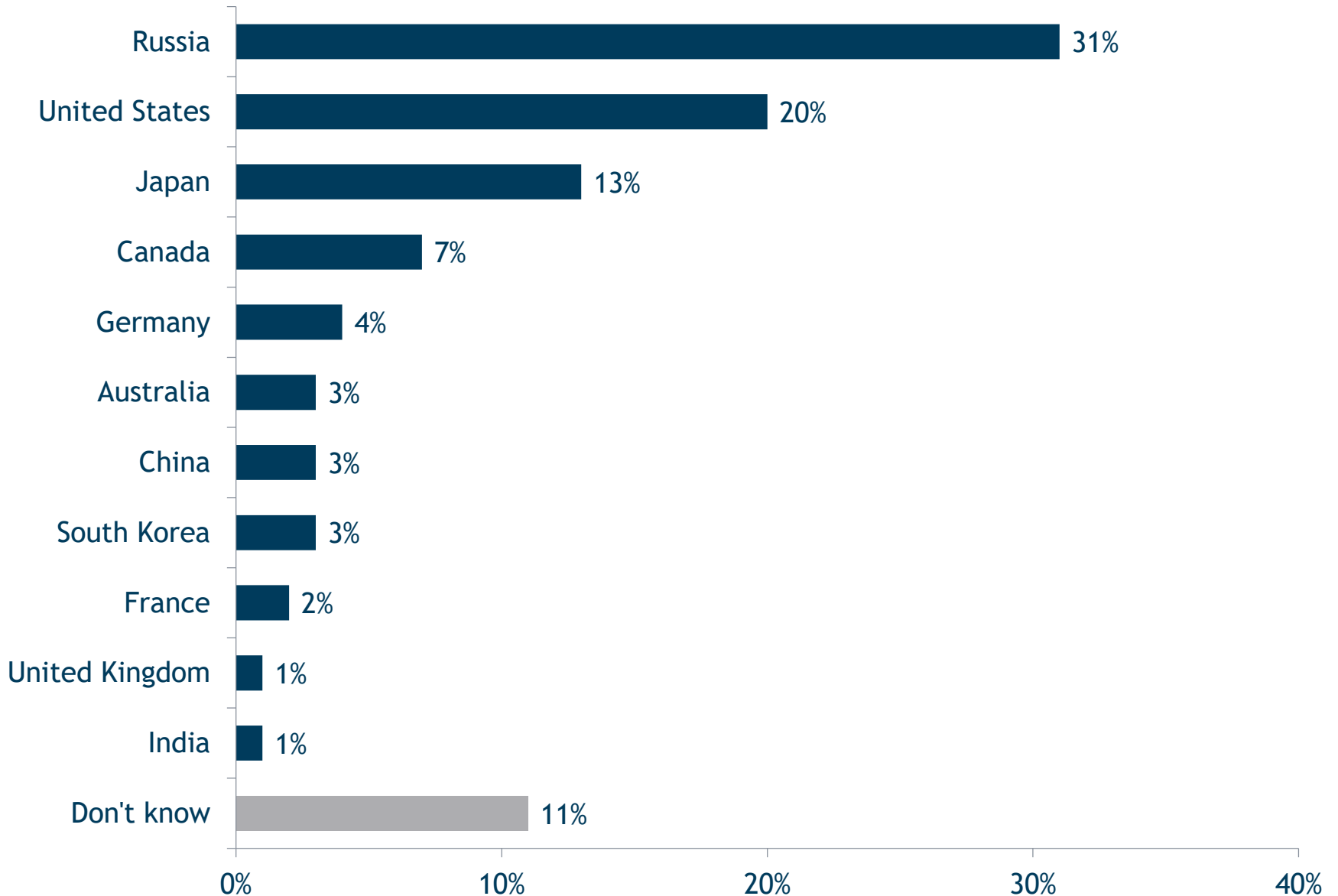

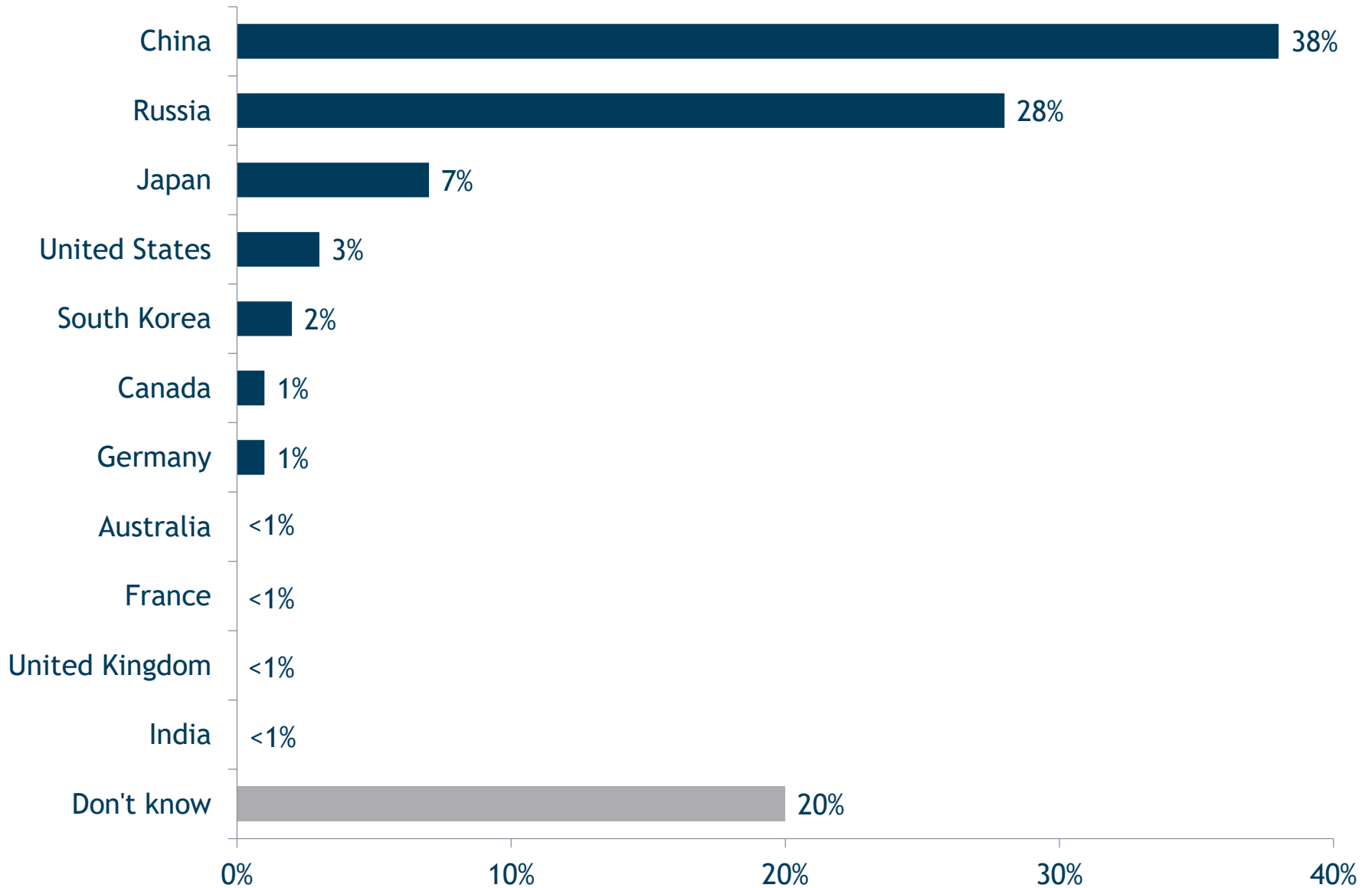
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the following countries:



