
#### Detailed Methodology

- The survey was conducted by <u>Dr. Rasa Alisauskiene</u> of the public and market research company Baltic Surveys/The Gallup Organization on behalf of the <u>International Republican Institute</u>. The field work was carried out by <u>SIAR Research and Consulting</u>.
- Data was collected throughout Kyrgyzstan on November 22 December 4, 2018 through face-to-face interviews at respondents' homes.
- The sample consisted of 1,500 permanent residents of Kyrgyzstan aged 18 and older and eligible to vote.
- A multistage probability sampling method was used, employing the random route and Kish Method for respondents' selection procedures.
  - Stage one: All districts of Kyrgyzstan were grouped into seven regions plus Bishkek. Each region of Kyrgyzstan was surveyed.
  - Stage two: Settlements were selected at random. The number of selected settlements in each region was proportional to the share of population living in a particular type of the settlement in that region.
  - Stage three: Primary sampling units were described.
- Demographic differences between the achieved sample and published census data are linked to migration patterns, with the population of Kyrgyzstani citizens working and residing abroad being disproportionately young and male. In an effort to stabilize sample distributions over time, IRI introduced a weighting scheme to this data which it will continue to use in the future. Due to this improvement in the methodology, shifts between this survey and the November 2017 survey (and prior) may appear larger than the actual change. For example, trends on internet usage reflect our adjustment to census-reported age and gender demographics. On most other questions, the introduction of a weight did not substantially impact trended data. Due to this addition of a weight, the comparability of this poll against prior polls is limited.
- The margin of error does not exceed plus or minus 2.5 percent.
- The response rate was 69 percent.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.
- Interviews were conducted in the Kyrgyz, Russian and Uzbek languages.
- The survey was funded by the <u>U.S. Agency for International Development</u>.




# Generally speaking, do you think that things in Kyrgyzstan are going in the right direction or wrong direction?




# Over the last 12 months, how has the economic situation in Kyrgyzstan changed?



# Over the last 12 months, how has the financial situation of your household changed?




# In your opinion, how will the economic situation of Kyrgyzstan change in the next 12 months?




#### What are the most important problems that Kyrgyzstan is facing at the moment?






## How satisfied are you with the way democracy is developing in Kyrgyzstan?



#### Are you or people you know ever afraid to openly express your political views?




### In your opinion, are there groups who do not feel safe to openly express their political views?




# How informed are you about the work of the parliament, the laws it passes, or other decisions it makes?




# Are you familiar with the work of your local *kenesh* (municipal or village-level council)?




### Are you familiar with the work of your local *kenesh*? (Disaggregated by region)




# If so, how would you assess their work? (Respondents familiar with the work of their local *kenesh*, n=576)




## How frequently do you interact with elected members of your local *kenesh*?








#### Do you believe that citizens should play a larger or smaller role in the governmental decision-making process?




# What forms of local democracy/citizens' participation in municipal/local governance do you consider to be the most effective?




### Do you think that the situation with corruption has been getting better or worse?








## How often do you participate in political party activities? (Members of political parties)




### Why are you not a member of a political party? (Spontaneous answers, respondents who are not members of political parties, n=1,354)




## Which political party is the most active in your region? (Spontaneous answer)




# Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? "It is healthy for Kyrgyzstan's democracy to have multiple parties in power."






#### Do election results have an impact on your financial situation?
































If yes, why do you believe there should be more women in Kyrgyz politics? (Multiple answers, respondents who think there should be more women in politics, n=346)



# If no, why do we need fewer women in politics? (Multiple answers, respondents who do not think there should be more women in politics, n=354)




#### Why are there not more women politically engaged in Kyrgyzstan?




## Do you believe Kyrgyzstan should have a gender quota to ensure that women and men are more equally represented?




# Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? "Politicians do not listen to the needs and ideas of young people."




#### In your opinion, should there be more youth in Kyrgyz politics?








# If yes, why do you believe there should be more youth in Kyrgyz politics?




# If no, why should there not be more youth in Kyrgyz politics? (Multiple answers, respondents who do not think there should be more youth in politics, n=65)



# Do you believe the rights of persons with disabilities are fully respected in Kyrgyzstan today?








# Which of these media outlets do you use for gaining political information? (Multiple answers)










#### How often do you use the internet?



# Where do you most often access the internet? (Internet users, n=994)




# Which social media sites do you use most often? (Internet users, n=994)


