Detailed Methodology


- This survey was designed, coordinated and analyzed by Middle East Marketing and Research Consultants on behalf of the Center for Insights in Survey Research (CISR).
- This nationally representative survey was carried out from May 22 to 25, 2017. A sample of 1,000 adults aged 18 years and older participated in face-to-face interviews in their homes.
- The sample design consisted of a multi-stage cluster sample:
 - Stage one: Divide country into 100 clusters distributed among Jordan's 12 governorates based on the 2015 Department of Statistics Housing and Population Census frame. The Nyman allocation approach was used to distribute the sample of clusters among the different governorates, ensuring proper coverage for governorates with small population sizes. Weights were then used to reflect the actual population size of each governorate.
 - Stage two: Ten households were drawn (with a replacement to allow for non-contacts) from each cluster. A random start and a systematic selection procedure was used to ensure proper representation of different parts of the cluster in the sample and to reduce intra-class correlation.
- Researchers conducted one in-person interview per household, selected using the Kish method.
- The response rate for the survey was 91 percent. Eight percent of contacts refused the interviewer at the door and one percent began the survey but refused to complete it.
- The margin of error for the survey does not exceed +/- 3.5 percent, with a confidence level of 95 percent where p=0.50.
- Figures in charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.
- This survey was made possible by funding from the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).




Overall, is Jordan headed in the right or wrong direction?




What is your main reason for considering things in Jordan to be going mostly or somewhat in the right direction?

What, in your opinion, is the single biggest problem facing Jordan as a whole?





How would you describe the current economic situation in Jordan?




In your opinion, why is the current economy in Jordan "very good" or "good"?




In your opinion, why is the current economy in Jordan "very bad" or "bad"?




Do you think the general economic situation in Jordan over the next 12 months is likely to get:




How would you describe your current household economic situation?




Do you think your household economic situation over the next 12 months is likely to get:








Which of the following costs constitutes the heaviest burden on your household budget?



If prices had to increase by 10%, on which of the following would you most tolerate an increase?




In order to improve basic government services (health care, education, infrastructure, etc.), would you support or oppose levying new taxes?





Did the current parliament accomplish anything for which you feel it should be commended?






To what degree do you think the current government has been able to fulfill its duties since being selected?




To what degree do you think the prime minister has been able to fulfill the duties of his office since being selected?




To what degree do you think the current ministerial team has been able to fulfill its duties since being selected?



To what degree do you care about political reform in Jordan?




Do you think a government chosen by parliament could improve political reforms in Jordan?






To what degree do you feel you have a say in governmental decision-making on issues that directly affect you?

To what degree do you feel citizens should engage in the development of their community?













If there are two candidates running for office and they have the same qualifications, aside from the fact that one is a man and one is a woman, which candidate are you more likely to support?










Do you consider the self-declared Islamic State (ISIS/DAESH) to be a terrorist organization?




To what degree do you feel ISIS/DAESH is a real threat to security in Jordan?

Do you think ISIS/DAESH is mainly supported by youth, religious people, or poor people?






Are you aware that municipalities have been divided into a number of local councils that will be elected in accordance with the new Municipalities Law?




Are you aware that municipal councils will now be composed of the highest vote recipients of the local council elections (except in Amman, where 25% of the municipal council will be appointed)?




Are you aware that the Decentralization Law establishes new elected governorate councils?




In your opinion, what is the main purpose of decentralization?



Are you aware that the IEC will hold elections for mayors, local councils and governorate councils on separate ballots on August 15, 2017?




Do you intend to vote in the upcoming local and decentralization elections on August 15, 2017?




Why do you not intend to vote in the upcoming local and decentralization elections on August 15, 2017?


To what degree do you believe the Independent Election Commission (IEC) will be able to ensure fair and transparent municipal and decentralization elections?




Influx of Syrian Refugees