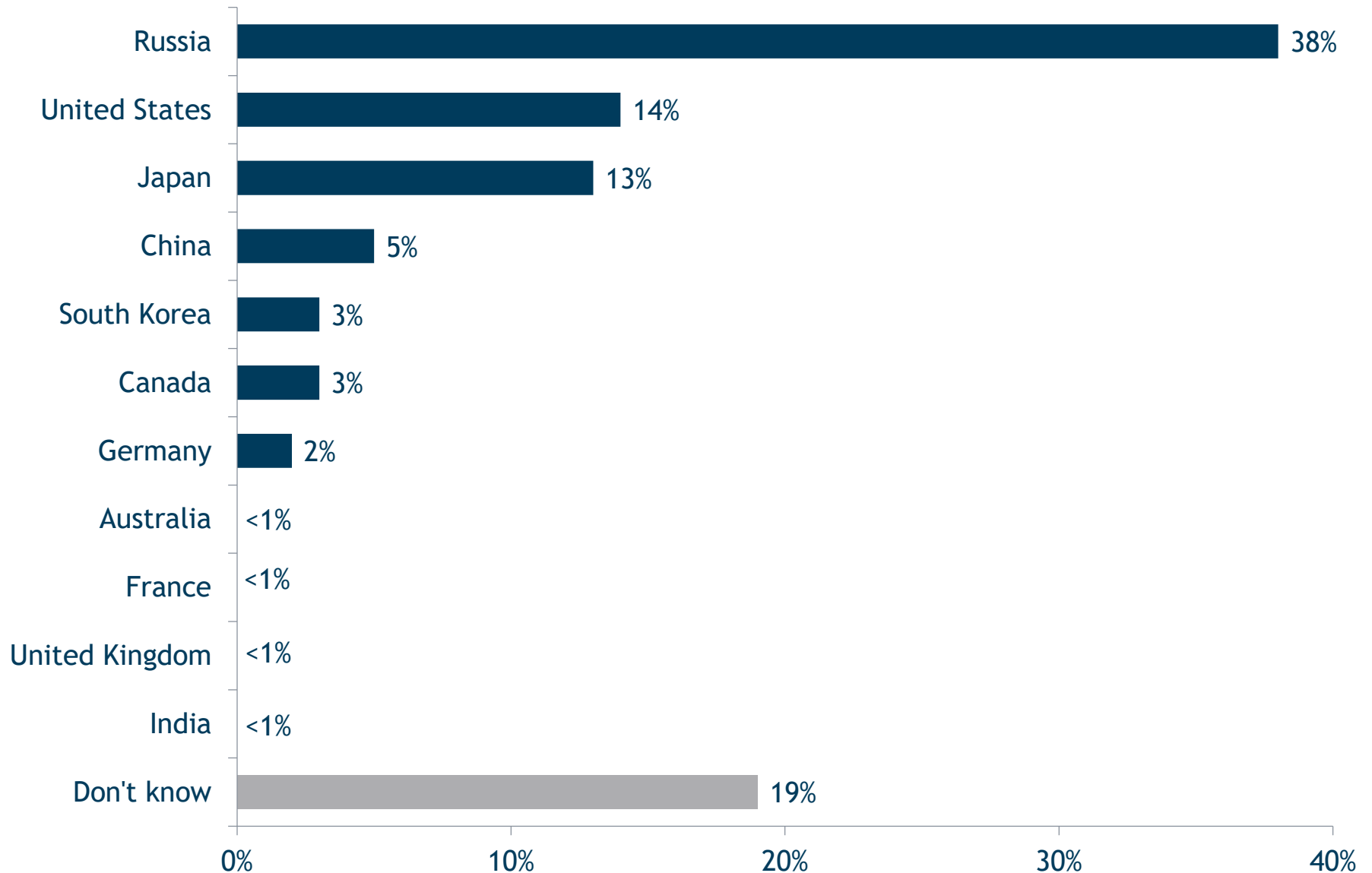
From which of the following countries would you most favor additional investment in Mongolia?

Which foreign country would you prefer to be Mongolia's most significant economic partner? (open-ended)

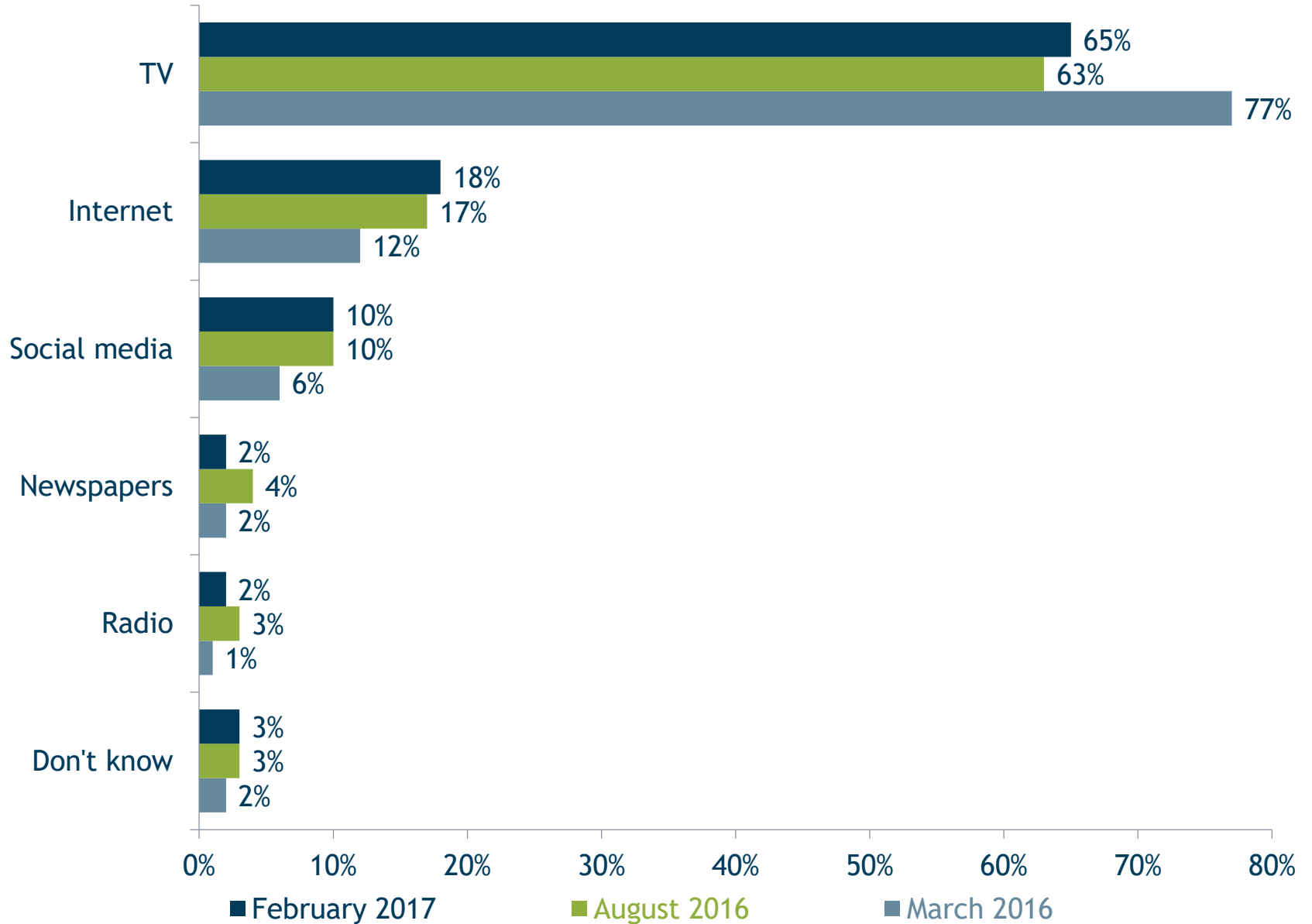




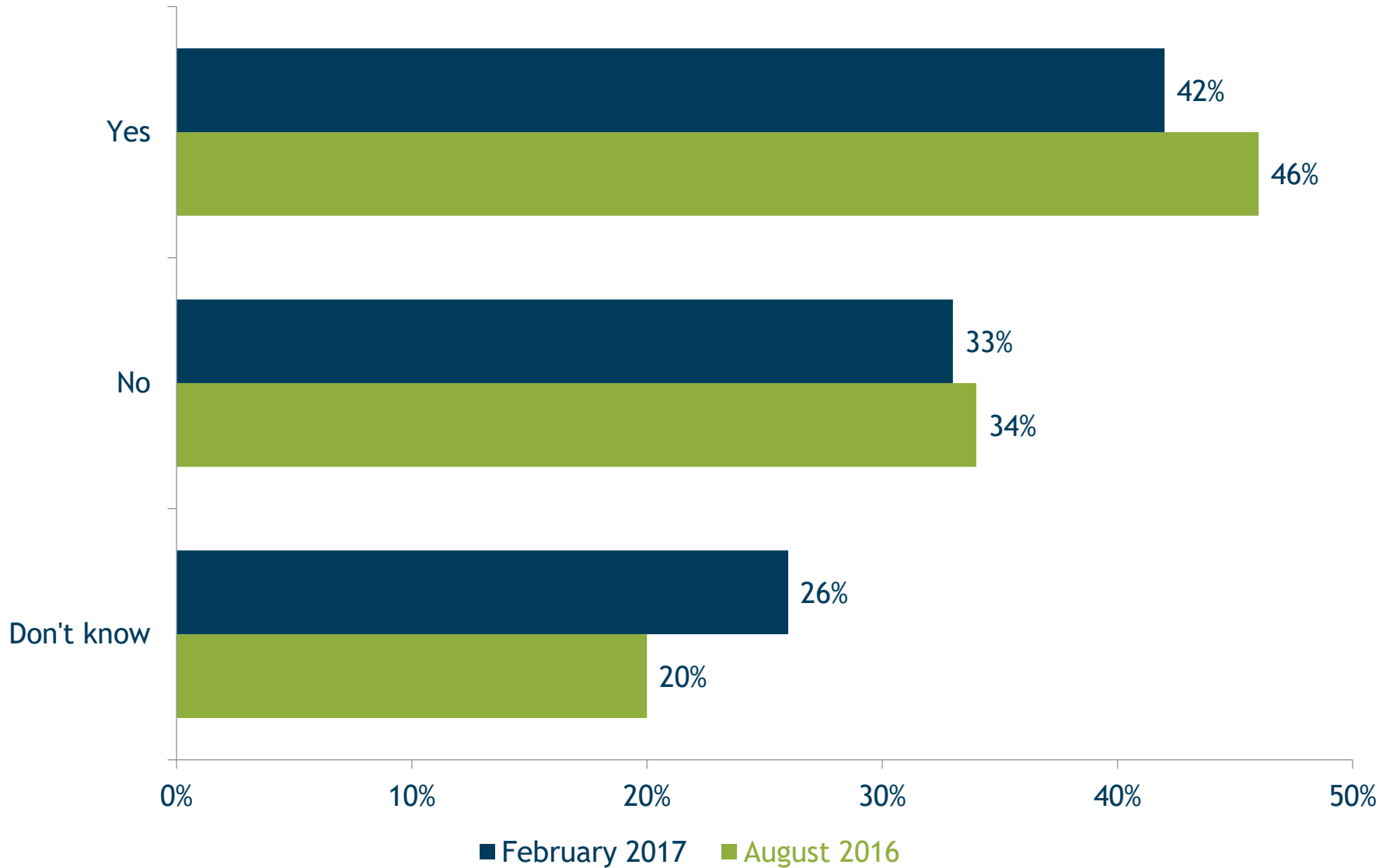

From which type of media are you most likely to get your news?

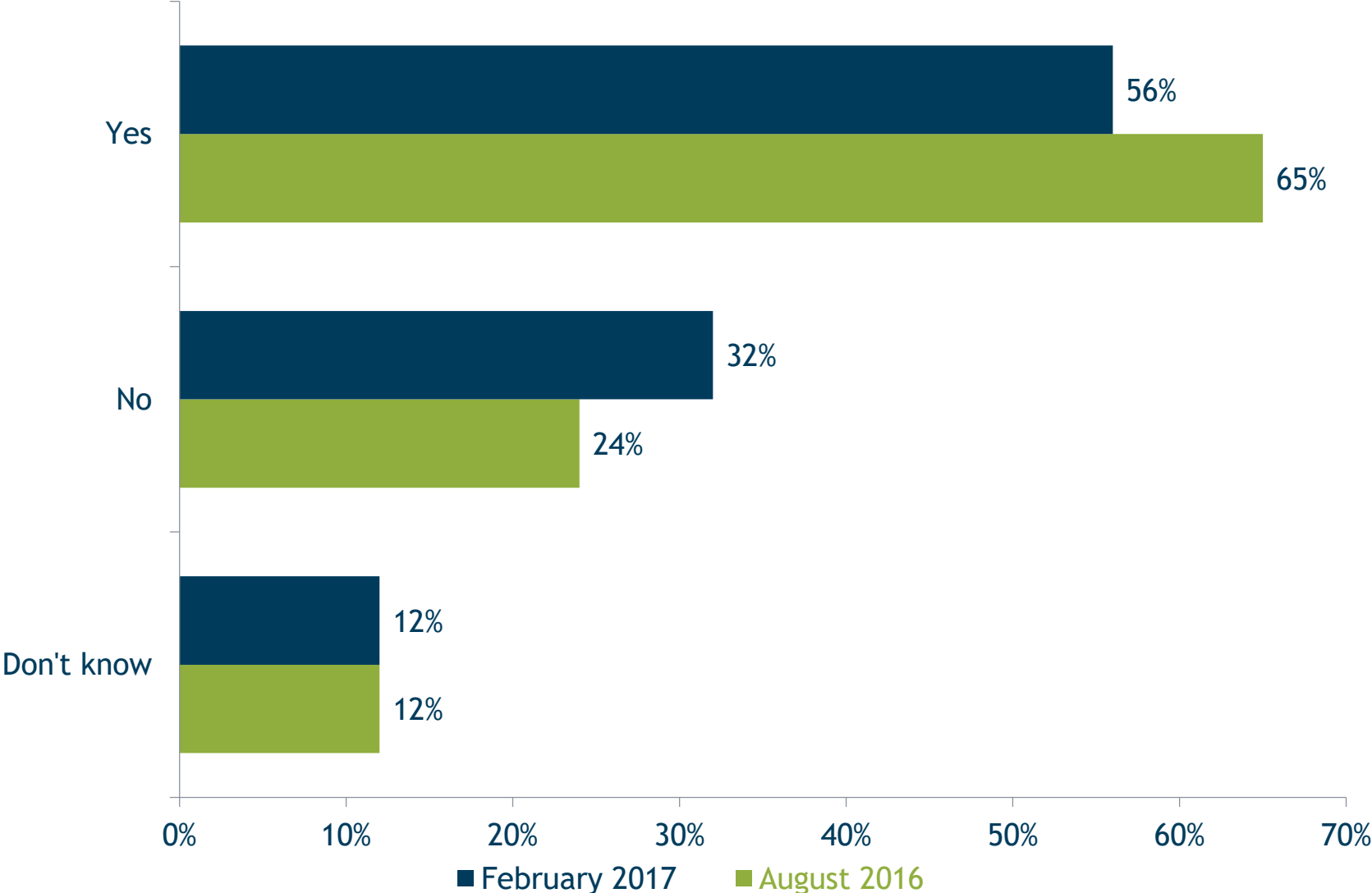


Do you believe the media is free, fair and unbiased?



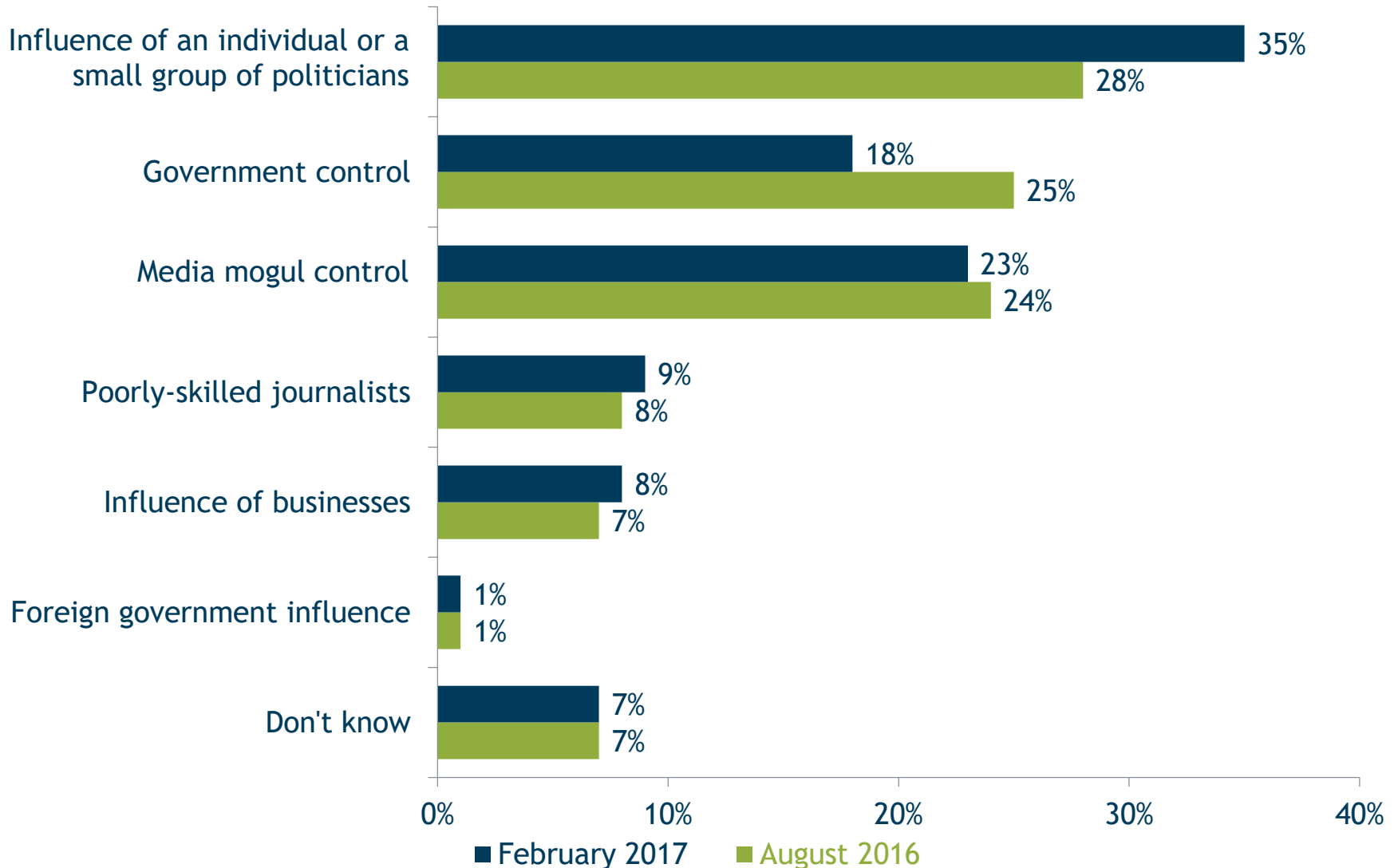
Do you expect the media to remain free, fair and unbiased under the new government over the next year?

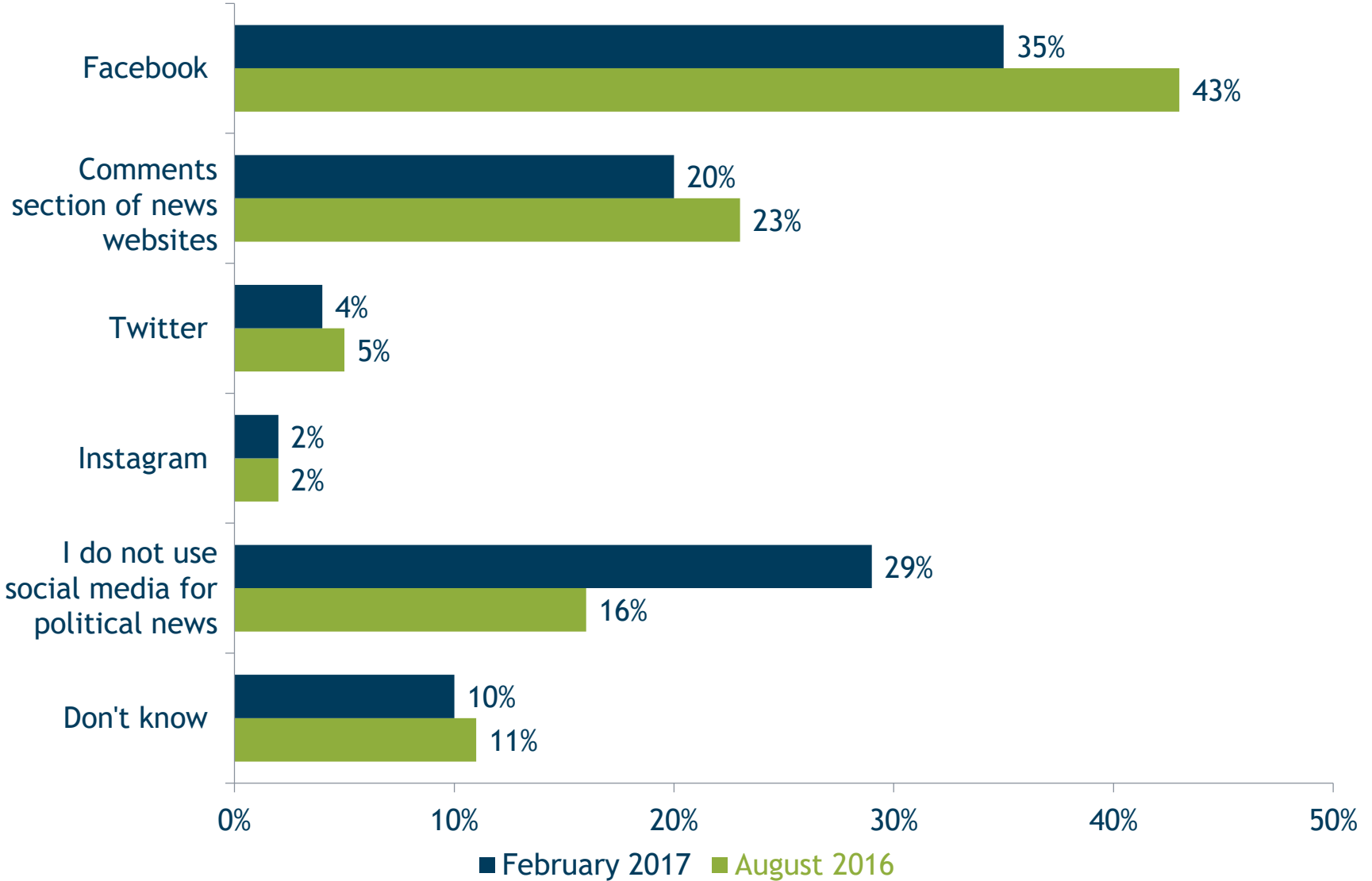


What is the primary reason you believe the media is not or will no longer be free, fair or unbiased?

(Respondents who disagree: February 2017 n=2,308; August 2016 n=2,258)

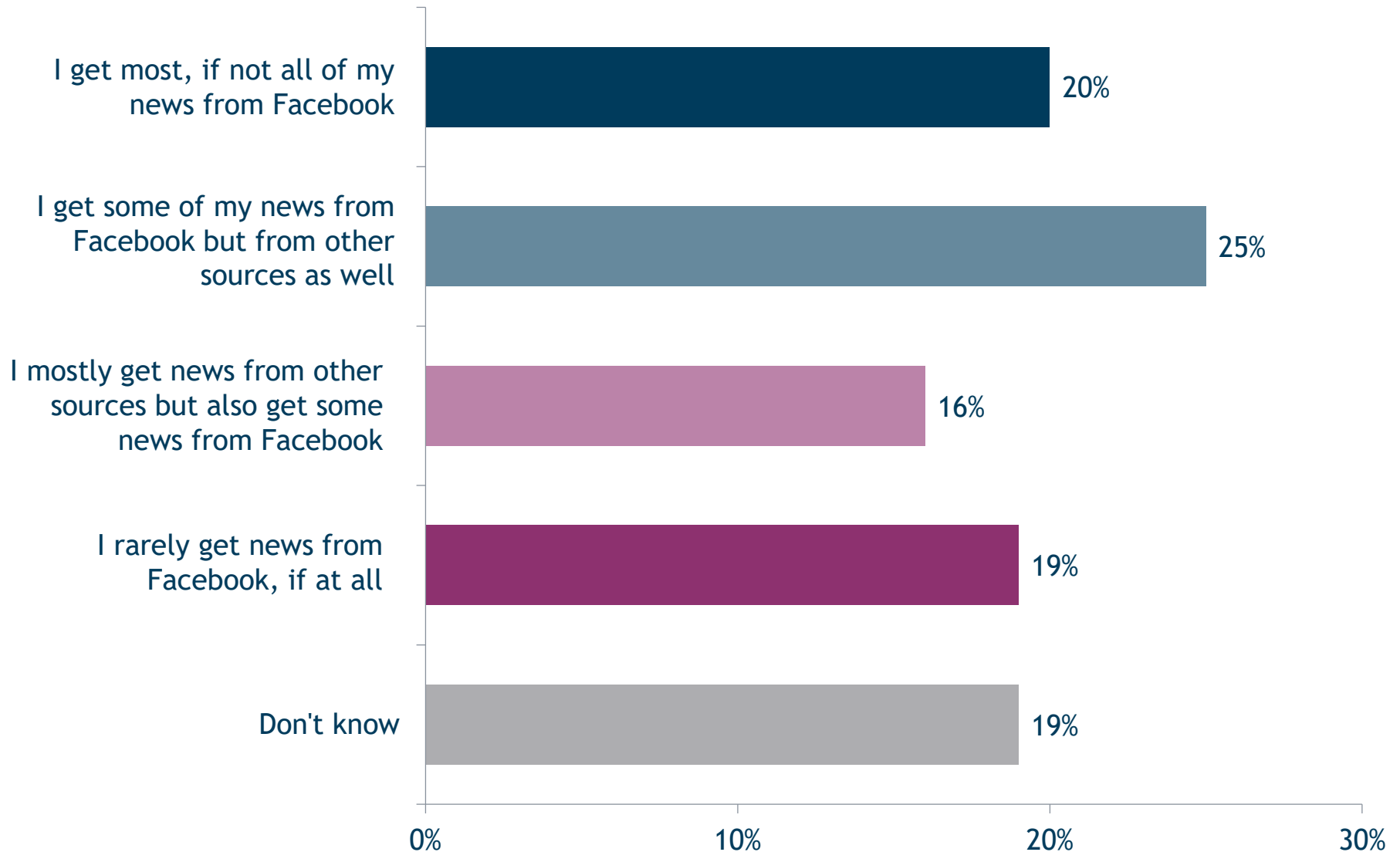


Which social media platform* do you rely on most for political news?



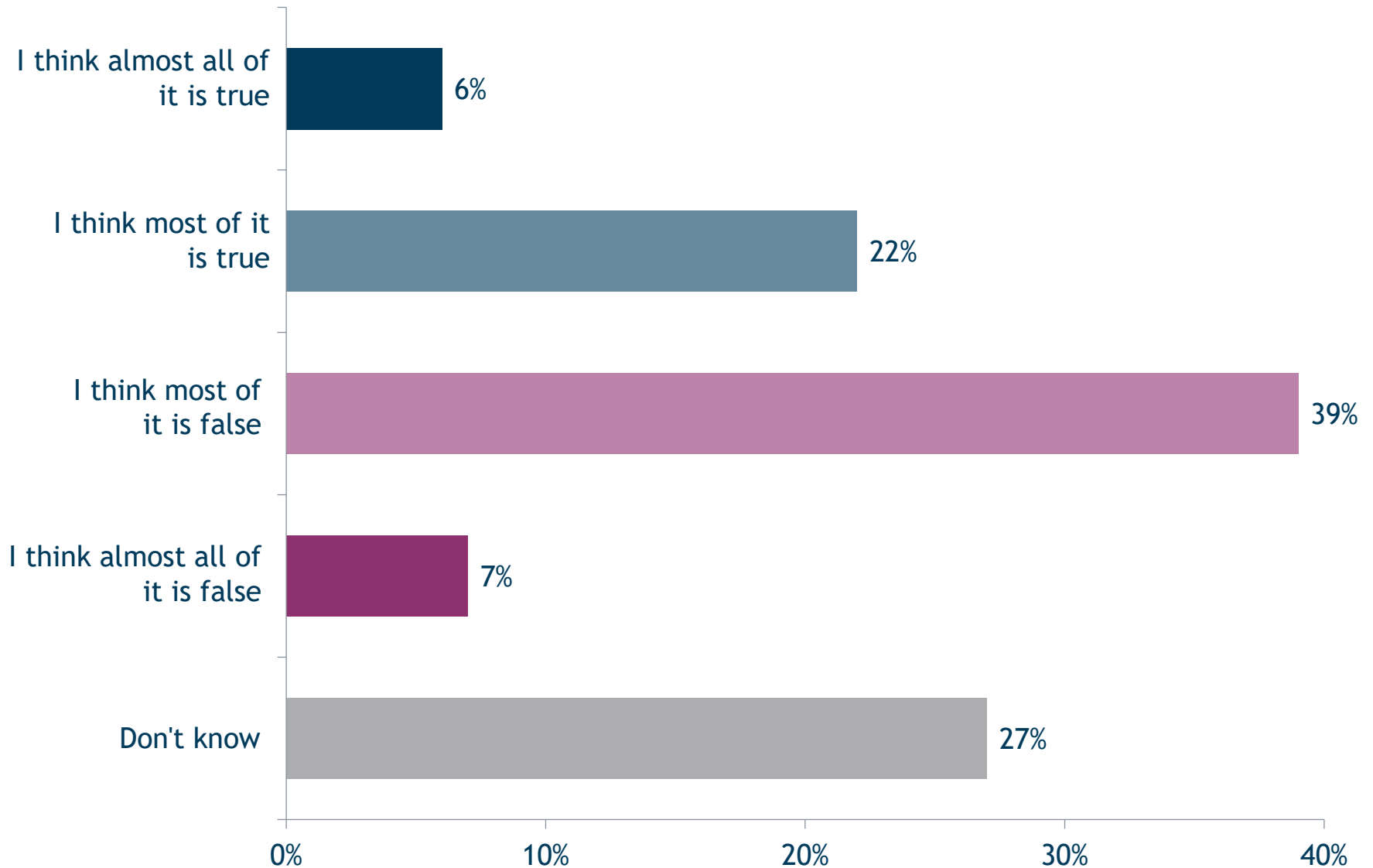
